

ABCs of Halloween POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Square dinner plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Fan brush
Small and medium round brushes



Glaze Paint Colors

Pale Blue, Deep Orange, Bright Orange, Bright Green, Light Green, White, Black

Writer bottles: Black, White

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the outline of the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Apply 1 messy coat of Pale Blue to the background of the plate with a fan brush. (It's okay if this overlaps the design, which should still be visible through the light coat of color.)
- 3. Paint 2–3 coats of Deep Orange on the letters F and M, the bottom section of the J, the witch hat, and the top of the candy corn Y.
- 4. Paint alternating sections of the pumpkin with 3 coats of Deep Orange and Bright Orange.
- 5. Paint 2–3 coats of Bright Orange on the middle section of the J, the middle of the candy corn Y, and the center of the R.
- 6. Paint 2–3 coats of Bright Green in the center of the letter A. Use 1 coat of this color to add zigzags for the pumpkin leaf, dashes in the O, and the spider web in the D.
- 7. Paint the eyeballs on the M and the spider on the S in Light Green.
- 8. Paint the ghost, the top of the J, and the bottom of the candy corn with 3 coats of White.
- 9. Dip the back end of a brush in White and add dots in the center of the eyeballs on the M and on the witch's hat.
- 10. Paint the cat head and the bat with 2 coats of Black.
- 11. Use a Black writer bottle to fill in all the letters, the dots on the eyeballs on the M, the eyes on the spider, and the hanging thread on the S.
- 12. Use a White writer bottle to add details to the cat face and the bat.
- 13. Dip the end of brush in Bright Orange and add dots for the ghost eyes. Let dry.
- 14. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Shallow 8" bowl Pattern Tissue paper Pencil Sharpie marker Small and medium round brushes Fan brush

Glaze Paint Colors

Orange, Golden Yellow, Bright Orange, Black, Gray



DIRECTIONS


- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Paint the pumpkin with 3 coats of Orange.
- 3. Paint the innermost band of the rainbow with 3 coats of Golden Yellow, the next one with 3 coats of Bright Orange, then Black, and then Gray.
- 4. Paint the stars with 3 coats of Black.
- 5. Dip the back end of a paintbrush into each of the colors in turn and add dots on background in varying sizes.
- 6. With a small brush, paint the face and the outline of the pumpkin with Black.
- 7. With a small brush, outline the stars with Golden Yellow. Let dry.
- 8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.



SUPPLIES

Bisque: Squircle or square charger Pattern Tissue paper Pencil Sharpie marker Small and medium round brushes Chippy craft brush

Glaze Paint Colors

White, Orange, Yellow, Taupe, Brown






- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Paint the letter L, the tip of the candy corn, and two stripes of the letter E with 3 coats of White.
- 3. Paint the pumpkin, the middle stripe of the letter E, and one dot on the letter L with 3 coats of Orange.
- 4. Paint the bottom stripe of the letter E, the middle of the candy corn, and two dots on the letter L with 3 coats of Yellow.
- 5. Paint the top stripe of the letter E and 2 dots on the letter L with 3 coats of Taupe.
- 6. Using a chippy craft brush, streak White horizontally through the colored portions of the letter E.
- 7. Use a liner brush to add white vertical lines down the pumpkin segments.
- 8. Use the liner brush to outline each letter, the circles in the letter L, the candy corn sections, and the pumpkin with 1–2 coats of Brown. Let dry.
- 9. Add dashed horizontal lines in the E and around the dots in the letter L.
- 10. Paint the stem of pumpkin with 3 coats of Brown. Let dry.
- 11. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Spidey House PlatePOTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Coupe dinner plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Contact paper
Scissors
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Sponge

Glaze Paint Colors

Teal, Dark Gray, Light Gray, Berry Purple, Bright Light Green, Bright Blue, Orange, Black, White

Writer bottle: Black




DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Don't trace the spiderweb onto the plate yet.
- 2. Use the tissue paper to trace the bat, the center opening shape, and the small window onto contact paper. Cut these shapes out and adhere to the plate over the traced design.
- 3. Paint the birdhouse shape with 3 coats of Teal.
- 4. Paint the vertical pickets on the fence Dark Gray. Paint the horizontal pickets Light Gray. Add a few Light Gray vertical lines to highlight the edges of the vertical pickets.
- 5. Remove the center sticker on the birdhouse. Paint the area with 3 coats of Berry Purple. Avoid painting the spider body.
- 6. Paint the spider body with 3 coats of Bright Light Green.
- 7. Remove the sticker on the window. Paint every other section of the inside of the window with 2–3 coats of Bright Blue.
- 8. Paint the window border with 2–3 coats of Orange.
- 9. Remove the bat sticker. Paint the bat with 2 coats of Black.
- 10. Paint the grass and the scallop design at the bottom of the house with 2–3 coats of Bright Green.
- 11. Use tissue paper to trace the spider web and the details on the bat.
- 12. With a Black writer bottle, outline all the details on the design, including the spider, spider web, and central opening on the birdhouse.
- 13. Using a small brush, add details to the bat in White.
- 14. Sponge 1 coat of Light Gray around the house. Before completely dry, use the same sponge and add Dark Gray to the background area. Avoid the arched "ground" area.
- 15. Use a clean sponge to dab Bright Light Green on a few areas of the background. Let dry.
- 16. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Witch's Wash Day Mug

POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Large mug Pattern Tissue paper Pencil Sharpie marker Fan brush Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Paint Colors

Bright Orange, Neon Green, Dark Gray Writer bottle: Black




- 1. With a pencil, lightly sketch a curved shape at the top of the mug for the moon.
- 2. Using the fan brush, apply 3 coats of Bright Orange to the background, avoiding the moon area at the top.
- 3. Paint 3 coats of Neon Green on the inside of the mug and the moon shape at the top of the mug.
- 4. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 5. Paint all the shapes in the design with 3 coats of Dark Gray. Let dry.
- 6. Use a Black writer bottle to outline to the shapes and add the string between the two posts. Let dry.
- 7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SCARECROW HAT

CLAY

SUPPLIES

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Wooden skewer
Paper party hat or cone shape for clay form
Pattern
Cheesecloth
Rolling pin or small dowel rod
Toothbrush
Newsprint (optional)
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Twine
Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide



Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Dark Brown, Cinnamon, Golden Yellow


DIRECTIONS

- 1. Roll out two 8"x10" clay slabs, each about ¼-½" thick.
- 2. Place the pattern pieces on the clay. Trace around the shapes with the skewer and cut out. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Lay the cheesecloth over each cutout. With a rolling pin or dowel rod, press the cheesecloth into the clay to create a burlap texture.
- 4. Wrap the half-circle clay piece around the cone form to shape the hat. Score the edges with a wet toothbrush and attach to each other to make the hat shape. Gently remove the cone base once formed. If needed to maintain shape, stuff the inside with some newsprint.
- 5. For the hat brim, notch out triangles and small rectangles along the edge. Smooth the edges.
- 6. Score the base of the cone shape with the wet toothbrush and attach the notched piece around the bottom edge of the clay cone shape to form the hat brim.
- 7. Bend random edges of the hat brim to create dimension. Let dry.
- 8. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 9. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 10. Cut 10–12" length of twine and tie around the base of the hat for decoration.



WITCHY PLANT STAKES

CLAY

SUPPLIES

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Wooden skewer
Pattern
Toothbrush
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Two 12" dowel rods, ¼" or ½" diameter
Strong white glue
Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Black, Gold, Orange, Bright Light Green




- 1. Roll out two 8"x10" clay slabs, each about $\frac{4}{2}$ " thick.
- 2. Place the pattern pieces on the clay. Trace around the shapes with the skewer to cut out. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Attach the buckles on the boots by scoring with a wet toothbrush.
- 4. Form 2 clay cylinders, each about ½" diameter and 1" long. Tap each end of the shape on a hard surface to create a flat edge. Tap one long side on a hard surface to create a flat edge. Insert the dowel rod into the bottom of each one, about two-thirds of the way in. Do not let it extend out the top end. With a wet toothbrush, score the flat long edge and attach to the back of the boots about where the sock and boot meet on the cutout. Once the pieces are attached, carefully remove the dowel rods. Let dry.
- 5. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 6. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 7. Glue the dowel rods into the holders on the back of the boots.

BOO KITTY CANVAS

SUPPLIES

11"x14" canvas
Pattern
Graphite transfer paper
Large flat canvas brush
Small and medium round brushes

Acrylic Paint Colors

Gray, Bubblegum Pink, White, Black

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Transfer the pattern onto the canvas using graphite paper.
- 2. Paint the "kitty" Gray.
- 3. Paint the tail, paws, ears, nose, and bag Bubblegum Pink.
- 4. Mix 1 part Bubblegum Pink to 2 parts White. Mix well. Paint the background.
- 5. Paint the kitty facial features, balloons, bottom of skirt, the lettering, handle, and outline on the bag, and the details on the ears, tail, and paws Black.
- 6. Sign and date your masterpiece.

CANDY CORN OWL

CANVAS

SUPPLIES

11"x14" canvas
Pattern
Graphite transfer paper
Large flat canvas brush
Small and medium round brushes

Acrylic Paint Colors

Orange, Golden Yellow, Cream, Taupe, Gray-Brown, Black, Gray


DIRECTIONS

- 1. Transfer the pattern onto the canvas using graphite paper.
- 2. Paint the bottom of the owl Orange.
- 3. Paint the midsection of owl Golden Yellow.
- 4. Blend 2 parts Cream and 1 part Golden Yellow and mix well. Paint the top section of the owl and the inner circle of the eyes with this blend.
- 5. Paint the wings, talons, and beak Taupe.
- 6. Paint the branch Gray-Brown.
- 7. Paint the outer circle of the eyes Black.
- 8. With a small brush, outline the talons, outline the branch, make the branch lines, and add small lines dividing the sections of the wings.
- 9. Using the back end of a paintbrush, add a tiny Black dot in each eye for the pupils.
- 10. With a small brush, paint thin sketchy lines dividing the sections of the owl in the Cream blend color from step 4.
- 11. Sign and date your masterpiece.

CANDI 8 CORN BOARD ART

SUPPLIES

12"x12" MDF blank board or cut wood Pattern Carbon transfer paper Pen or pencil Sharpie Large flat canvas brush ½" Chippy craft brush

Acrylic Paint Colors

Cream, Orange, Yellow Gold, Black, Taupe



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Position the pattern on the board with the carbon transfer paper under it and trace the design onto the board. Remove the pattern and transfer paper.
- 2. Use the Sharpie marker to trace the solid lines of the pattern onto the canvas, avoiding the dashed lines.
- 3. Paint one light coat of Cream over the entire board using large flat canvas brush.
- 4. Paint each candy corn with solid coats of Cream, Orange, and Yellow Gold, avoiding the facial features.
- 5. Once all the areas are dry, use a chippy brush to paint over the candy corns, using crosshatch pattern to give a weathered look.
- 6. Paint the facial features and hats with solid coats of Black. Let dry.
- 7. Using slightly watered-down Taupe, paint the background area with large flat canvas brush. To enhance the weathered pattern, some areas should be darker. Paint a light coat over the painted subjects. Add a little extra Taupe color towards the tip of the hat, along the brim of the hat, and the body of the candy corns.
- 8. Paint the moon with a solid coverage of Cream. The moon should be the only really bright aspect of the painting.
- 9. Mix a little Cream and Black to create a charcoal color, dip just the tips of the chippy craft brush into this, and add a little line along where the color sections meet on the candy corns.
- 10. Let dry. Sign and date your masterpiece.

SUPPLIES

12"x12" canvas
Pattern
Graphite transfer paper
Pen or pencil
Large flat canvas brush
Small and medium round brush

Acrylic Paint Colors

Aqua, Gray, Orange, Black, White



DIRECTIONS


- 1. Place the pattern over the graphite transfer paper and trace the design onto the canvas. (Don't trace the feather loops on the owl yet.)
- 2. Paint the background with 1–2 coats of Aqua (1 coat will show the texture of the canvas, or use 2 coats for more solid coverage).
- 3. Paint the branch with 2 coats of Gray.
- 4. Paint the flower with 2 coats of Orange.
- 5. Paint the owl with 2 solid coats of Black. Let dry.
- 6. Sketch the feather loops freehand with a pencil, or trace them using the pattern and transfer paper.
- 7. Using small liner brush, paint the feather loops Gray.
- 8. Paint the eyes White and, when dry, add a Black dot for the pupil.
- 9. Using small liner brush, outline the flower and the branch with Black.
- 10. Let dry. Sign and date your masterpiece.



12"x12" canvas
Pattern
Graphite transfer paper
Large flat canvas brush
Small and medium round brush

Acrylic Paint Colors

Orange, Red, Green, Purple, Black, White



DIRECTIONS


- 1. Position the pattern on the canvas with the graphite transfer paper beneath it and trace the design onto the canvas.
- 2. Paint the background with 1 coat of Orange. Dip the brush in Red and blend onto the Orange randomly on the canvas to give dimension.
- 3. Paint the face, arms, and eye with 2 coats of Green.
- 4. Paint alternating stripes on the dress with 2 coats of Purple, avoiding the heart shape.
- 5. Paint the outer parts of the bow with 2 coats of Purple.
- 6. Paint the other dress strip 2 coats of Black, avoiding the heart shape.
- 7. Paint the outer part of the eye White.
- 8. Paint the heart and center of the bow with 2 coats of Red.
- 9. Using small brush with Black, outline all of the details. Or, when the project is dry, do the outline with a Sharpie marker.
- 10. Let dry. Sign and date your masterpiece.

SUPPLIES

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Wooden skewer
Pattern
Drinking straw
Toothbrush
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide
Twine or wire for hanging



Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Orange, White, Purple, Green, Black


DIRECTIONS

- 1. Roll out a 12"x12" clay slab, ¼-½" thick.
- 2. Place the pattern pieces on the clay. Trace around the shapes with the skewer and cut out the outside edge lines only.
- 3. Use a straw to make holes for hanging, following the pattern. The pumpkin and the bat will each have 4 holes and the ghost will have 2 holes.
- 4. Remove the excess clay. Smooth the edges of the shapes. Let dry.
- 5. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 6. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 7. After painting and firing is complete, add wire or twine to attach the shapes to each other and to create a hanger.

CROSSBONES INN PLATE

POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Coupe dinner plate

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Contact paper

Scissors

Cheesecloth (larger than the plate)

Sponge

Small and medium round brushes

Liner brush

Fan brush



White, Gray, Black Writer bottle in Black



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace just the central design (skull and crossbones and the plaque that surrounds them) with a marker. The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design. (Don't trace the lettering and outer crossbones onto the plate yet.)
- 2. Trace the skull, center crossbones, and center plaque onto contact paper and cut out the shapes. First, adhere the skull and the crossbones cutouts on the traced pattern. Next, adhere the plaque shape cutout on top of the skull and crossbones.
- 3. Paint 1–2 coats of White over the plate.
- 4. Place the cheesecloth over the plate but do not lay it completely flat—add some wrinkles and overlaps to give the design texture. Dampen a sponge, dip into White, and lightly sponge the cheesecloth surface until the entire plate is covered. Let it dry slightly.
- 5. Mix 2 parts Gray with 1 part Black to create a Charcoal color. Dampen a fan brush and paint the mixture over the cheesecloth. Let dry slightly.
- 6. Once the paint looks mostly dry, remove the cheesecloth. Let dry until it is no longer shiny.
- 7. Reposition the tissue tracing and trace the large bones patterns and the words onto the plate with Sharpie. Paint them with 2 coats of Black.
- 8. Peel up the large center plaque shape and paint the area with 2 coats of Black.
- 9. Remove the skull and crossbones stickers. Using a Black writer bottle, fill in the eyes, nose, and teeth. Let dry.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Large mug

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Fan brush

Small and medium round brushes





Glaze Colors

Tan, Pumpkin, Bright Orange, Black Writer bottle in Black

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace just the outline of the hat (not the cheetah print) with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Dampen a paint brush, dip into Tan, and tap and "blob" the color over the entire mug. Add water and more paint as you go. Cover the entire mug, including the traced design.
- 3. Reposition the tissue tracing and trace the small cheetah print spots on the hat, and trace the lettering on the other side of the mug. Lightly sketch irregular ovals for the large cheetah spots around the lettering. Dab all the cheetah spots with Pumpkin.
- 4. Paint the hat band, the inside of the hat where it shows at the bottom, and the inside of the mug with 2–3 coats of Bright Orange.
- 5. With a small brush and Black, paint a wavy C shape around the painted cheetah spots with Black. Also use Black for the lettering, the hat buckle, the outline of the hat band, and the outline of the hat.
- 6. Paint the mug handle with 2–3 coats of Black.
- 7. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Berry Purple, Light Purple, Mint Green, Orange, Red, Black, Medium Purple, Green, Gray Writer bottle in Maroon, Black



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the lettering and the solid lines of the designs with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the solid lines of the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Place the tissue tracing on the contact paper and trace the dotted line pattern with the marker. Cut out and place the stickers over the traced images. (Note: This cut pattern is slightly larger than the traced pattern on the bisque to allow for a space surrounding the traced image.)
- 3. With a fan brush, paint the background with 2–3 coats of Berry Purple. Rinse brush. Dip the fan brush in Light Purple and paint from the bottom of the mug to the middle with 1–2 coats, using messy brushstrokes.
- 4. Peel off the stickers.
- 5. Mr. Frankenstein: Paint the shirt Red and Orange, and the hair Black, with 2 coats of each color. Use a stippling technique to paint the face with 2 coats of Mint Green.
- 6. Mrs. Frankenstein: Paint the shirt Green and the hair Black and Gray, with 2 coats of each color. Use a stippling technique to paint the face with 2 coats of Medium Purple.
- 7. Outline the characters and fill in the lettering with a Black writer bottle.
- 8. Paint the inside of the mug with 3 coats of Orange. Sponge the rim of the mug and the handle with 2–3 coats of Black.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

HEY BOO! MUG



HOLD MY MUG, MR. BONES

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Large mug

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Scissors

Small and medium round brushes

Sponge

Glaze Colors

White, Yellow Green, Lime Green Writer bottle in Black, Lime Green

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. This creates the left hand of the design. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Flip the tissue tracing (so the reverse side is face up) and align the design on the opposite side of the mug for the right hand and retrace the design with the marker.
- 2. Fold the paper pattern in half, cut out the bones for each side of the mug. Keep the pieces together and label them for easy placement.
- 3. Starting at the top of the mug, paint the top finger paper piece with White and place painted side down on the mug in the matching traced section. Repeat until each piece is placed on the traced design. Be sure to smooth each piece to remove any air bubbles. If pieces start to lift as they dry, lightly tap a little water over the paper piece.
- 4. Paint 3 coats of Yellow Green over the entire mug except for the handle.
- 5. Paint 3 coats of Lime Green on the handle.
- 6. Use a small brush or a writer bottle with Black, paint a small oval dot and add a small triangle on each side for the wings. Alternate some triangles with points facing up and facing down.
- 7. Peel off the paper bones. Outline the bones with Lime Green using a writer bottle or a small brush.

- 4. Carefully lift up the cutout clay circle with the paper plate.
- 5. Press the other plate on the clay to make a "sandwich."
- 6. Lift off the top paper plate. Leave the clay on top of the second plate for support and a steady work surface.
- 7. With wet fingertips, smooth the edges of the clay.
- 8. With the wooden skewer, cut out a 4"–4½" circle from the center of the clay plate. Form a ball from the clay cutout.
- 9. Take pinches of clay from the clay ball and form about 40–50 clay balls ranging in size from medium-sized peas to large grapes.
- 10. Score the top surface of the clay circle that is on the paper plate. Arrange and adhere clay balls of varying sizes all around the circle.
- 11. With the pointy end of the wooden skewer, make 1 or 2 small holes at the top of the clay circle to use for hanging the finished project.
- 12. Allow clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 13. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. <u>Or</u> fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 14. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 15. Glue the mirror to the back of the clay. Insert twine or wire into the holes for hanging.

Optional: Use red to draw veins on eyes giving bloodshot appearance.

- 5. With the wooden skewer, trace around the pattern of the witch feet and cut them out. Smooth out the edges with wet fingertips.
- 6. Cut a slit in the circle of clay inside the cauldron. Place the witch's feet, boots up, into the slit.
- 7. With the remaining clay, sculpt a witches hat and roll about 15–25 small clay balls of varying sizes.
- 8. Score the bottom of the hat and affix it to the rim of the cauldron. Place the clay balls inside the cauldron all around the witch feet.



- 9. Allow all the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).

- 3. Dip the same sponge into Golden Yellow and repeat the process, slightly overlapping the Bright Yellow, covering the remaining portion of the plate with 2–3 coats of Golden Yellow.
- 4. While the Golden Yellow is still wet, dip the same sponge into Orange and sponge 1 light coat over the Golden Yellow.
- 5. Use the tissue paper method to transfer the pattern to the plate.
- 6. Fill in the design with 2–3 coats of Black. Use a liner brush for the straw, the grass, and the birds.
- 7. Use a White writer bottle to paint the crescent moon. Allow to dry.
- 8. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.



- 4. Using the skewer, cut the other slab into about 10 strips, each about ½" wide.
- 5. For the eyes, use the scraps from the slab, roll clay into 2 balls, and flatten slightly. Attach the eyes to the face using clay glue.
- 6. Lay strips of clay unevenly across the mummy face. Some strips should overlap others. Press down the strips and clay-glue the edges. Smooth down the strip edges with fingers.

- 8. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.

 PAINTING GUIDELINES: Using wash technique, paint the mummy Gray, applying more heavily in spaces between the strips. Paint the top of the strips with 2 coats of White. Paint the eyes Lime Green and add a black swirl in the center.

Blow into the straw and let bubbles overflow onto the top portion of the plate, working in small sections. (Don't blow too many bubbles at one time or they will pool in the center of the plate. Also, avoid tipping the cup or the water mixture will spill onto the plate.) Let some of the bubbles run over onto the middle section of the black cauldron area.
- 5. Add Medium Green paint to the same soap mix and stir well. Once the first layer of bubbles is popped and somewhat dry, repeat bubble blowing on top of the Lime Green area. Let some of the bubbles run over onto the black cauldron area.
- 6. Once bubbles are semi-dry, pull off the stickers.
- 7. Paint the eyeballs and the bone with 1–2 coats of White. Add Purple, Blue, and Orange for the irises. Outline the bone with Light Gray.
- 8. Paint the toe with 2 coats of Tan (or other flesh tone) and the toenail with 3 coats of Yellow.
- 9. Trace the lettering onto the cauldron using the tissue paper technique (the black Sharpie will be visible on top of the Black painted area.) Fill in the letters with a White writer bottle.
- 10. Add Black dots for the pupils.





- 4. Pain the Pumpkin with 2 watery coats of Teal and Gray for the stem. Add a little of White in the grooves of the pumpkin sections.
- 5. Paint the bat wings with 2 watery coats of Gray. Paint the bat head with 2 watery coats of Purple. Paint the eyes and teeth White.
- 6. With a Black writer bottle, outline the word BOO in Black, leaving the thicker part of letters blank. Once dry, use writer bottle in Purple to fill in the letters.
- 7. Outline the word YA or Y'ALL in Orange. Add shadowing of the letters with a line of Black.
- 8. Add the inside details of the candy wrappers with corresponding colors.
- 9. Add smile on bat and dots for the eyes with a Black writer bottle.
- 10. With a Black writer bottle, outline all of the shapes with sketchy, broken lines.
- 11. Lightly splatter the background with watered-down Black. Let dry.
- 12. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 2. Paint the eyes and ice cream "drips" with 2 coats of White.
- 3. Paint the pupil irises in the eyes with 3 coats each of Purple, Orange, and Green.
- 4. Using a liner brush, outline each eyeball with Light Gray.
- 5. Paint the cone with 3 coats of Black.
- 6. Using a liner brush, water down each eye color and detail the drips of the corresponding eye. Add small thinner lines for squiggle details in the drip.
- 7. Using a liner brush, add Light Gray lines for the spider web on the cone. Start with the vertical lines, then add the horizontal webbing lines.
- 8. Paint the background 1–2 coats of Lime Green.
- 9. Paint the pupils Black. Outline the eyeballs, the drips, and the irises with Black. Add a White "c" in the center of the Black pupil. Let dry.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Trace the outlines of the hat, arms, and crow onto contact paper. Cut out and adhere firmly to the plate, aligning with the traced pattern.
- 3. Sponge paint the background Pale Blue, using lighter application in the areas closest to the gnome and heavier application closer to the edges. Remove the stickers.
- 4. Cut out the 3 separate beard sections. Paint the largest section Light Yellow and press color side down on the plate, aligning with the traced pattern and smoothing down the edges. Remove the paper. Paint the middle section cutout Golden Yellow and position over the large painted section; pat down and smooth to the edges. Remove the paper. Paint the smallest section Cream and position over the middle section; pat down and smooth to the edges. Remove the paper. Cut out 5–6 small strips and paint each with one of the beard colors. Press down randomly to give added dimension.
- 5. For the arms: Paint the largest stripe with 1 coat of Taupe. Paint the next stripe with 1 coat of Denim Blue. Paint the next stripe on top of the large Denim Blue stripe with 1 coat of Maroon. Paint 1-coat vertical stripes of Maroon and Denim Blue on the sleeve overlapping the Taupe and Denim Blue horizontal stripes.
- 6. Paint the Hat with 2–3 coats of Taupe. Paint one patch with 2 coats of Denim Blue and the other with Maroon.
- 7. Paint the crow with 2–3 coats of Black. Paint the beak with 2 coats of Golden Yellow. Paint the eyes with 2 coats of White. Add a Black dot for the pupil of the eye and a Black squiggle at the top of the head for feathers.
- 8. Outline the design with Black writer bottle. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 1. Using a pencil, trace the whole pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing on the contact paper and retrace the just the outline with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design.
- 2. Cut out the bat sticker and adhere firmly to the plate, with the feet at the very top. Also cut out two separate circles and two separate small triangles for use in step 6.
- Sponge 1 coat of White over the entire plate. Add Gray to the same sponge, and apply it just around the left and lower edge in a crescent moon shape, narrowing the area as it rounds towards the right side of the plate. Remove the sticker
- 4. Align the tissue paper tracing with the unpainted bat area on the plate. Trace the details with the Sharpie.
- 5. For the wings, start with the lightest colors near the body, ending with the deepest colors to the outer sections of the wings. Paint each section with 3 coats of Yellow, Orange, Coral, Red, Bright Green, Light Teal, Dark Teal, Medium Purple, and Deep Purple.
- 6. Adhere the stickers for the eyes and fangs. Paint the body with 2–3 coats of Black.
- 7. Remove the stickers. Add Green dots in the center of the eyes for pupils.
- 8. Using a Gray writer bottle, add a smile and outline head and body.
- 9. Outline the wing sections with a Black writer bottle using sketchy, broken lines. Let dry.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 2. The skeleton body is a watercolor technique that is meant to give blotchy coverage. Water down Taupe and drop color in puddles over the head, body, and arms, omitting the eyes, bowtie, and rib cage.
- 3. Repeat the same technique with Off White but placing color just here and there over the painted Taupe areas. Some of the Taupe should show through.
- 4. Dip a liner brush in water and then in Taupe. Highlight some small areas of the skeleton body.
- 5. Paint the bowtie with 2 coats of Peach.
- 6. Mix Black and a little Taupe to create a Charcoal haze color. Paint the rib cage, the mouth, and the nose.
- 7. Paint the outer ring of the eye Black. Paint the inner circle Off White. Let 1 coat of the Off White slightly overlap the Black. Use the back end of the paintbrush to add mismatched Black pupils.
- 8. With the back end of a brush, add dots of Orange on the bowtie.
- 9. Dip a liner brush in water and then in the mixture of Taupe and Black. Outline the body parts and bowtie.
- 10. Dip a round brush in water and Orange. Paint the background with messy brushstrokes.
- 11. Dip a brush in Black and drag the edge along the outside edge of the plate. Let dry.
- 12. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 4. For the ghost with socks, paint 1 coat of Purple and add small dots of Black. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Orange and the stem Green. Add 2 Cream ovals for the eyes. Add dots of White in the center of the ovals. Add dots of Black in center of the white eyes.
- 5. For the ghost with flippers, paint 2 coats of Deep Yellow. Paint the pool float with 2 coats of Green. Paint the goggles Purple. Paint inside of the goggles Cream. Add small circles of White inside the goggles. Add dots of Black in center of the white eyes.
- 6. For the ghost with high-top tennis shoes, paint the soles White, the shoe top Orange, and add details in Black. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Orange and the stem Green. Add 2 Cream ovals for the eyes. Add dots of White in the center of the ovals. Add dots of Black in center of the white eyes.
- 7. For the ghost with boots, paint 2 coats of Brown. Paint the bottom stripe of the candy corn with 2 coats of Deep Yellow, the middle stripe with 2 coats of Orange. Outline the entire candy corn in Black. Add 2 Cream circles for the eyes. Add dots of Green in the center of the circles. Add dots of Black in center of the green eyes.
- 8. For the ghost with flipflops, paint the flipflops Black. Paint the cup with 2 coats of Red and outline the cup and cup opening with Black. Paint the sunglasses Black. Add half moon shapes on top of each eye section of the glasses.
- 9. For the ghost with slippers, paint the slippers 2 coats of Green. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Orange and the stem Green. Paint Black oval outlines for the eyes with a dot in each center of the eye outline.
- 10. Outline each ghost with Gray. Let dry.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 7. With a White writer bottle, add dots to the eyes and squiggles on the wings.
- 8. Paint the inside of the mug with 2–3 coats of Orange, leaving sketchy brushstrokes toward the top edge. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



Add Purple and continue with same technique. Add Light Purple and blend as it ends into the Black. With the same brush, pick up some White and blend into the purples and blues.
- 4. Speckle the background with White.
- 5. Paint the alien's horns and teeth White. Paint the body Orange. Paint the eyelid Red. Paint the parts of the eye White, then Teal, then Black.
- 6. With small liner brush, outline the eye elements, the teeth, and the smile with Black. Allow to dry.

- 5. Outline the jar with Black using a small liner brush. Allow to dry.
