ADVENTURE AWAITS

Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe charger

Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Golden Yellow, Light Orange, Dark Orange, Red, Maroon, Dark Blue, Medium Blue, Bright Blue, Medium Brown, Medium Green, Dark Green, Bright Yellow

Writer bottle in Dark Brown, Black

Directions


- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque. (Don't trace the tree or the tent yet.)
- 2. Starting in the middle, create the sky layers with 3 coats of each color, beginning with Golden Yellow, then Light Orange, Dark Orange, Red, and Maroon.
- 3. For the water, start below the sun and paint 3 coats of Dark Blue, followed by 3 coats each of Medium Blue, then Bright Blue.
- 4. For the ground, paint 3 coats of Medium Brown, followed by 3 coats of Medium Green for the grass. Let dry.
- 5. Reposition the tissue tracing and transfer the tent, tree, and finger/thumb lines.
- 6. Paint the tent with 2 coats of Dark Green.
- 7. Using a Dark Brown writer bottle, create the tree.
- 8. Using a Black writer bottle, fill in the tent opening, outline the tent, outline the finger and thumb shape, and outline the entire hand shape. Let dry.
- 9. Using Bright Yellow, paint the background with messy brushstrokes, leaving a small space around the outer edge of the design. Let dry.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

BRING ON THE CAKE

Pottery Painting Project

NOTE: This project is painted with a watercolor technique. Before beginning, water down each color using a 1:1 ratio of paint and water. The watercolor effect is best achieved by dipping brush in the paint mixture and dabbing the brush on the bisque. Layering the paint mixture will help build dimension.

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe square charger

Pattern Tissue paper Sharpie Water

Small and medium round brushes
Small and medium liner brushes

Glaze Colors

Light Yellow, Salmon Pink, Bright Green, Berry Purple, Coral, Mint Green, Teal Blue, Black

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Starting with the top layer of the cake, dab Light Yellow along the top and sides of the layer. Leave some of the bisque showing on this layer. To create dimension, layer multiple coats here and there.
- 3. On the striped layer, alternate Salmon Pink, Bright Green, and Berry Purple. Do not aim for solid coverage, but no bare bisque is left unpainted.
- 4. Paint the scalloped layer with 3 coats of Coral.
- 5. Paint the area just under the scallops with 3 coats of Light Yellow.
- 6. Paint the top row of triangles with 2–3 coats of Bright Green.
- 7. Pain the bottom row of triangles 2with –3 coats of Salmon Pink.
- 8. Paint the diamonds with 2-3 coats of Mint Green.
- 9. Paint the cake stand with 3 coats of Teal Blue.
- 10. Paint the candles with all the colors except Yellow. Dab in flames with Yellow above the candles.
- 11. Using a small liner brush, and slightly watered-down Black, outline the candles, cake layers, and cake stand.
- 12. Dip a small brush into one of the colors and lightly splatter paint the entire plate. Repeat with 2 or 3 other colors. Let dry.
- 13. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



DAD'S GRILL NECESSITIES

Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Square Coupe Dinner Plate

Pattern Tissue Paper Sharpie ¼" tape

White school eraser Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Yellow, White, Red, Blue, Gray, Black, Dark Brown, Medium Brown Writer bottle in Black, White

Directions

- 1. Divide the plate into 4 equal sections and tape across the middle horizontally and vertically with 1/4" tape. Within each taped-off square, create evenly spaced vertical stripes with the tape.
- 2. Paint the background with 2 coats of Yellow using messy, random brushstrokes.
- 3. Remove the tape. Let dry.
- 4. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 5. Using a white school eraser, gently remove the Yellow areas that are inside the designs.
- 6. Paint the inside of the SOLO cup with 2 coats of White. Paint the outside of the cup with 3 coats of Red.
- 7. Paint the utensil handles with 2–3 coats of Blue. Paint the top of the utensils with 2 coats of Gray.
- 8. Paint the apron with 3 coats of Blue. Make the neck strap and ties with a Black writer bottle. Use a White writer bottle to write GRILL MASTER and outline the pocket on the front of the apron.
- 9. Paint the grill base with 3 coats of Red. Paint the grill top with 3 coats of Gray. Paint the burger with 2 coats of Dark Brown and the hotdog with 2 coats of Medium Brown. Use a tiny brush to add Dark Brown lines on the hotdog for grill marks. Add the legs and handle of the grill with a Black writer bottle.
- 10. Using the Black writer bottle, outline all of the images with broken, uneven lines. Add sketchy lines to the white stripes down and across the very middle of the plate. Let dry.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Tissue paper
Pencil

Glaze Colors

Pale Blue, Medium Blue, Light Brown Writer bottle in Dark Brown, Black

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Paint 3 coats of Pale Blue on the large circular shadow.
- 3. Paint 3 coats of Medium Blue on the 2 small shadow circles.
- 4. Paint the cookie with 3 coats of Light Brown.
- 5. Paint the straw in the milk carton with 2 coats of Pale Blue and Medium Blue in alternating stripes.
- 6. With a Black writer bottle, fill in the spots on the milk carton, and outline the carton, straw, and cow. (The white areas of the carton are unpainted bisque.)
- 7. Fill in the letters with the Black writer bottle and add heart-shaped chocolate chips to the cookie.
- 8. Using the back end of a large paintbrush, make large dots around the edge of plate in Medium Blue. Make the small dots with the back end of a small paintbrush in Pale Blue. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Bisque: Coupe charger Pattern printed on copy paper

Scissors Sponge Marker Small cup Water Dish soap Drinking straw

Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Pale Blue, Bright Blue, Deep Coral, Dark Blue, Teal Blue Writer bottle in Deep Coral, Dark Blue, Deep Blue, Teal Blue, White

Directions


- 1. Cut out the fish and starfish from the printed pattern.
- 2. Sponge the plate with 1 even coat of Pale Blue.
- 3. Dip the pattern cutouts in water and apply to the plate following the pattern. To ensure they stick, lightly sponge coat the paper edges with Pale Blue.
- 4. For the bubbles: In small cup, mix 2 parts Bright Blue to 1 part water and add 2 quick squirts of dish soap. Mix with a straw and begin to blow bubbles to ensure mixture is correct. Blow until the bubbles overflow the cup and land on the plate. (Be careful not to tip the cup and spill the mixture onto the plate.) Cover the entire plate with bubbles. Once bubbles have popped completely, remove the paper cutouts.
- 5. Paint the starfish with 2 coats of Deep Coral. Once dry, use a White writer bottle to outline the starfish and add dots.
- 6. Use the writer bottles to complete the fish details, varying lines, squiggles, and dots as desired for the eyes, body, and tails. Let dry.
- 7. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Glaze Colors

Pale Yellow, Bright Blue, Dark Teal Blue, Light Gray, Dark Gray, Taupe, Black, Bright Green, Medium Green

Writer bottle in Black

Directions


- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque. (The tree branches do not need to be traced.)
- 2. Using the tissue paper, trace the koala silhouette and leaves (3 small, 7 medium, and 4 large leaves) onto contact paper and cut out.
- 3. Apply the contact paper cutouts on top of the traced pattern.
- 4. Paint the moon with 2 coats of Pale Yellow.
- 5. Paint the background sky with 2–3 coats of Bright Blue.
- 6. Paint the trees with 2 coats of Dark Teal Blue. Add small branches with simple brushstrokes.
- 7. Remove the contact paper cutouts.
- 8. Paint Momma Koala with 2–3 coats of Light Gray on the body and 2 coats of Taupe on the belly.
- 9. Paint Baby Koala with 2-3 coats of Dark Gray.
- 10. Paint the inside of the ears on both koalas with 2–3 coats of Bright Blue. Fill in the noses and ears with a Black writer bottle.
- 11. In no particular order, paint the leaves with 2–3 coats of Bright Green or Medium Green.
- 12. With the Black writer bottle, outline the koalas and leaves, keeping the lines thin, uneven, and sketchy. Let dry.
- 13. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



PAW PALS

Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Large mug
Pattern
Tissue paper
Sharpie
Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Taupe, White, Light Orange, Dark Orange, Light Pink, Gray, Black, Medium Brown, Dark Brown, Light Blue, Dark Blue, Light Gray

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the mug and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque. *Note: Be sure the designs extend to the bottom edge of the mug.*
- 2. Orange Paw: Paint the paw pads with 2 coats of Taupe and the arm part with 2 coats of White. Just around the edge of the paw pads, paint a thin line with 2 coats of Light Orange. Paint the outer edge with 2 coats of Dark Orange.
- 3. Black Paw: Paint the paw pads with 2 coats of Light Pink. Mix Gray with 2–3 drops of Black to create Charcoal Gray and use this to paint 2 coats of a thin line around the paw pads and the inside of the arm part. Paint the outside of the paw with 2 coats of Black.
- 4. Brown Paw: Paint the paw pads with 2 coats of Black. Paint a thin line around the paw pads and the bottom of the arm with 2 coats of Medium Brown. Paint the top of the paw down to the middle of the arm with 2 coats of Dark Brown, ending with a jagged line where the Dark Brown overlaps the Medium Brown.
- 5. Blue Paw: Paint the paw pads with 2 coats of Light Pink. Paint the inside of the arm part and a thin line around the paw pads with 2 coats of Light Blue. Paint the outside of the paw with 2 coats of Dark Blue.
- 6. Gray Paw: Paint the paw pads with 2 coats of Dark Gray. Paint the paw and arm part with 2 coats of Light Gray. Add some spots with 1 coat of Black. Let dry.
- 7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.



Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Colors

Orange, Bright Blue, Yellow, Salmon, Lime Green, Red, Mint Green, Berry Purple, Light Teal Writer bottle in Black

Directions


- 1. Use the tape to separate the plate into 9 sections.
- 2. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque. (Do not trace the lettering in the center square yet.)
- 3. Place the tissue tracing on the contact paper and trace the silhouettes of the dogs. Cut them out and adhere them over the traced pattern shapes. (The center square will not have a contact paper cutout.)
- 4. Paint each section with 3 coats of a particular color.
- 5. Remove the contact paper and tape. Let dry.
- 6. Reposition the tissue tracing on the plate and trace the lettering in the middle square.
- 7. Use a Black writer bottle to outline the pups, fill in any solid areas of designs, and create the lettering in the center square. Let dry.
- 8. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

RACCOON MASK MUG

Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Large mug

Pattern Pencil

Sharpie marker
Contact paper
Copy paper
Sponge
Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Dark Gray, Light Gray, Black, Teal Writer bottle in Black, White

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the mug with the eyes near the handle and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Trace the eyes onto contact paper and cut out. Place the eye stickers over the ones traced on the mug.
- 3. Trace the pattern onto copy paper. Cut out the mask and ears, and cut out the separate tail pieces, keeping them in order.
- 4. Sponge the entire mug with1 coat of Dark Gray. Sponge a coat of Light Gray over the base coat, covering some areas more heavily than others. If the original traced design does not show up well, touch up with the Sharpie before going to next step.
- 5. Paint the paper mask cutout with a heavy coat of Black. Place the mask cutout over the eyes with the painted side against the mug, smoothing out the bubbles and pressing onto the bisque. Once the mask is completely adhered to the mug, peel off the cutout.
- 6. Working on one piece at a time, paint each of the copy paper cutouts for the ears and tail stripes with a heavy coat of Black and press onto the corresponding place around the mug and handle.
- 7. Remove the contact paper eyes and paint the eyes with 3 coats of Teal.
- 8. Outline everything with a Black writer bottle.
- 9. Add dots to the eyes with White writer bottle. Let dry.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



SCOOP A DAY ICE CREAM MUG

Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Large Mug

Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Contact paper

½" tape

Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Light Pink, Tan, Light Tan, Mint Green, Red, Dark Brown Writer bottle in Dark Mint Green

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the ice cream scoop onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto contact paper and retrace the design with a Sharpie. Cut out the shape and adhere in the middle on one side of the mug.
- 2. Wrap a piece of ½" tape around the bottom of the mug, slightly overlapping the bottom of the ice cream scoop shape.
- 3. Paint the mug from the tape line up with 1–2 coats of Light Pink, using messy brushstrokes.
- 4. Remove the tape but leave the contact paper.
- 5. For the cone, paint 2–4 coats of Tan. Once dry, use a liner brush to make X lines with 1 coat of Light Tan.
- 6. Remove contact paper. Paint the scoop shape with 3 coats of Mint Green.
- 7. Paint the cherry on top of the scoop with 3 coats of Red.
- 8. Add some water to Dark Brown and use a round brush with this mixture to make drip "chocolate" drips around the top of the mug.
- 9. Paint the inside of the mug with 3 coats of Dark Brown.
- 10. Outline the scoop shape with Dark Mint Green in a writer bottle. Let dry.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



NOTE: Other ball shapes (soccer, volleyball, golf ball, etc.) can easily be substituted. Trace patterns and paint accordingly.

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe charger

Pattern Tissue paper Sharpie ¼" tape

Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Brown, Orange, Black Writer bottles in Black, Red, Dark Blue

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Place ¼" tape over the football laces. The center laces may require 2 pieces of tape to achieve a thicker lace. Paint the football with 3 coats of Brown. Once dry, remove the tape.
- 3. Paint the basketball with 3 coats of Orange. Once dry, use a Black writer bottle to add the lines to the basketball.
- 4. Using a Red writer bottle, add the lace lines to the baseball.
- 5. Add the lettering with a Dark Blue writer bottle. Let dry.
- 6. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Coral, Orange, Yellow, Teal Green, White Writer bottles in Orange, Yellow, Coral, Teal Green, White

Directions


- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Tape off the sections in between the sun rays, and tape off the line separating the bottom third of the plate where the lettering will go.
- 3. For the sun rays: Starting from the left, paint 2–3 coats of each color in this order: Coral, Orange, Yellow, Coral, Teal Green, Yellow, and Orange. Be sure to only paint up to the arc of the sun, according to the pattern. Once dry, remove the tape between the rays.
- 4. For the sun: Paint the sun with 3 coats of Yellow. Once dry, remove the tape from the bottom line.
- 5. Using the writer bottles in the corresponding order according to the sample, fill in the SUNSHINE letters. Use a Teal Green writer bottle to create the ON MY MIND lettering.
- 6. Outline the inner rays with a White writer bottle. Let dry.
- 7. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

4TH OWL JULY HANDPRINT HANGER

Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog

Wooden skewer

Pattern

Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide

Round brushes in assorted sizes

Glue

Drinking straw

Fun wire

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Red, White, Blue, Orange Black writer bottle

Directions

- 1. Roll out a 12"x6" clay slab, $\frac{1}{4} \frac{1}{2}$ " thick.
- 2. Using a skewer, trace the outline of the owl onto the clay slab. Trace the eyes, the beak, and the star separately onto the slab. Remove the pattern and cut out all the pieces on the traced lines. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Place handprint on clay, starting with the fingertips close to the "feet" of the owl and the palm in the center of the owl.
- 4. Use a straw to make two holes near the top for hanging wire to be added later.
- 5. Allow to dry thoroughly.
- 6. If using glazes, paint each piece separately and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 7. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 8. When complete, attach the eyes, beak, and star to the body with glue.
- 9. Add a fun wire loop for hanging.

SEASHELL ME SHELL MOBILE

Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Wooden skewer
Pattern
Drinking straw
Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Twine

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Shades of Blue, Teal, Green

Directions

- 1. Roll out a 10"x8" clay slab, $\frac{1}{4} \frac{1}{2}$ " thick.
- 2. Using a skewer, trace the outline of the large shell, 2 sand dollars, and 3 shells onto the clay. Remove the pattern and cut out on the traced lines. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Place fingertips at the rounded edge of the large shell with palm along the flat edge of the shell. Press down for imprint.
- 4. Use finger to make 5 print impressions on each sand dollar.
- 5. Use first 3 fingers to make print impressions in the center of each small shell.
- 6. Use a straw to make holes for attaching the shells and sand dollar to the handprint shell. Be sure to add a hole at the top of the big shell if you want to hang the whole creation later.
- 7. Allow to dry thoroughly.
- 8. If using glazes, paint each piece separately and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 9. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 10. After firing, string the pieces together with twine.



Clay Project

Supplies

Wooden skewer
Pattern
Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide
Round brushes in assorted sizes



Glaze Colors

Colors of choice

Directions

1. Roll out an 8"x4" clay slab, $\frac{1}{4}-\frac{1}{2}"$ thick.

Low-fire white clay with light grog

- 2. Using a wooden skewer, trace the outline of the popsicle onto the clay. Remove the pattern and cut out on the traced lines. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Cut along the slit line at the bottom of the cutout.
- 4. Turn up the edges of the clay cutout to form a rim. Shape with hands to form a curve along the top.
- 5. Fold the cut edge and in into the center of the shape. Leave ½" space between the two folded edges to allow the popsicle stick to rest on the remaining base. Shape the remaining flat base piece as shown.
- 6. Allow to dry thoroughly.
- 7. Fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.

Directions

- 1. Using graphite paper, trace the pattern onto the canvas.
- 2. Paint the background Yellow.
- 3. Paint the watermelon Red. Keep the brushstrokes in a curved pattern following the shape of the rind, and don't aim for completely solid coverage.
- 4. Paint the watermelon rind Medium Green. Add plaid details to the rind in Light Green.
- 5. Paint the ant body, legs, and antennae Black.
- 6. Paint the seeds Black.
- 7. Paint the ant face details White.



STRIKE A POSE

Canvas Painting Project

This project can easily be adapted to pottery painting.

Supplies

11"x14" canvas
Graphite paper
Pencil
Assorted square (large and medium) brushes and small liner brush

Acrylic Paint Colors

Sky Blue, White, Tan, Brown, Black, Green, Pink

Directions

- 1. Using graphite paper, trace the pattern onto the canvas.
- 2. Paint the background Sky Blue around the perimeter, working the color around the skunk and stump to about ½" from the canvas edge. Add some White to the same brush and blend from where the Sky Blue ends to the edge of the canvas.
- 3. Paint the center of the stump Tan. Paint the outer (bark) edge of the stump Brown. Use curved brushstrokes in Tan to create bark dimension on the outer edge of the stump.
- 4. Paint the skunk's inner fur and outer tail White. Paint the rest of the skunk Black.
- 5. Using Green, paint short upward strokes from the bottom of the canvas to create grass blades. Paint in the missing areas below the stump to fill in the grass.
- 6. With a small brush, paint the eyes and lashes White.
- 7. Paint the nose and inner ears Pink.

- 4. Paint the ice cream/sun Yellow.
- 5. Using a small brush with Brown, paint the palm tree trunk and the plaid design on the cone/sand.
- 6. Paint the clouds in the ice cream/sun White.
- 7. Paint the palm fronds Green.
- 8. Paint the crab with a base coat of White. Once dry, paint the crab Red. Using small brush, add the crab face details with White.



SWEET LIBERTY

Board Art Painting Project

Supplies

14"x14" staggered wood pallet

1" tape

Baby wipe

Pattern

Graphite paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes

Acrylic Colors

Navy Blue, White, Red

Directions


- 1. Tape off the "ribbon" area along the left and bottom edges of the board.
- 2. Dip a baby wipe in Navy Blue and wipe over the board surface and edges.
- 3. Using graphite paper, trace the outline of the USA pattern. (Do not trace the stars and letters yet.) Paint in the design with White.
- 4. Remove the tape and paint the area that was masked Red. Allow to dry.
- 5. Dip the back end of a paint brush in White and add dots on the red ribbon.
- 6. Reposition the pattern and trace the quote and stars in the middle of the USA area using graphite paper. Using a small brush, paint the quote and starts Navy Blue.

VINTAGE USA SAILS

Board Art Painting Project

Supplies

14"x14" wood pallet

Pattern

Graphite paper

Pencil

Small star stickers (optional)

1" tape

Water

Small bowl

Assorted brushes

Chippy craft brush

Acrylic Colors

Navy Blue, Red, White, Brown

Directions

- 1. Trace the boat design onto the board using graphite paper.
- 2. If using the small star stickers, place them randomly on the left set of sails.
- 3. Use the tape to create strips on the right sail.
- 4. Paint the left sails with a solid coverage of Navy Blue.
- 5. Paint the untaped areas on the right sails with a solid coverage of Red. Peel off the tape and paint the exposed areas with a wash of White.
- 6. Paint the top area of the boat with semi-solid coverage of White. Paint the bottom section of the boat with a solid coverage of Navy Blue.
- 7. To give a vintage look, in small bowl, thoroughly mix 3 parts water to 1 part of Brown. Using a chippy craft brush, paint across the board, including over the boat, with a light coat, leaving small areas of unpainted wood showing in the background to give distressed look.
