The enthusiastic staff then puts on a clear glaze and fires it. The painting fee is \$7 per person an hour plus the price of the piece and includes all supplies needed such as paint, brushes, glazing, and firing. There are specials almost everyday including the most popular "family fun-day on Sunday" that allows a family of four to paint for two hours for just \$15 plus the price of the pieces (ave. piece is \$8-\$12). Sundays at the quaint pottery studio overlooking the city are always packed and require reservations. It shows that the need to have a place for families to gather, spend quality time, and connect is being met at Paintin' Plates.

Born and raised in Any town, owner Maggie Matisse graduated from Belton High School and discovered the "contemporary ceramic studio" idea in Scottsdale, Arizona on an extended visit.
