FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE—The National Hobby Industry of America recently released the results of a study* that find hobbies and crafts have a significant effect on learning in elementary school students.

- Student behavior and socialization skills improve when hands-on craft projects are undertaken.
- 82% of teachers surveyed said that handcrafted projects help their students apply information in new or different situations

One of many hands-on craft activities, the kind of ceramics techniques used at the paint-your-own-pottery studios like The Hot Pot Spot are easily taught to students of any age. "It's great to read about a study that says what we've know for a long time," laughs Jolica. "Ceramics is fun and educational at the same time!"
