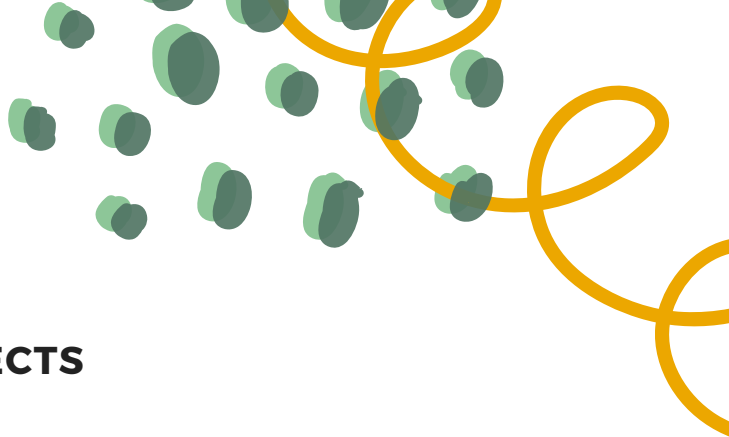
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Carrot Seed Co. Platter

POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Square platter

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Square brush or stiff fan brush

Chippy craft brush

Small and medium liner brushes

Paper

GLAZE COLORS

Cream, Taupe, Kelly Green, Orange, Black

Writer Bottles: Black, Orange, Kelly Green



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Water down Cream to a 3:1 ratio and paint a wash over the entire plate using a square brush or stiff fan brush. Keep the brushstrokes horizontal. If the color puddles along the edges, slightly smooth out the puddles.
3. To create a worn, thread-textured look, dip the craft brush tip into Taupe and paint a crisscross pattern on the plate in several random spots, as shown in the photo.
4. With a liner brush or writer bottle, create the outlines of the carrots and carrot tops with Black. Let dry.
5. Fill in the lettering with a Black writer bottle or liner brush. Let dry.
6. With a liner brush or writer bottle, paint the lines on the carrots Orange.
7. With a liner brush or writer bottle, paint the lines of the carrot tops Kelly Green. Let dry.
8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

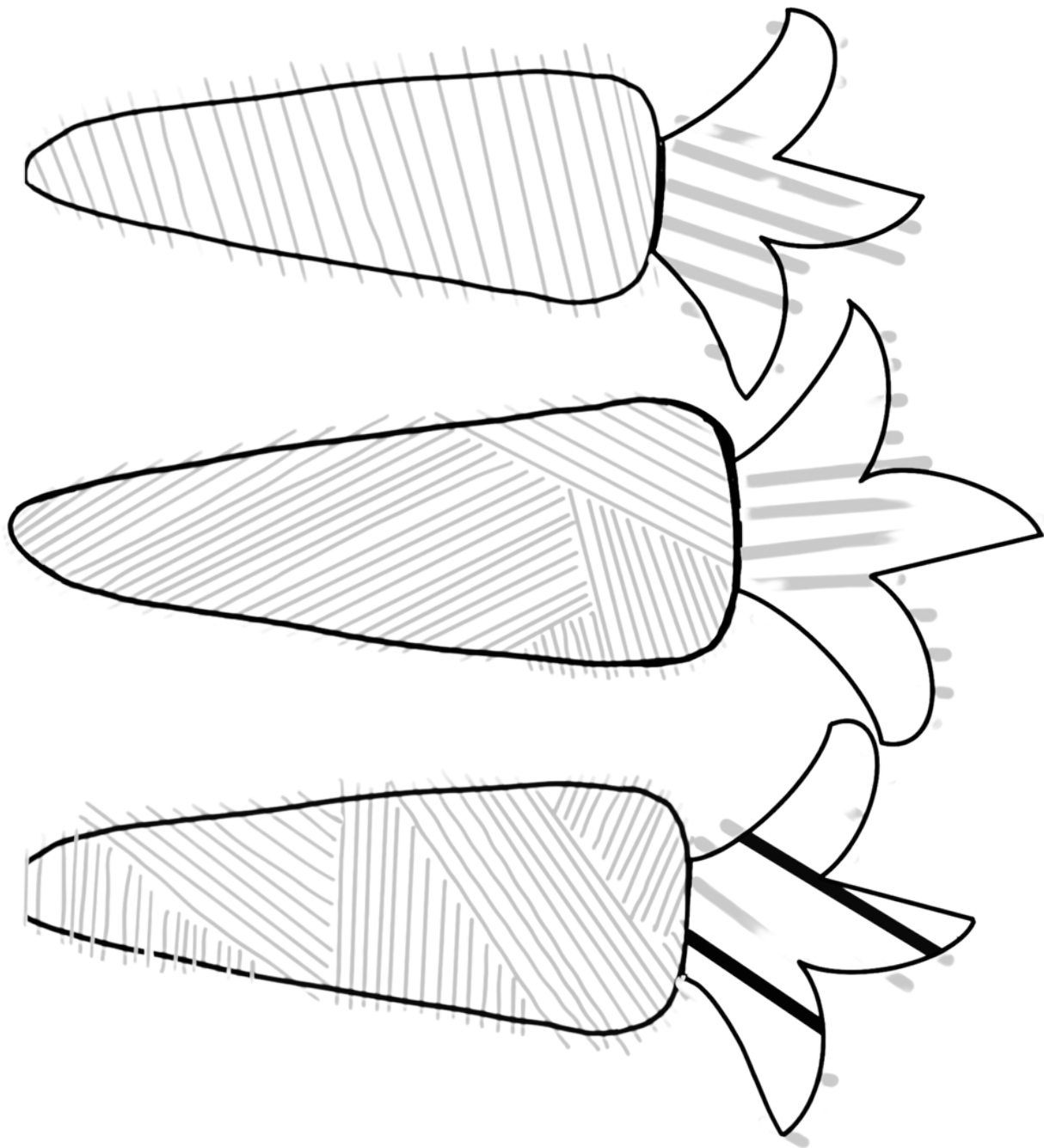

Bisque: Coupe salad plate

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Small and medium liner brushes

Paper

GLAZE COLORS

Coral, Teal, Light Teal Blue, Taupe, Cream

Writer Bottle: Black



DIRECTIONS

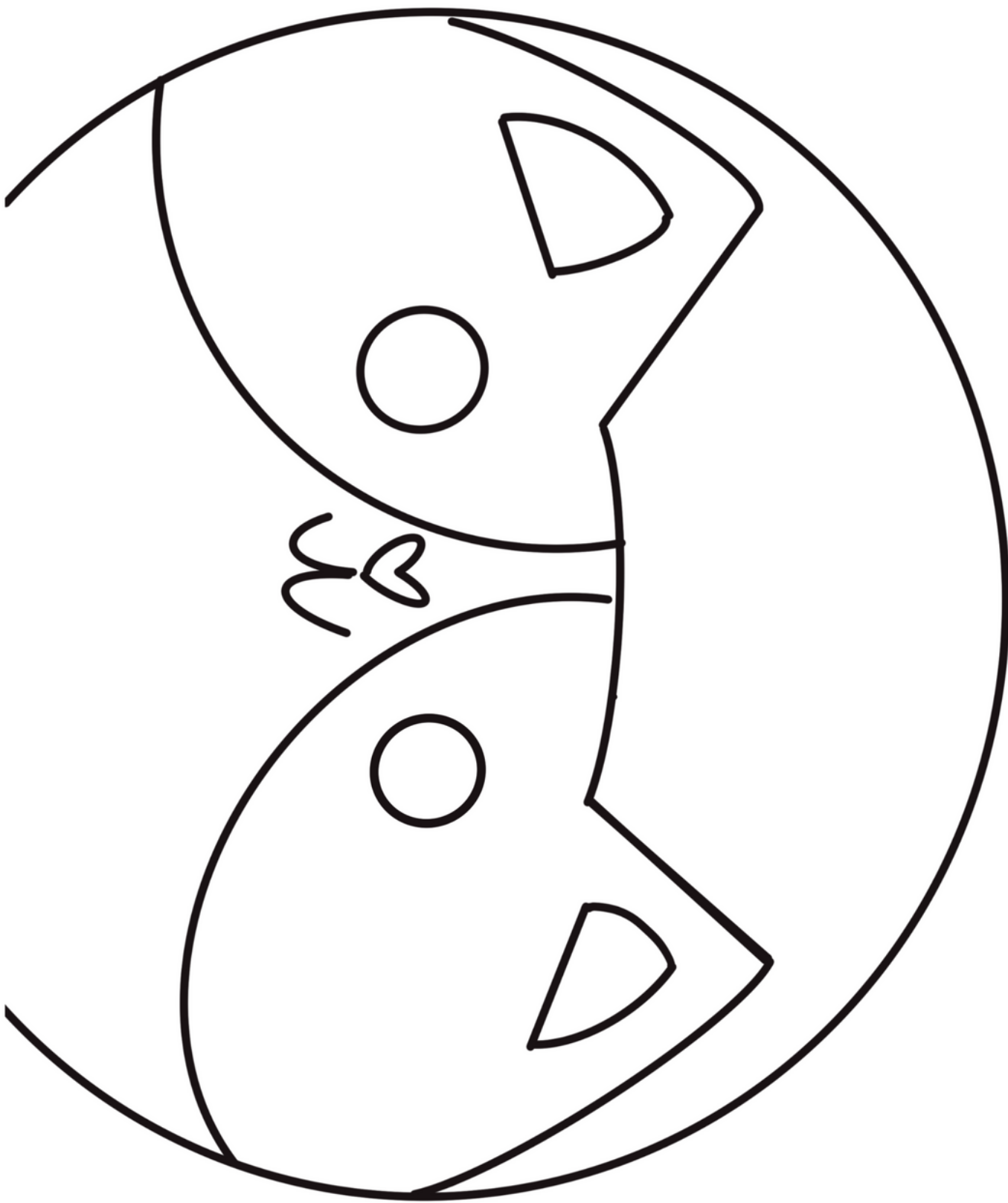
1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Paint one side of the face with 3 coats of Coral.
3. Paint the other side of the face with 3 coats of Teal.
4. Paint the space above the cat with 3 coats of Light Teal Blue.
5. Paint the center of the cat face with 3 coats of Taupe.
6. Paint the eyes with 2 coats of Cream.
7. If necessary, retrace the nose and mouth pattern using the tissue paper technique.
8. Paint the nose with 2 coats of Cream.
9. Using a writer bottle or liner brush, paint the mouth and outline the cat sections with Black.
10. Dip the end of a paintbrush in Cream and make dots inside the ears. Let dry.
11. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

GLAZE COLORS

Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Purple, Pink, Taupe, Green, White

Writer Bottle: Black

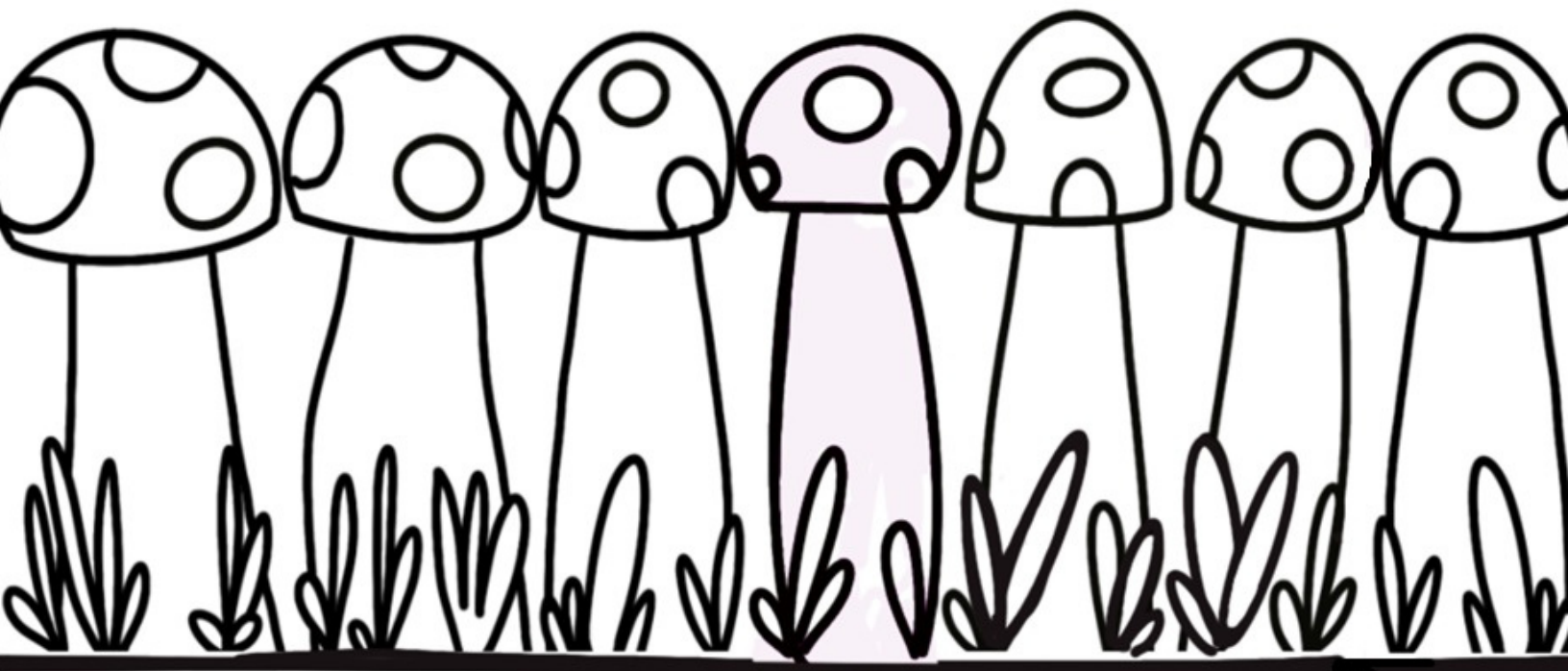
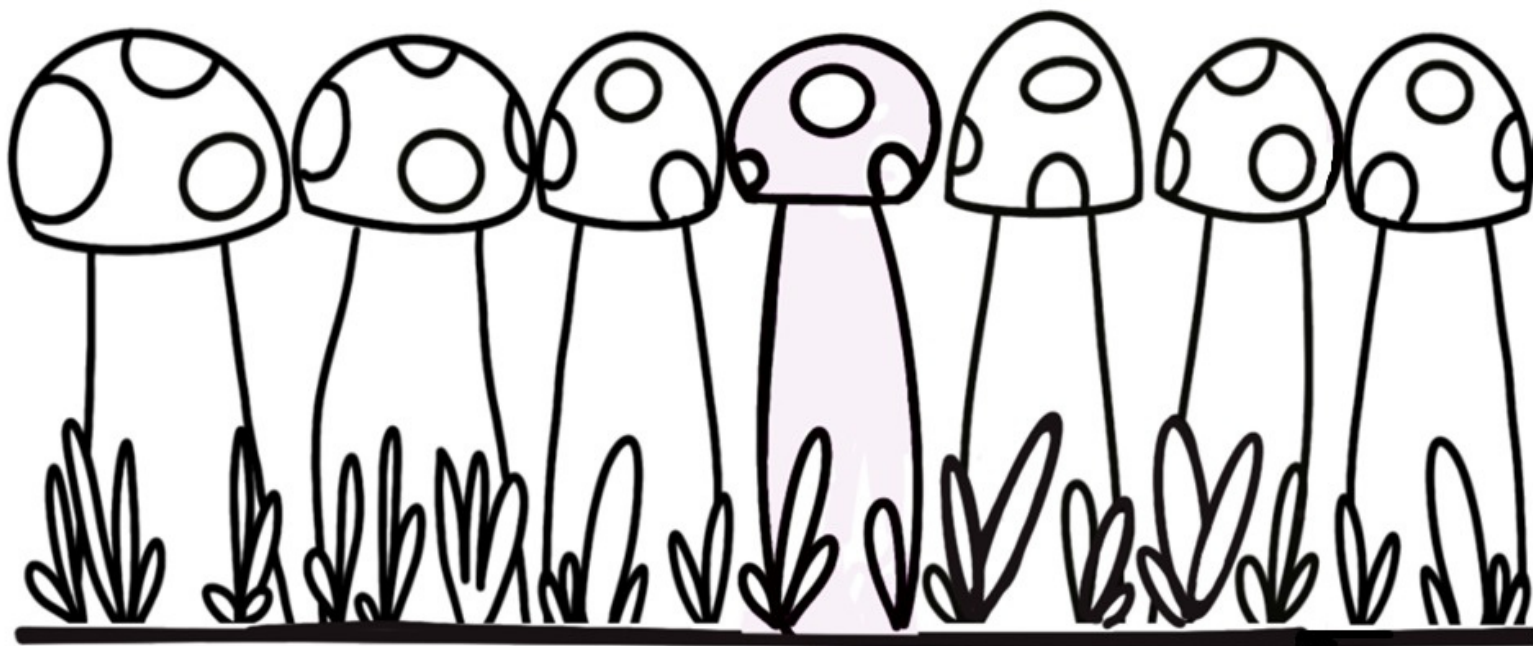
DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Paint the mushroom tops with 3 coats in the following order: Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Purple, and Pink.
3. Paint the mushroom stems with 3 coats of Taupe.
4. Paint the grass sprigs with 1 heavy coat of Green, creating 2 or 3 varying lengths of grass.
5. Paint the dots on the mushroom tops with 2 coats of White.
6. Using a liner brush or Black writer bottle, outline the details of each mushroom. Let dry.
7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Bisque: Rectangular platter (14"x8.5")

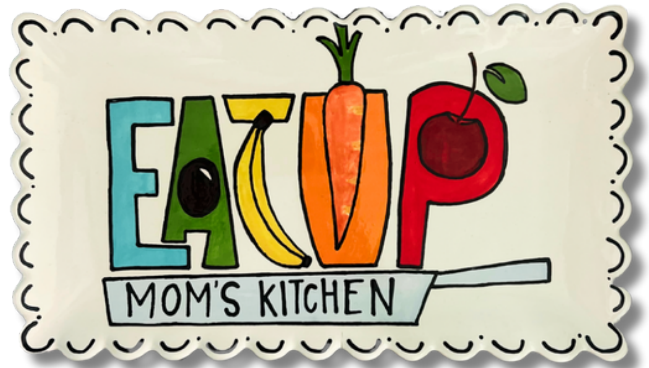

Small and medium liner brushes

Paper



GLAZE COLORS

Light Teal Blue, Kelly Green, Banana Yellow, Orange, Dark Brown, Red, Burgundy, Black, Gray, White

Writer Bottle :Black

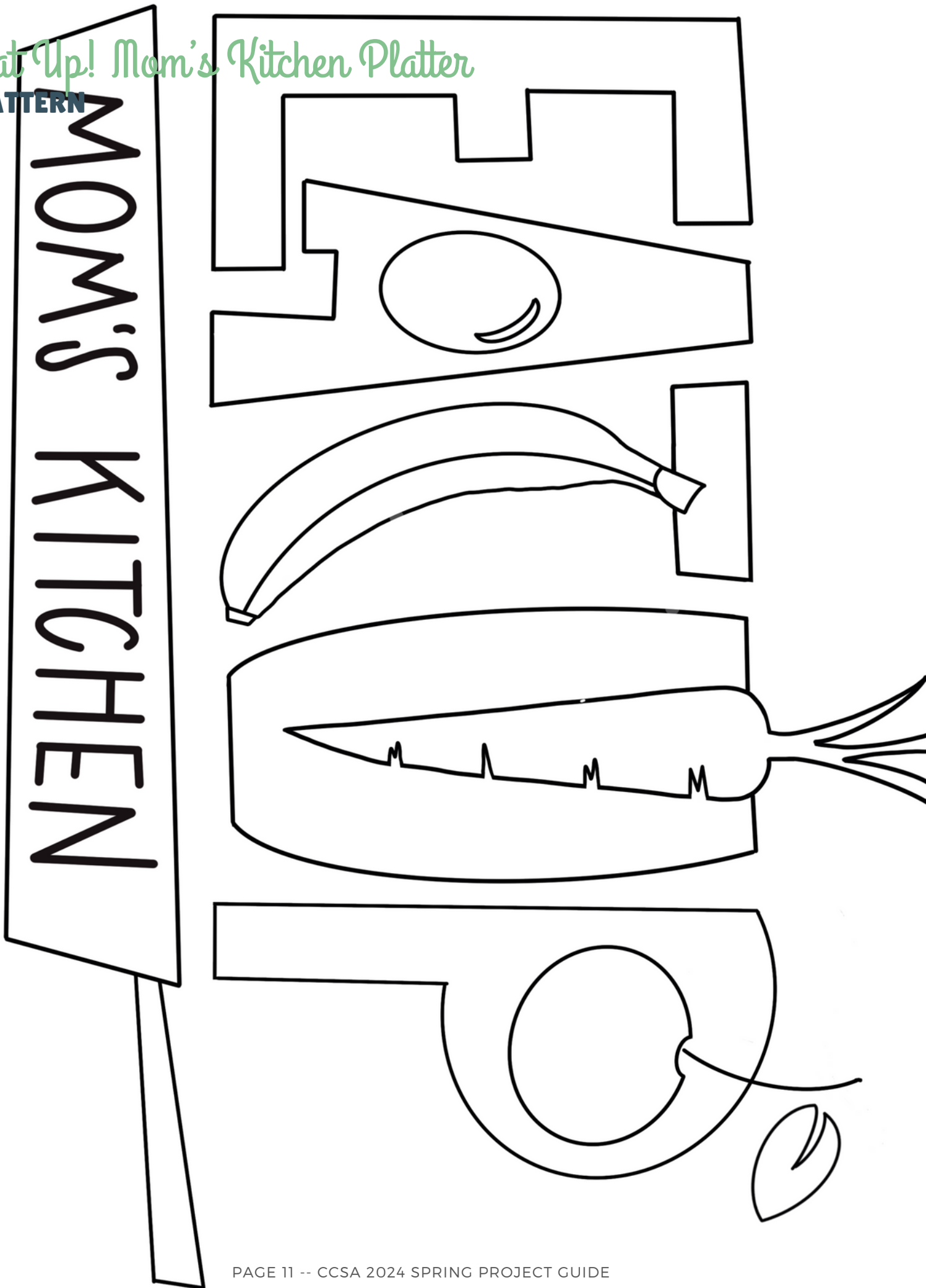
DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Don't trace the lettering onto the frying pan yet.
2. Paint the letter E with 3 coats of Light Teal Blue.
3. Paint the letter A with 3 coats of Kelly Green,
4. Paint the letter T with 3 coats of Banana Yellow.
5. Paint the letter U with 3 coats of Orange.
6. Add 1 or 2 drops of Brown to the Orange and mix well. Paint the carrot inside the U with 3 coats of this mix.
7. Paint the letter P with 3 coats of Red.
8. Paint the cherry inside the P with 3 coats of Burgundy.
9. Paint the olive in the letter A with 3 coats of Black.
10. Paint the stem of the carrot and the leaf of the cherry with 3 coats of Kelly Green.
11. Paint the frying pan with 3 coats of Gray.
12. Reposition the tissue tracing and trace the lettering on the frying pan with the marker. Paint the lettering with small brush or a Black writer bottle.
13. Outline the entire design with a Black writer bottle and add accent lines around the edge of the platter.
14. With liner brush, paint the highlight on the olive with White paint. Let dry.
15. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Bisque: Coupe dinner plate

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Small and medium liner brushes

GLAZE COLORS

Light Green, Kelly Green, Salmon Pink, Red, Black

Writer Bottle: Black



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Paint the background area with 2–3 coats of Light Green.
3. Paint the leaves with 3 coats of Kelly Green.
4. Paint the ladybug bodies and heads with 3 coats of Salmon Pink.
5. Paint the ladybug wings with 3 coats of Red.
6. Paint the dots and antennae with 3 coats of Black.
7. Using a liner brush or writer bottle with Black, paint the faces on the ladybugs, and outline the bodies and leaves. Let dry.
8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Bisque: Coupe charger

Tissue paper

Copy paper
Scissors
Fan brushes
1" sponge dotter

GLAZE COLORS

Golden Yellow, Light Blue, Orange, Red,
Writer Bottles: Black, Dark Green, White



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the just the circle with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Place the tissue tracing on regular paper and trace 10 large petals and 5 small petals. Cut out all the petals.
3. To create a guide to line up the paper petal shapes on the plate, starting from the center circle, use a pencil to lightly draw a line at the 12:00 and 6:00 positions. Make additional lines at the 1:00, 2:00, 4:00, 5:00, 7:00, 8:00, 10:00 and 11:00 positions.
4. Start with the small petals first. These will fall in between the lines drawn for the large petals, skipping every other one. With a fan brush, paint a small petal shape with 1 heavy coat of Golden Yellow and place color side down on the plate with the bottom edge meeting the center circle, slightly overlapping it. Repeat until all 5 petals are painted and placed on the plate. Tap each painted petal on the plate to gently smooth out the color, but be careful not to smoosh out the color along the edges. Leave the paper in place.
5. With a fan brush, paint each large petal with 1 heavy coat of Light Blue and place color side down, centered on the drawn lines. These petals will overlap the small petals. Repeat until all the large petals are on the plate. Tap on the petals as you go along to smooth out the color, but don't smoosh out the color along the edges.
6. Remove all the paper pieces.
7. Paint the center circle with 3 coats of Orange.

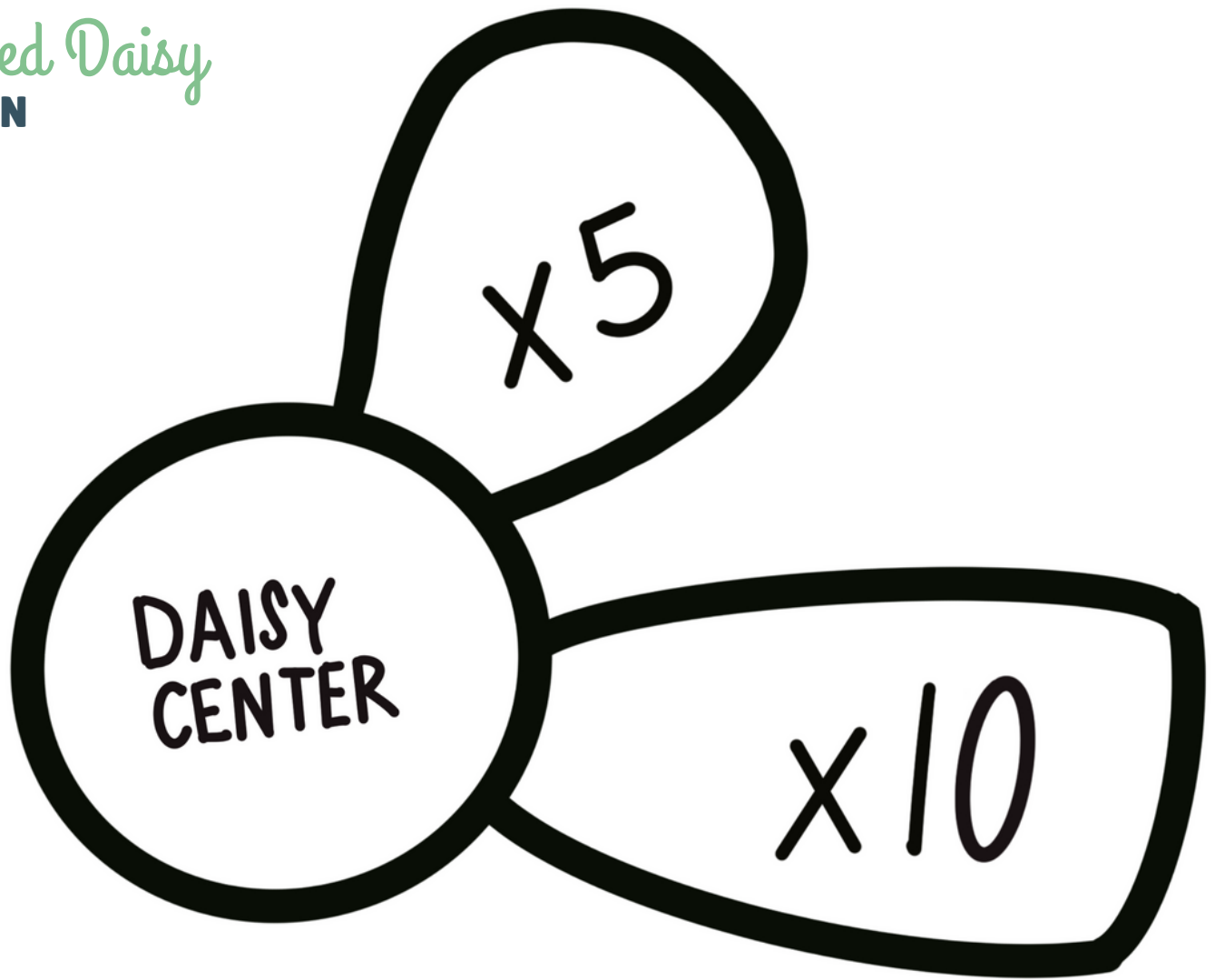
8. Dip the sponge dotter in Red and make a dot in between the small petals, in line with the top of the edges of the small petals.
9. With a Black writer bottle, add dots around the outside edge of the painted center circle. Dots should not touch the circle but can overlap the painted petals.
10. With a Dark Green writer bottle, make a line from the 1" dot almost to the black dots. Paint a little leaf on each side of the stem.
11. With a White writer bottle, make a tiny dot inside each of the Black dots. Let dry.
12. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SUPPLIES

Bisque: 12-ounce mug

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Small and medium liner brushes



GLAZE COLORS

Cream, Medium Brown, Dark Brown

Writer Bottle: Black

DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Paint the milk area with 3 coats of Cream.
3. Paint the cookie area and the inside of the mug with 3 coats of Medium Brown.
4. Dip the back end of a paintbrush in Dark Brown and make dots for chocolate chips on the cookie area.
5. With writer bottle or liner brush, outline the area where the milk and cookies meet and paint the lettering. Let dry.
6. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

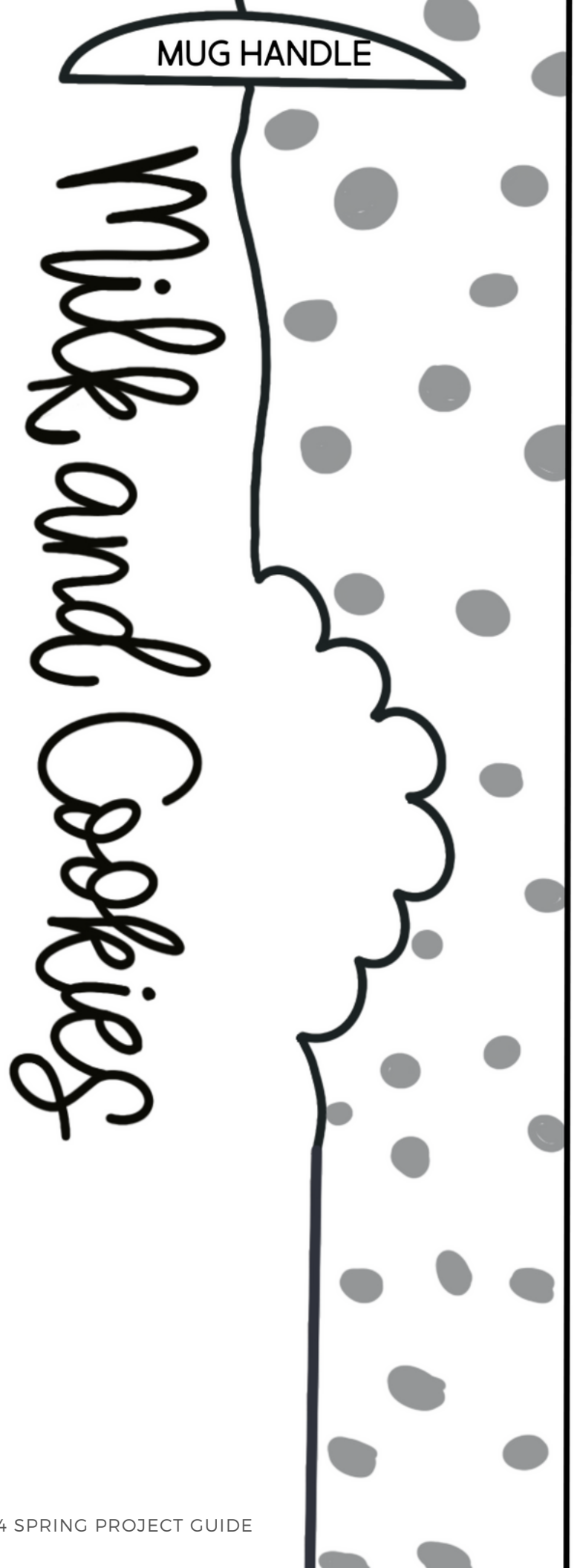

Bisque: Coupe charger

Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie
Sponge
Small and medium liner brushes

GLAZE COLORS

Lemon Yellow, Kelly Green, Dark Green
Writer Bottles: Kelly Green, Dark Green



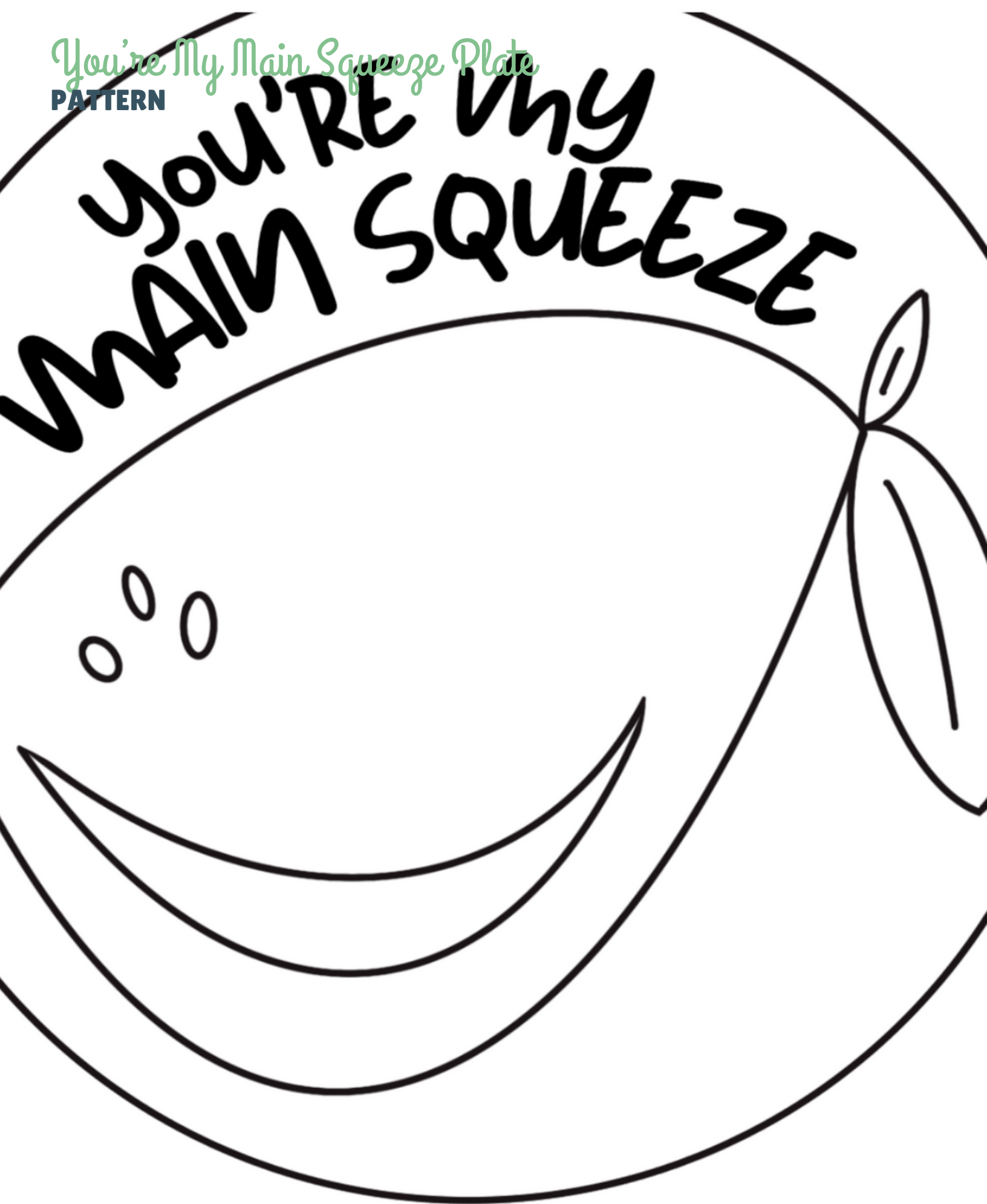
DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Using a sponge, paint the child's hand with Lemon Yellow and make a handprint on the plate within the traced lemon.
3. Paint the rest of the lemon shape with 3 coats of Lemon Yellow. Be sure to leave a small space all around the handprint.
4. Paint the leaves with 3 coats of Kelly Green.
5. Paint 3 Dark Green dots near the upper left edge of the lemon. Outline the lemon in Dark Green using a writer bottle or liner brush.
6. Fill in the lettering with Kelly Green using a writer bottle or liner brush.
7. Paint a striped border around the edge of the plate using a combination of Lemon Yellow, Kelly Green, and Dark Green. Let dry.
8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Large mug
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie
Contact paper
Scissors
½" blue painter's tape
Assorted brushes



GLAZE COLORS

CBright Blue, Bright Orange, Bright Green, Bright Yellow, Bright Lime Green
Writer Bottles: Black, Kelly Green, Orange

DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Trace the circles on contact paper and cut out. Place the small circle on the traced pattern on the mug. Place the larger circle centered on top of the small circle. Run a finger along the edges to ensure it adheres to the bisque.
3. Place the ½" tape along the traced pattern lines. Run a finger along the edges to ensure it adheres to the bisque.
4. Paint the horizontal lines with 3 coats of Bright Blue.
5. Paint the camera buttons a combination of Bright Orange, Bright Green, and Bright Blue. Make sure no areas that are touching are painted the same color.
6. Remove the ½" tape.
7. Remove the large circle and paint that area with 3 coats of Bright Orange.
8. Remove the small circle and paint that area with 1 coat of Bright Yellow.
9. Paint the stars in the small circle with 2 coats of Bright Lime Green.
10. Outline the design in Black and fill in the lettering using a writer bottle or liner brush. Let dry.
11. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

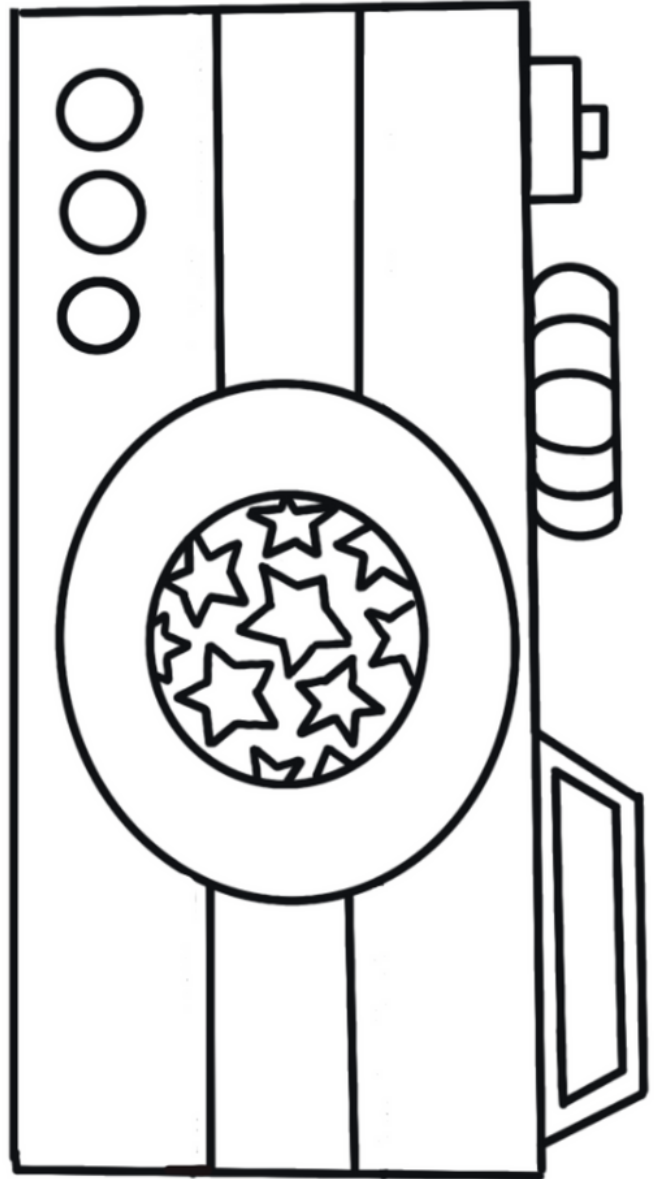

Bisque: Coupe salad plate

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Assorted brushes

GLAZE COLORS

Lime Green, Deep Coral, Teal Green, Golden Yellow, Butter Yellow, Kelly Green

Writer Bottles: Butter Yellow, Golden Yellow, Teal Green



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Paint the moon with 3 coats of Lime Green.
3. Paint the sun with 3 coats of Deep Coral.
4. Paint the star closest to the moon with 3 coats of Golden Yellow.
5. Paint the connecting star with 3 coats of Butter Yellow.
6. For the last star, use a 1:1 mixture of Butter Yellow and Golden Yellow.
7. Paint the area behind the sun with 3 coats of Kelly Green.
8. Paint the area below the moon and stars with a mixture of Lime Green and Kelly Green.
9. With a Butter Yellow writer bottle, add the pattern lines on the sun and the star closest to the moon.
10. With a Golden Yellow writer bottle, add the pattern lines on the connecting star.
11. With a Teal Green writer bottle, add dots around the edge of the moon. Let dry.
12. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

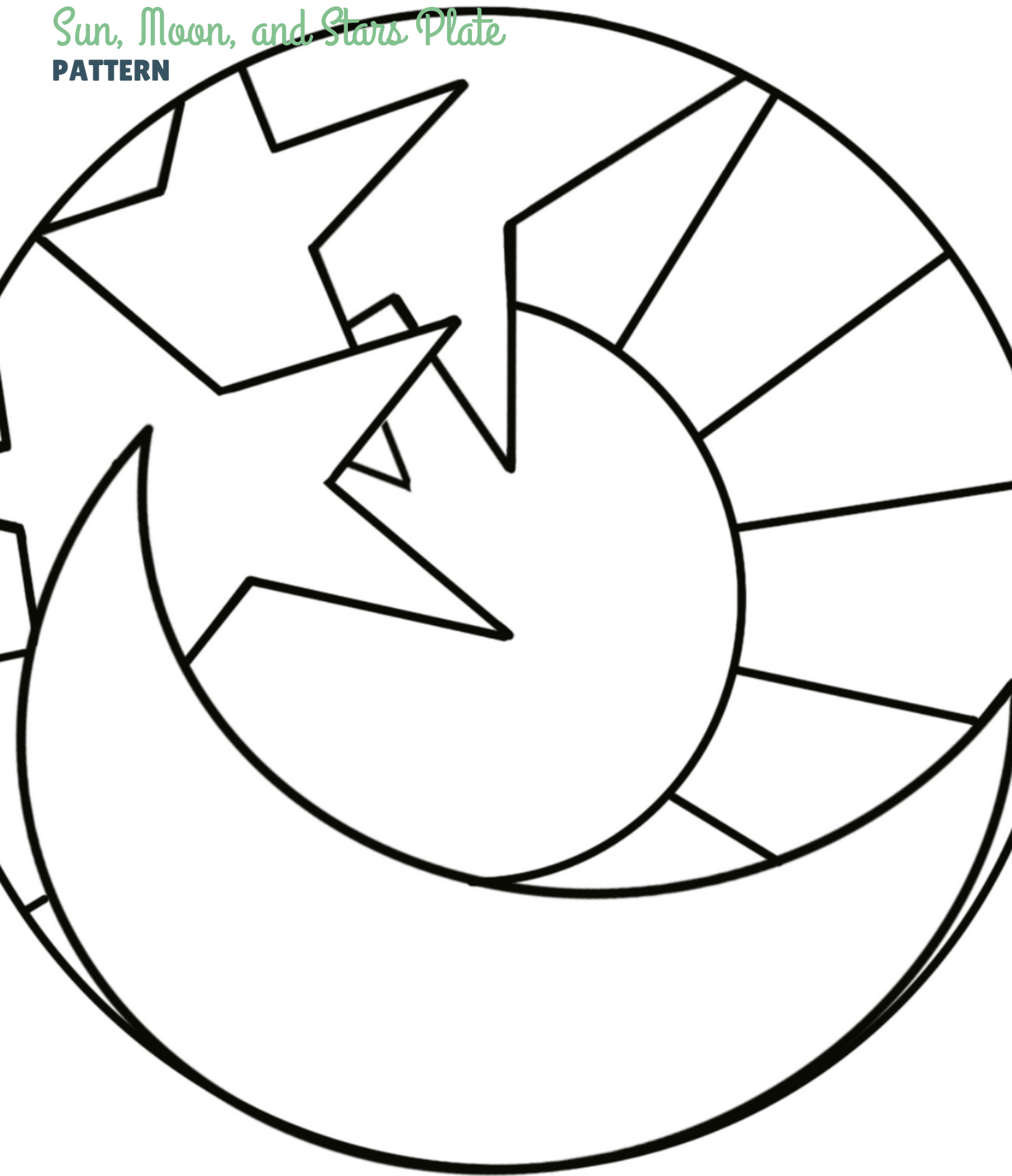

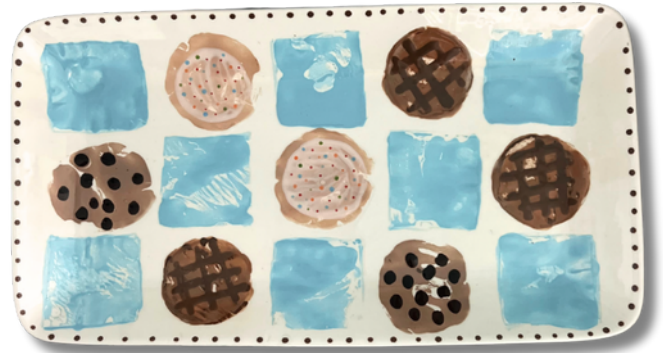
Take Your Pick Cookie Plate

POTTERY

This design can be painted on any flat serving dish. Just adjust the number of cookie and square paper cutouts to fit the size.

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Rectangular serving platter
Pattern
Scissors
Pencil
Marker
Thin liner brush
Medium round brush



GLAZE COLORS

Light Blue, Light Tan, Medium Tan, Medium Brown, Dark Brown, Cream
Writer bottles: Red, Green, Orange, Blue

DIRECTIONS

1. From the pattern, cut out the desired number of shapes that will cover the surface of the chosen pottery shape.
2. Arrange the paper cutouts on the pottery.
3. If needed, lightly draw grid lines between the paper shapes to keep the arrangement straight and organized once you begin painting.
4. Paint each of the paper squares with 1 good coat of Light Blue. Pat each paper down to smooth out the paint between the paper and the pottery. Try not to squish out excess color along the paper edges. If you do, use a liner brush to paint along the paper edge to smooth out the squished paint and create a straight edge.
5. For the cookies, follow the same technique in step 4 used for the Light Blue squares, using the following colors: Light Tan for the sugar cookie, Medium Tan for the chocolate chip cookie, and Medium Brown for the peanut butter cookie. For each cookie type, paint the paper cutout with 1 good coat of the corresponding color.
6. Remove all the square paper shapes. You will remove the cookie shapes one at a time so you don't lose track of the cookie type, because all the colors may look similar until fully dry.
7. For the sugar cookie, paint the center with 1 heavy coat of Cream for the icing. Be sure to leave a small edge of the cookie showing all around.
8. For the chocolate chip cookie, paint small chips with Dark Brown.

DIRECTIONS CONTINUED

9. For the peanut butter cookie, paint small crisscross lines with a mix of Medium Brown and Dark Brown. The color mix should just be slightly darker than Medium Brown.
10. Using writer bottles, add little dots in the icing area of the sugar cookies to create sprinkles. Let dry.
11. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

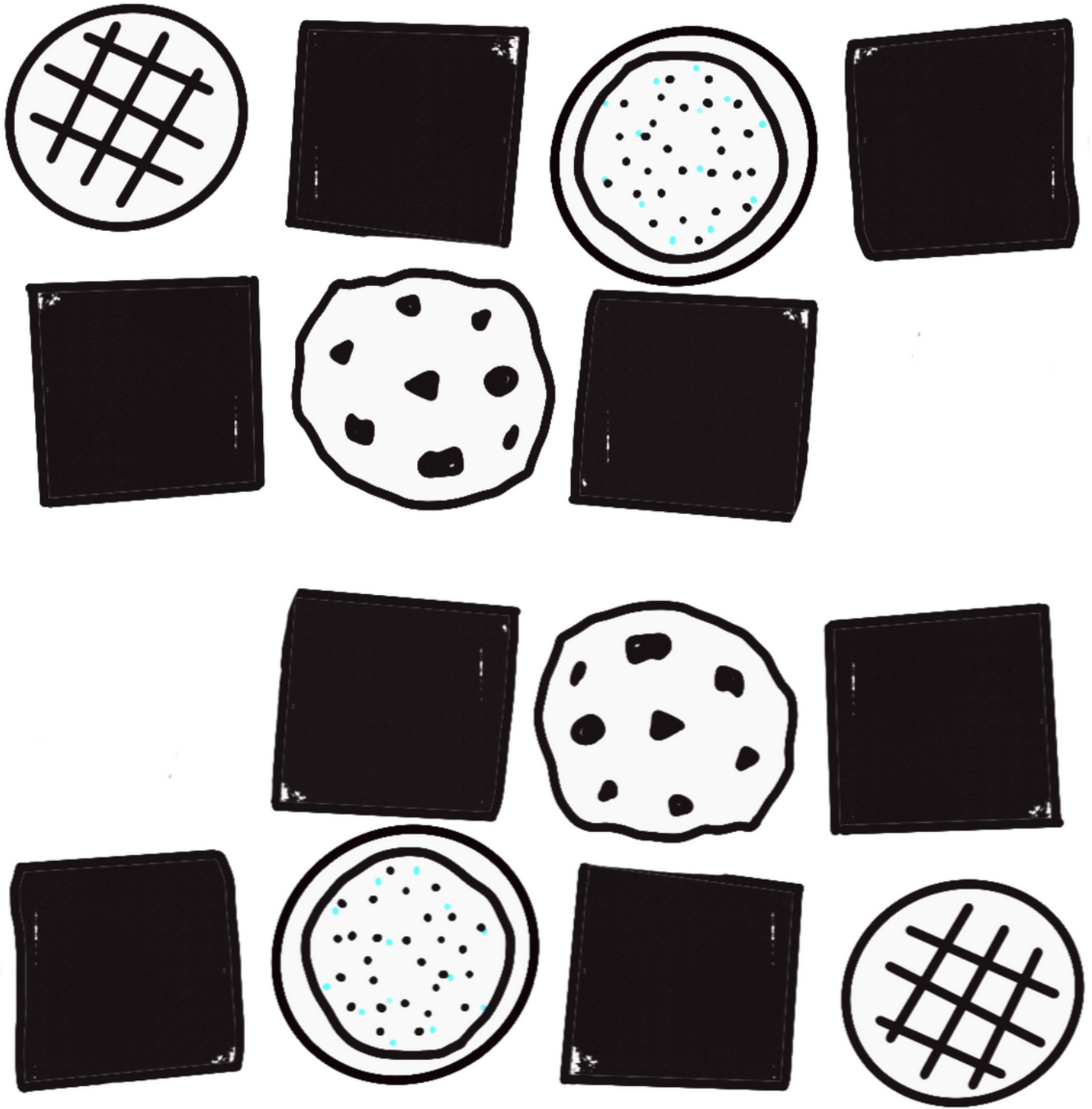

SUPPLIES

Bisque: 12" coupe charger

Patterns

Tissue paper

Pencil

Marker

Scissors

Thin liner brush

Medium round brush

GLAZE COLORS

Red, Yellow, Teal, Orange, Blue, Green

Writer bottles: Teal, Red, Orange, Blue, Green



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the patterns and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Don't trace the lettering onto the plate yet.
2. Cut out the 4 hat pieces.
3. Paint the main part of the hat with 1 heavy coat of Red. Place the painted shape color side down on top of the traced pattern. Pat down the paper to smooth out the paper but try not to squish out excess color along the paper edges.
4. Repeat this step for the hat brim shape. Be sure to leave a little white space between the hat top and the brim. Pat down the paper to smooth out the paper but try not to squish out excess color along the paper edges.
5. Repeat this step for the small hat pieces using Yellow, placing them on each side of the hat top just above the brim.
6. Slowly lift the paper pieces. If you see that stayed blank, apply a little bit of color to the paper and press the paper back down on the pottery. Pat the area to ensure the paper adheres to the pottery. When all of the areas have adequate coverage, remove the paper sections.
7. Paint the banner shapes with 3 coats of color, in the following order: Teal, Yellow, Orange, Blue, Red, and Green.
8. Using writer bottles, make thin stripes on the small yellow sections of the hat in alternating colors. Let dry.

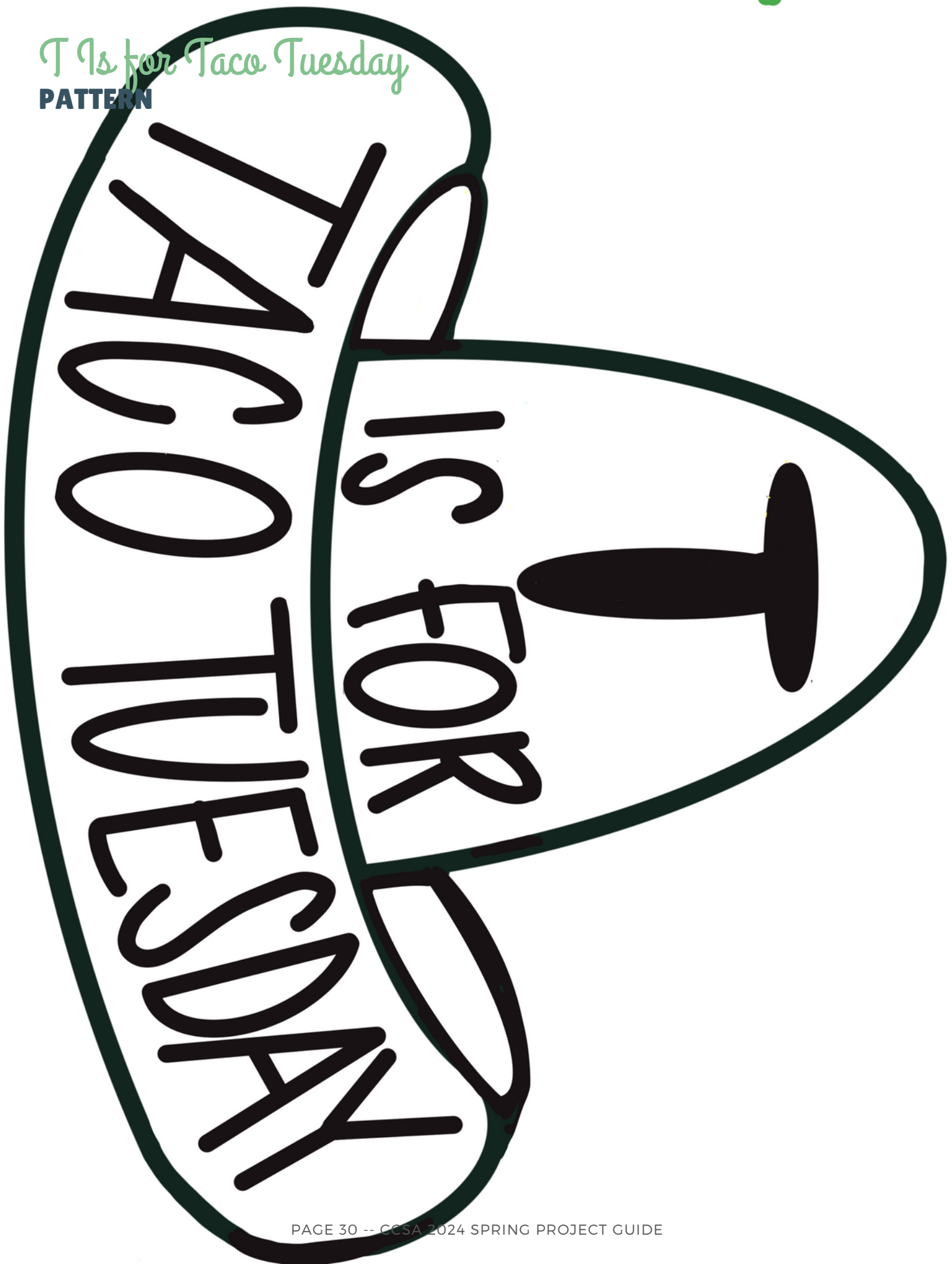
9. Reposition the tissue tracing on the bisque and trace the lettering with a marker. Fill in "T is for" with a Yellow writer bottle. Fill in the remaining letters in the following order: Teal, Yellow, Orange, Blue, Green. Repeat until all the letters are painted.
10. Outline the top of the yellow sections of the hat with a Red writer bottle. Let dry.
11. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

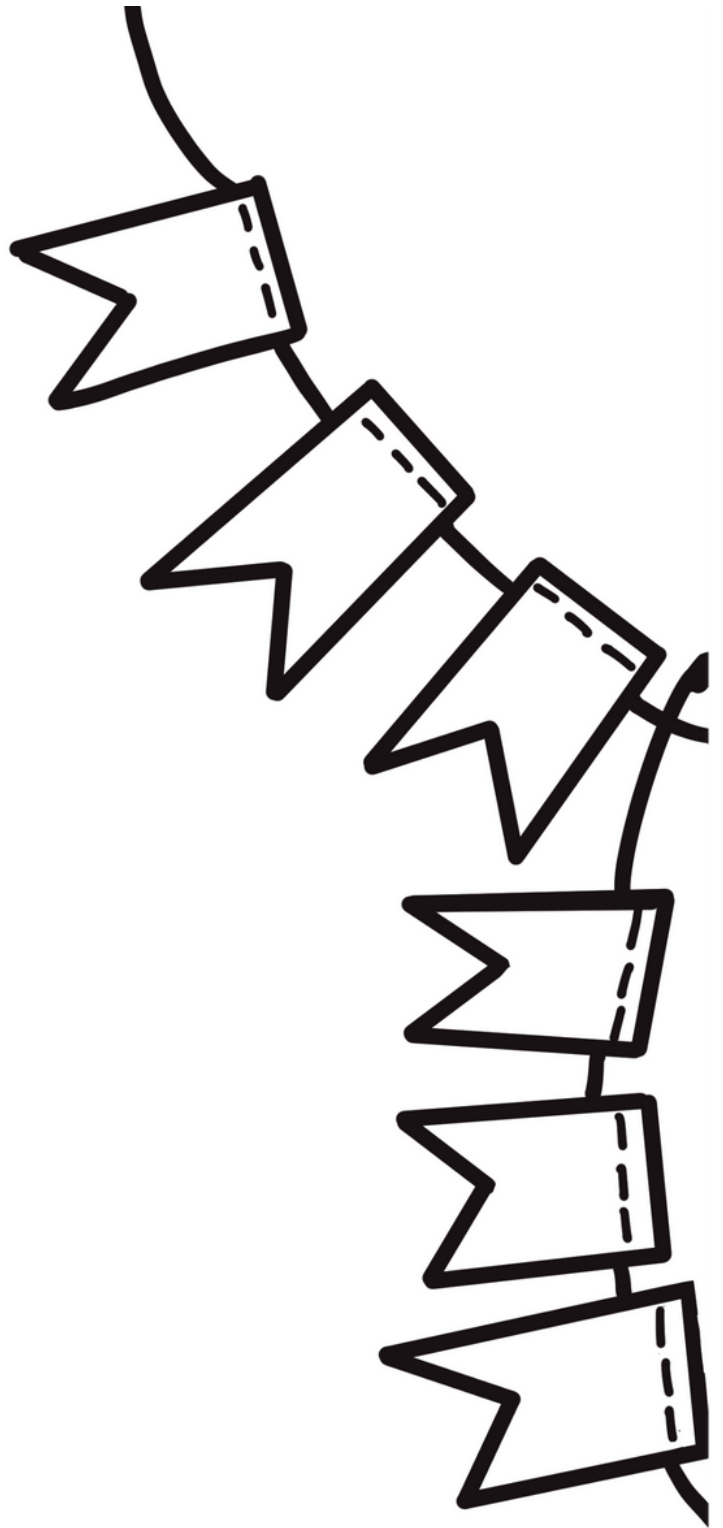

POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Tapered bowl (4.5" to 5.5" tall)

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Small and medium round brushes

Thin liner brush



GLAZE COLORS

Teal Green, Butter Yellow, Light Teal Blue, Bright Orange, Olive Green

DIRECTIONS

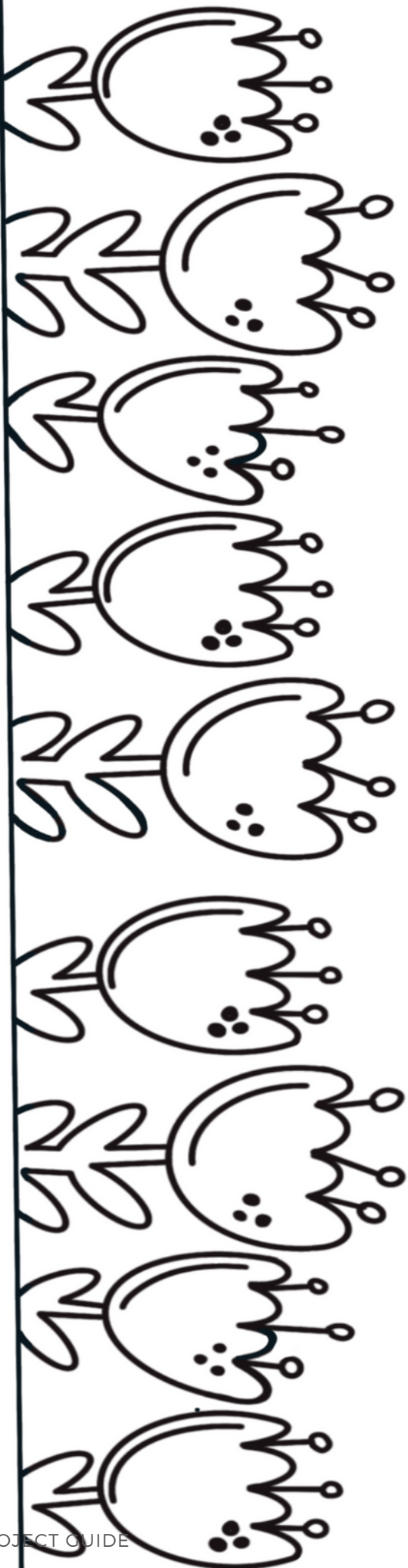
1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. The tulips can be painted in any order as long as no tulips side by side are the same color. Paint each tulip with 3 coats of the chosen color. Paint the stems with 2–3 coats of Olive Green.
3. Paint dots at the top of each flower in a color that is not that tulip's color.
4. Using a liner brush, paint a highlight and dot details on each tulip with Olive Green.
5. Dip the back end of a paintbrush in a color and make little dots between the flower stems in the colors used in the design.
6. Paint the inside of the bowl and the rim one of the colors used in the bowl. (Bright Orange was used on the sample shown.) Let dry.
7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Utensil holder (or any other pottery shape)

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie

Small and medium round brushes

Thin liner brush

Toothbrush or splatter tool

GLAZE COLORS

Pink, Red, Green, Black



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Move the tracing as needed to place strawberries randomly over the whole mug.
2. Water down Pink to a 1:1 ratio. Paint the entire background with 1 coat.
3. Paint the strawberries with 2–3 coats of Red.
4. Paint the stems with 2–3 coats of Green.
5. Outline the entire design with watered-down Black.
6. Splatter the entire piece with Black. Let dry.
7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

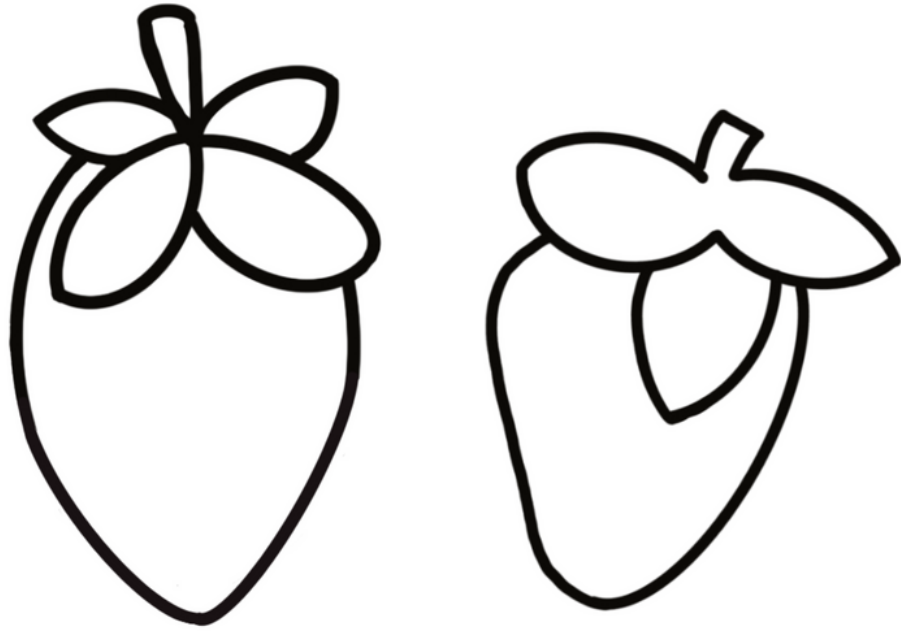

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Square salad plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie
Small and medium round brushes
Thin liner brush

GLAZE COLORS

Green, Teal, Teal Blue, Lime Green, Orange
Writer Bottle: Black



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) The number of "talk bubbles" to trace depends on the size of the bisque. This project can easily be sized for small or large surfaces. Don't trace lettering onto the bisque yet.
2. Paint each bubble with 3 coats of the chosen color. Try to avoid painting two side-by-side bubbles with the same color.
3. Use the back end of the paintbrush to add random dots all over the background using the colors from the talk bubbles.
4. Reposition the tissue tracing and trace the lettering onto the bisque in the talk bubbles. Choose larger quotes for larger bubbles and smaller quotes for smaller bubbles.
5. Fill in the lettering with a Black writer bottle, and outline some of the bubbles with dots, dashes, or a sketchy line pattern.
6. Add just a few Black dots in the background area here and there. Let dry.
7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.
