Foxy Five Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: 12" round plate

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Assorted brushes

Writer bottle in Black and White

Glaze Colors

Color pairs for each fox: Pale Yellow/Dark Yellow, Light Orange/Bright Orange, Pale Pink/Bright Red, Lavender/Dark Purple, Light Green/Medium/Green

Directions


- 1. Trace the pattern onto the plate.
- 2. Using a round brush, paint 3 coats on the face and chest of each fox with the LIGHT color of each pair.
- 3. Paint 3 coats on the remaining parts (head, ears, and body) using the DARK color of each pair.
- 4. Using a Black writer bottle, paint the eyes and nose of each fox.
- 5. Using a White writer bottle, paint a line defining the chin area to separate the head from the chest.
- 6. Glaze and fire to cone 06

Be Kind to Every Kind Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Rim bowl (shown) or rim plate Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes (fan brush, round brushes, long liner brush)

Sponge

Writer bottle in Black

Glaze Colors

Animals (first color is body color; second is features color): Mouse: Bright Blue, Pink; Dog: Taupe, Black; Cow: Tan, Dark Brown; Frog: Light Green, Dark Green; Rabbit: Gray, Pink; Panda: White, Black; Cat: Orange, Red; Elephant: Gray, Bright Blue; Pig: Light Pink, Dark Pink; Giraffe: Golden Yellow, Rusty Brown

Center: Light Teal, Black

Directions

- 1. Trace the pattern onto the rim of bowl.
- 2. Sponge Light Teal in the center of the bowl. Allow to dry.
- 3. Using a small brush, paint the animal bodies with 2 coats of color.
- 4. Paint the animal details with 2 coats of color.
- 5. Use a Black writer bottle to make dots for eyes; to make the nose of the cow and pig; the whiskers on the bunny, cat, and panda; and the smiles on any animals as desired.
- 6. Trace the lettering in the center of the bowl and fill in with Black writer bottle.
- Using coordinating colors and the back end of a paintbrush, add dots at the break of the rim in alternating colors from the animal color selection.
- 8. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Raccoon Soap Dish Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog Wooden skewer Pattern Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide Round brushes in assorted sizes

Glaze Colors

White, Dark Gray, Light Gray, Black

Directions

1. Roll an 8" x 8" clay slab ¼" thick.

- 2. Using a skewer, trace the outline of the raccoon onto the clay. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Slightly roll up the sides of the shape, creating a curled edge.
- 4. Allow the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 5. Paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.



"Free Hugs" Porcupine Plate Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog Wooden skewer Pattern Plastic fork Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide Round brushes in assorted sizes Chinet Brand paper dessert plate

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Tan, Medium Brown, Dark Brown, Light Green, Pink, Light Teal, Lavender, Light Orange, Pale Yellow, Black

Directions

- 1. Roll an 8" x 8" clay slab, 1/4" thick.
- 2. Drape the slab over the paper plate, pressing clay down to conform to the plate shape.
- 3. Using a skewer, trim off the excess clay, using the edge of the plate as a guide.
- 4. Press the tines of a plastic fork into the clay around the edges to create the quills.
- 5. For flowers, roll little balls of clay (5 per flower) and flatten with thumb. Score undersides and attach with slip across the center of the plate. Flowers can easily be replaced with hearts, sticks, fish, fruit, etc.
- 6. To maintain the shape, allow the project to remain on the plate until leather hard (may take 24–72 hours).
- 7. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 8. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.



Cat Man Do Canvas Painting Project

This project can easily be adapted to pottery painting.

Supplies

Canvas, 11"x14"
Pattern
Graphite paper
Pencil
Assorted brushes
Black Sharpie

Acrylic Paint Colors

Light Blue, Dark Blue, Yellow, Green, White, Black

Directions


- 1. Transfer the pattern to the canvas. Continue the remainder of the body and the feet to the edge of the canvas.
- 2. Starting at the top, paint the background Light Blue. Allow to dry.
- 3. Paint the face, body, and tail Dark Blue. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the sunglasses and the cat belly Yellow. Allow to dry.
- 5. Paint the bow-tie Green. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint the nose Black.
- 7. Paint the feet, the tip of the tail, the inside of the ears, and the whiskers White.
- 8. Paint the center of bow-tie and the wave stripe across the middle of the sunglasses White. Allow to dry.
- 9. Using a Black Sharpie, outline the sunglasses, tip of the tail, and feet. Add dots for eyes and small dots in the center of the bow-tie.

Portrait of a Goat Board Art Painting Project

Supplies

Wood pallet board, 14"x16"
Pattern
Transfer paper
Pencil
Assorted brushes
Small cup
Baby wipe or damp cloth
Disposable glove (optional)

Paint Colors

Light Turquoise, Black, White




- 1. Position the pattern with the goat's head in the upper portion of the board. Using transfer paper, trace the pattern onto the board. Extend the outline for the lower part of the body to the bottom edge of the board.
- 2. For the background, mix a small amount of water (enough to cover the bottom of the cup) and a squirt of Light Turquoise in a cup. Working on one small area at a time, dip a brush in the paint mixture and apply to the wood, painting up to the pattern lines. Using a baby wipe, immediately wipe off the painted area to create a "stain" look. (Painters may want to wear a disposable glove when using the baby wipe to prevent fingers becoming stained.)
- 3. For the goat, paint the details White and paint the body Black. Allow to dry.

This project can easily be adapted to pottery or canvas.

Supplies

Wood pallet board, 12"x12" Pattern Graphite paper Pencil Assorted brushes

Acrylic Paint Colors

Gray, Black, Red, White

Directions


- 1. Transfer the pattern to the wood shape. Continue the lines of the body and feet to the edges.
- 2. Paint the entire board Gray, painting up to the pattern lines. Allow to dry.
- 3. Using a small brush, outline the legs, face, eyes, and ears in Black. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the nose Black. Allow to dry.
- 5. Using small brushstrokes, paint the little fur stripes Black. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint the tongue the Red. Allow to dry.
- 7. Paint the eyes, drool, and highlights on the nose White. Allow to dry.
- 8. Paint the lines on the tongue Black. Allow to dry.

Flamingo Line Dance Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate Assorted brushes Washable marker Writer bottles

Glaze Colors

Mint Green, Cream, Medium Pink, Salmon, White, Medium Pink, Salmon, Taupe

Directions


- 1. Paint the top two-thirds of the plate with 2–3 coats of Mint Green.
- 2. Paint the bottom third with 2–3 coats of Cream. Allow to dry.
- 3. Use a washable marker to lightly draw 3 circles (about 2" in diameter) about 1 inch above the area where the 2 paint colors meet.
- 4. Dip a thumb into Medium Pink and fill the circle with about 8–10 thumbprints facing in different directions. Keep dipping thumb to replenish for prints. Don't worry about fully covering the entire circle. Allow to dry.
- 5. Repeat step 4 with Salmon, filling in areas within the circle over the background color.
- 6. Repeat step 5 with a few Medium Pink prints in areas that may need more coverage.
- 7. Using writer bottles or small brush, paint the flamingo head/necks with Medium Pink and the legs with Salmon. Be sure to vary the direction the flamingos are facing, and which leg is raised.
- 8. Using White writer bottle, make dots dividing the sand and water.
- 9. Using a Taupe writer bottle, make small wide Vs in the sky to suggest seagulls, and add some squiggles in the sand.
- 10. Using a Black writer bottle, paint the beak and add dots for eyes
- 11. Glaze and fire to cone 06

Supplies

Bisque: Rectangular coupe plate Pattern printed on clay carbon paper Pencil Assorted brushes Writer bottles

Glaze Colors

Pail Blue, Bright Blue, Cream, Pale Yellow, Light Brown, Dark Brown, Green, Medium Yellow, Coral, Black

Directions


- 1. Trace the pattern onto the bisque.
- 2. Inside the sunglasses, paint the sky with 3 coats of Pail Blue. Extend one coat of Pail Blue slightly into the water area.
- 3. Paint the water with 2 coats of Bright Blue.
- 4. Paint the sand island with 3 coats of Cream.
- 5. Paint the sun with 3 coats of Pale Yellow.
- 6. Using writer bottles or a small brush, paint the palm trees with Light Brown for the trunk, Dark Brown for the coconuts, and Green for the palm fronds.
- 7. Put a small amount of Medium Yellow and Coral on a palette. Using a separate brush for each color, water down the colors slightly.
- 8. Paint watered-down Medium Yellow in a few spots around the sunglass frame. Repeat with watered-down Coral, blending slightly into the Medium Yellow.
- 9. Paint the sunglass frames black.
- 10. Glaze and fire to cone 06

This project can easily be adapted to canvas or board art.

Supplies

Bisque: Square platter Chippy craft paintbrush

Paper towel

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes (small and liner brushes)

Writer bottle

Glaze Colors

Cream, Taupe, Teal Blue, Dark Taupe

Directions


- 1. Using chippy paintbrush, paint 2–3 coats of cream over the entire plate. Wipe brush on paper towel.
- 2. Dipping just the tips of the chippy brush in Taupe, drag the brush from one edge to the opposite edge of plate, creating a wood striation look. Paint the entire plate, going in the same direction, slightly overlapping the lines of paint to create thicker/darker areas. Allow to dry.
- 3. Trace the turtle pattern onto the plate.
- 4. Paint the center of the turtle with 3 coats of Teal Blue.
- 5. Paint the feet and head with 1 coat of Dark Taupe.
- 6. Outline the turtle body and draw the shell pattern with a Dark Taupe writer bottle
- 7. Using the Dark Taupe writer bottle, draw 2 lines to suggest wood planks.
- 8. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Flip-Flop Fish Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog Wooden skewer Plastic straw Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide Round brushes in assorted sizes Colored wire

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Red, Medium Green, Bright Green, Orange, Black

Directions

- 1. Roll out an 8" x 8" slab, 1/4" thick.
- 2. Using a wooden skewer, trace the pattern onto the clay and cut it out. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Use a straw to make two holes near the top edge for hanging.
- 4. Using the extra clay, cut out the bones of the fish body. Score and attach pieces to the slab following pattern lines.
- 5. For the eyeball, form a small round ball and flatten with thumb. Score and attach to the fish face.
- 6. Using the skewer, etch out mouth and teeth.
- 7. Allow the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 8. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 9. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 10. Fasten wire through the holes for hanging.



Cowabunga Dude Canvas Painting Project

This project can easily be adapted to pottery painting.

Supplies

Canvas, 12"x12" Pattern Graphite paper Pencil Assorted brushes Black Sharpie

Acrylic Paint Colors

Pale Yellow, Orange, Bright Blue, Bright Green, White

Directions


- 1. Transfer the pattern of the hand to the canvas.
- 2. Paint the background Pale Yellow. Allow to dry.
- 3. Paint the top section of the fingers Orange. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the middle section of the palm Bright Blue. Allow to dry.
- 5. Paint the lower half of the palm Bright Green. Allow to dry.
- 6. Transfer the lettering to the canvas. Fill in the letters with a Black Sharpie.

Supplies

Wood pallet board, 14"x16"

Pattern

Graphite paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes

Baby wipes

Twine

Scissors

Elmer's glue

Acrylic Colors

Brown, White, Light Blue, Purple, Medium Blue

Directions


- 1. Transfer the pattern onto the pallet using graphite paper. Extend the lines of the tail to the edge of the canvas.
- 2. Dip a baby wipe in Brown and wipe the paint over the pallet up to the pattern design.
- 3. Using a small brush, paint the tail flippers White. While the paint is still wet, blend a little Light Blue into the White.
- 4. Next, create scale shapes, beginning just below the flippers. Use a small brush with Purple, continuing the Purple down about 2–3 inches.
- 5. Without cleaning the brush, dip into Medium Blue and paint 2–3 more inches down. Be sure to blend the Purple and Medium Blue area with circular brushstrokes.
- 6. Repeat step 5 with Light Blue, blending into the Medium Blue and continuing to the bottom edge.
- 7. Allow to dry completely. Use a blow dryer if necessary.
- 8. Cut about 12–15 pieces of twine, about 1–2" each.
- 9. Mix 2 parts glue to 1 part water in a small bowl.
- 10. Coat each piece of twine in glue mixture. Starting at the bottom of the board, form twine into arched shapes to create scales. Form a row of scales across the bottom, then add 2 more rows of scales to end where the Purple paint begins. A drop of glue may be needed where the edges of the twine pieces meet. Allow to dry.

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Sponge

Assorted brushes Writer bottles

Glaze Colors

Tan, Golden Yellow, Bright Yellow, Berry Purple, Teal, Coral, Dark Brown or Black

Directions


- 1. Trace the buffalo pattern onto the bisque.
- 2. Sponge 1 heavy coat of Tan around the buffalo.
- 3. Using writer bottles or small brushes, paint in the divided sections. Be sure to leave a bit of space between colors and make sure the same colors are not next to each other.
- 4. Trace the **geometric** pattern and lettering onto the bisque. Fill in the pattern using coordinating colors.
- 5. Fill in the lettering and the lines in the buffalo with Dark Brown or Black.
- 6. Glaze and fire to cone 06

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Paper pattern
Wooden skewer
Plastic straw
Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide

Fun wire

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Coral, Dark Purple, Teal

Directions

- 1. Roll an 8" x 14" clay slab 1/4" thick.
- 2. Using a wooden skewer, trace the outline of the feather pieces onto the clay. Press into the pattern with the skewer to trace over all the lines on the pattern. Cut out around the outline and also cut between the sections where the cross-hatching appears on the pattern so you have three separate pieces. Cut out the shape openings.
- 3. Use a straw to cut out the holes needed to add wire after firing. Smooth all the edges.
- 4. Allow the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 5. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 6. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 7. Once fired, wire the pieces together to hang.

Dream Catcher Watercolor Canvas Painting Project

This project can easily be adapted to pottery painting.



Supplies

11" x 14" canvas Pattern Graphite paper Pencil Assorted brushes Blow dryer (optional)

Acrylic Paint Colors

White, Yellow, Orange, Bright Pink, Black

Directions


Note: Steps 1–3 should be done pretty fast and canvas should be wet and drippy.

- 1. In small bowl, mix 1 part White and 2 parts Yellow with water. The more watery, the better. Paint Yellow/White mix in the bottom right quarter of canvas.
- In a small bowl, water down some Orange. Dip into this with the same brush from the Yellow mix and blend with the Yellow on the canvas, towards the middle of the canvas.
- 3. Water down Bright Pink and paint the rest of the canvas.
- Tilt the canvas and let the painted colors run together so they blend.
- 5. When you achieve the desired drip look, lay flat and splatter Yellow and Bright Pink on the canvas.
- 6. Dry canvas with blow-dryer or leave for next day to finish.
- 7. Once dry, transfer the design to the canvas.
- Using a small paint brush, outline the design in black.

Supplies

Wooden pallet board, 14" x 16"
1" painter's tape
Chippy craft paint brush
Baby wipes
Pattern
Graphite paper
Assorted canvas brushes
Pencil
Assorted canvas/board art brushes

Acrylic Paint Colors

Dark Teal, Tan, Light Blue, Olive Green, Dark Gray, White, Teal, Coral, Darker Coral, Lime Green, Gold Metallic


Directions

- 1. Use painter's tape to block out the arrow stems in the center of each board.
- 2. Use a chippy craft brush to "wash" paint in on each plank and wipe down with a baby wipe before it dries. Do one plank color at a time.
- 3. Trace on the tips and ends of the arrow and the flowers.
- 4. Remove the tape. Paint the arrows Dark Gray.
- 5. Fill in the flowers and add small details.
- 6. Outline the design in Metallic Gold.
- 7. Add dots and any small details in Metallic Gold as desired. Allow to dry.

Oh Deer Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes (round and flat)

Writer bottle in Black

Glaze Colors

Taupe, Medium Brown, Dark Brown, Red

Directions

- 1. Paint the entire plate with 1–2 coats of Taupe. To achieve a wood grain pattern in the center, use a flat brush starting in center and paint a circular pattern. Continue this all the way to the edge of the plate. Allow to dry.
- 2. Paint 3–4 randomly spaced circles with 1 light coat of Dark Brown, starting in the center and moving out to the edge of the plate. Allow to dry.
- 3. About ½" in from the outer edge, paint 2–3 coats of Dark Brown all around the plate to create tree bark. Using a small brush, paint 1 coat of Taupe along the edge of the tree bark. Allow to dry.
- 4. Trace the pattern onto the plate.
- 5. Paint the reindeer face with 2–3 coats of Medium Brown.
- 6. Paint the nose with 3 coats of Red.
- 7. Using a Black writer bottle, make eyes and a mouth. Fill in the antlers and lettering, outline the head, and add squiggles around the edge to suggest bark texture.
- 8. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Nuggins Muggin Pottery Painting Project

This project can easily be adapted to canvas or board art.

Supplies

Bisque: 12-ounce regular mug Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes (including flat and liner brushes)

Glaze Colors

Light Blue, Red, White, Taupe (or other skin color), Black

Directions

- 1. Draw a line around the mug about ½" from the bottom.
- 2. Place the edge of the pattern along the drawn line and trace the design.
- 3. Paint the ½" band along the bottom with 3 coats of Light Blue.
- 4. Paint the hats with 3 coats of Red.
- 5. Pain the hat "fuzzies" with 3 coats of White.
- 6. Paint the face of the noggin that is peeping over the band with 1 coat of Taupe. Use the back end of a paintbrush to make 2 Black dots for eyes. Once dots are dry, add a smaller dot of White on the Black dots for highlights.
- 7. Dip a flat brush in Light Blue, tap bristles on pallet to remove some of the paint, and stipple the areas surrounding the hats. Do not paint this area solid.
- 8. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Directions

- 1. Draw a simple tree shape onto contact paper and cut out. Adhere the contact paper tree in the center of the plate.
- 2. Lightly sketch the snow area beneath the tree. Paint the snow area with 3 coats of White.
- 3. Sponge the sky with 2–3 coats of Light Blue, just up to where the snow begins, and the rim begins.
- 4. To suggest the base of the snow globe, lightly draw 2 curved lines on the rim below the snow.
- 5. Using a sponge, paint the rim with 2–3 coats of Cream.
- 6. Paint the base of the snow globe Dark Taupe.
- 7. Remove the tree sticker and paint the tree with 3 coats of Green.
- 8. Lightly sketch a star at the top of the tree and fill it with a Golden Yellow writer bottle.
- 9. Make snowflakes on the Light Blue sky with a White writer bottle.
- 10. Use the back end of a paintbrush to dot a garland onto the tree, alternating Red, Dark Blue, and Dark Green.
- 11. Add a "reflection" detail on each side of the globe using 3 coats of Medium Blue.
- 12. Add a saying, name, or other customized details along the base of snow globe and the upper rim.
- 13. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Handprint Gnome Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog Wooden skewer Pattern Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide Round brushes in assorted sizes Wire (optional)

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Red, Taupe, White

Directions

- 1. Roll an 8" x 14" clay slab 1/4" thick.
- 2. Using a skewer, trace the pattern outline onto the clay and cut out the shape. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Place fingers about ½" above the round part of the cutout and lightly press handprint into the clay.
- 4. Use the skewer to lightly carve two curved lines at the top of the handprint to represent the hat brim. If you'll want to hang the piece later, use the skewer to poke a hole near the point of the hat.
- 5. Cut out a small circle, about 1" diameter, and slip and score to attach to the top of the fingerprints for the gnome's nose.
- 6. Allow the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 7. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 8. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 9. If desired, thread wire through the hole to hang.



White, Light Blue, Teal Blue, Red, Pink, Black, Metallic Silver


- 1. Transfer the pattern to the canvas.
- 2. Paint the tree and the snow base White. Allow to dry.
- 3. Paint the inside of the globe Light Blue. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the tree design and the tree outline Teal Blue. Allow to dry.
- 5. Paint the star Red. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint the background Pink. Allow to dry.
- 7. Paint the globe base Black. Allow to dry.
- 8. Using a small brush, paint snowflakes inside the globe Metallic Silver. Outline the globe, the base, and the snow in Metallic Silver. Allow to dry.


- 1. Trace the pattern onto the pallet using graphite paper. Extend the pattern to the edges of the board.
- 2. Paint the snowman body White.
- 3. Paint the hat Black.
- 4. Paint the bird Red. Add a little Black to the Red to darken for the bird's wing.
- 5. Paint the scarf with a mix of Light Green and Dark Green. Paint the Dark Green as a stipple technique along the edge of the scarf.
- 6. Use the back end of the brush with Black to make large dots for eyes and smaller dots for the mouth and buttons
- 7. Paint the nose Orange.
- 8. Using Red, paint 3 berries on the hat. Paint small Dark Green leaves around the berries.
- 9. Paint the background Light Blue.
- 10. Paint a thin Brown line along the bottom left edge of the board for the tree trunk. Using the same Brown, paint twig arms on the snowman.
- 11. Using long strokes, paint Dark Green branches off the left edge of the board.
- 12. Using Light Blue, outline the top hat with wispy lines for highlights. Allow to dry.


- 1. Trace the pattern onto the bisque.
- 2. Paint each stripe of the rainbow with 2 coats of color, in order from top to bottom: Dark Blue, Teal, Green, Bright Yellow, Red, and Light Orange.
- 3. Paint the sun with 2 coats of Pale Yellow. Paint the raindrops with 2 coats of Light Blue.
- 4. Outline the clouds using a Black Shimmer writer bottle.
- 5. Use Shimmer glazes in writer bottles to outline corresponding colors of the rainbow stripes. Blue gets 2 lines (top and bottom.)
- 6. Using Yellow Shimmer, outline the sun and add swirls in the center. Outline the raindrops with Aqua Shimmer.
- 7. Fill in the lettering with a Black Shimmer writer bottle.
- 8. Glaze and fire to cone 06

Directions

- 1. Trace the pattern onto tissue paper, tracing the feet separately from the heart so they are two separate patterns. (You do not need to trace the toes; they'll be added with a sponge dotter.) Place the tissue paper patterns onto contact paper and trace over them with a Sharpie.
- 2. Cut out the contact paper patterns and apply the feet to the center of the plate. (Set aside the heart to use later.)
- 3. Sponge paint the entire plate with 1 coat of Light Blue.
- 4. Combine equal parts of Darker Blue and water in a shallow cup. Add a few drops of soap and mix. Blow into the straw to make bubbles. If there are not a lot of bubbles, add a tiny bit more soap and repeat the process.
- 5. Let the bubbles fall onto plate. Move the plate beneath the cup to ensure the entire plate is covered with bubbles. (Note: Advise painters to be careful not to tip the cup; you don't want it spilling onto the plate.)
- 6. Allow the bubbles to pop on their own. Once all the bubbles have popped, use a sponge to soak up the extra bubble mix that will puddle in the middle of the plate.
- 7. Remove the feet sticker.
- 8. Apply the heart cutout in the center of the feet, aligning the left top edge of the heart on the inside of left side of the feet.
- 9. Using skin color and a round brush, paint 3 coats on the feet portion of the pattern.
- 10. Remove the heart sticker. Using a round brush, paint the heart with 3 coats of Red.
- 11. Create the toes using a medium dotter for the big toe and small dotters for the other toes.
- 12. Trace the lettering onto the plate using the tissue paper technique and fill in with a Black writer bottle.
- 13. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Assorted brushes Sponge dotter

Glaze Colors

Pink, Taupe, Tan, Red, Purple, Light Green, Bright Blue, Yellow, Orange, Light Teal

Directions


- 1. Trace the pattern inside the bowl.
- 2. Paint the ice cream with 3 coats of Pink.
- 3. Paint the cone with 3 coats of Taupe. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the lines on the cone in Tan.
- 5. Paint the cherry with 3 coats of Red.
- 6. Use a liner brush to paint the letters, switching colors for each word.
- 7. Using a small brush, paint small lines for sprinkles around the ice cream cone and on top of the ice cream.
- 8. Dip half of a dotter sponge into Light Teal and create a scalloped edge along the top of the bowl, slightly overlapping the edge of each circle with the one next to it.
- 9. Decorate the outside of the bowl using the same colors.
- 10. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Canvas, 12"x12" Pattern Graphite paper Pencil Assorted brushes Small dotter

Acrylic Paint Colors

White, Yellow, Orange, Blue, Red, skin tone color, hair color, Gray, Black, Light Blue, Silver Metallic

Directions

- 1. Transfer the pattern to the canvas.
- 2. Paint the background inside the circle and the goggle lenses White, painting up to the traced pattern lines. Allow to dry.
- 3. Paint the goggle frame and the snorkel Yellow. (This may take more than one coat.)
- 4. Paint the snorkel mouthpiece Orange. (This may take more than one coat.) Allow to dry.
- 5. Paint the swimsuit stripes Red and Blue. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint the face a chosen skin color (mix of White and Brown shown here). Allow to dry.
- 7. Paint the hair in chosen color in a squiggle design to mimic hair floating in the water. Allow to dry.
- 8. Using small dotter, paint black dots for eyes.
- 9. Dip the end of a paintbrush in Blue and make the bubbles in the water. Allow to dry.
- 10. Paint Gray around the outside of the porthole. Allow to dry.
- 11. Paint the background around the circle Black. Allow to dry.
- 12. Once the design in the porthole is dry, mix Blue with a little water and paint a light wash over the entire design in the port hole to mimic water. Allow to dry.
- 13. Using Silver Metallic, add rectangles around the rim of the porthole. Allow to dry.





Directions

1. Transfer the strawberry pattern to the board using graphite paper.


- 2. Using chippy brush, paint 1 light coat of White over the entire board, avoiding the strawberry area. Don't aim for solid coverage; you want the wood grain to show through. Allow to dry.
- 3. Transfer the lettering and arrow to the board using graphite paper.
- 4. Paint the strawberry Red. It may take a few coats to achieve sold coverage.
- 5. Paint the berry stem Grass Green.
- 6. To create details on the strawberry, stamp Red and White on the berry with a packing peanut. Start by dipping the end of the packing peanut in white, dabbing it off slightly on paper towel, and then dabbing on strawberry. Add highlights around the edge of the berry and near stem. To soften the White, dab in the Red paint and blend with the painted White details.
- 7. Using a small brush, paint the lettering and arrow Black. Allow to dry.



Red, Green, Bright Blue, Dark Blue, Dark Brown, Light Gray, Dark Gray

Directions

- 1. Roll a 10" x 12" clay slab, 1/4" thick.
- 2. Using a skewer, trace the outline of the bottle onto the clay. Reposition the pattern and trace the sailboat pieces by pressing into the pattern with the skewer. Cut out all the pieces.
- 3. Use a straw to make holes needed to hang when finished. Smooth all edges.
- 4. Score and attach the sailboat pieces to the boat.
- 5. Allow the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 6. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 7. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 8. Once fired, add twine for hanging.
