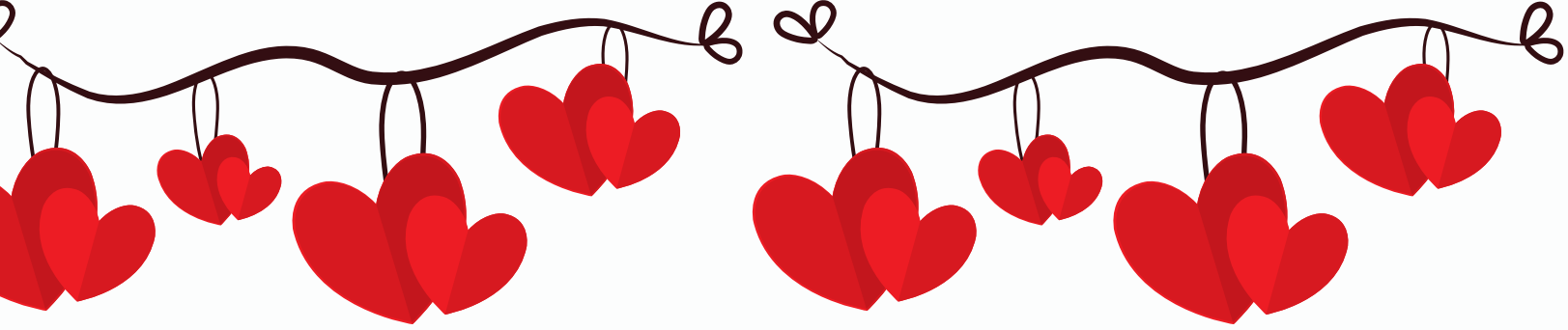

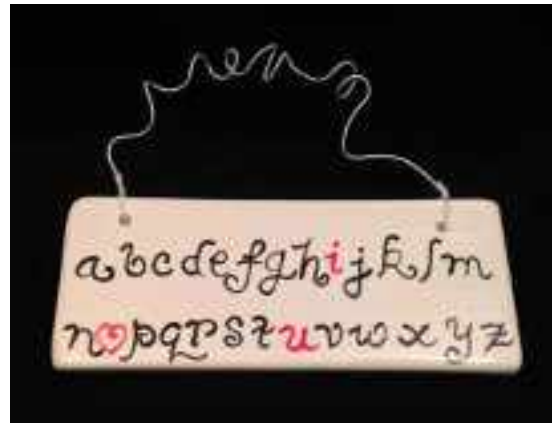
"i ♥ u" Plaque Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Rectangular plaque
Pattern printed on clay carbon paper
Pencil
Fan brush
Long liner brush or writer bottle
Fun wire and beads (optional)

Glaze Colors

White, Black, Red



Directions

1. Paint the front of the plaque with 3 coats of White. Allow to dry.
2. Transfer the alphabet pattern to the front of the plaque.
3. Using a liner brush or a writer bottle filled with Black or Red, paint the letters according to the painting guide. (Turn the O into a heart by elongating the bottom tip.) Allow to dry.
4. Paint 3 coats of White on the back of the plaque. Allow to dry.
5. Glaze and fire to cone 06. (If you are certain the painter has applied 3 coats over the entire piece you can omit the clear glaze.)
6. If desired, string beads on Fun Wire to create a hanger for the plaque.

“LOVE” Plaque Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: LOVE 3D wall plaque
Lettering pattern printed on plain paper
Fan brush
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Splatter brush
Writer bottle



Glaze Colors

Red, Dark Pink, Medium Pink, Light Pink, Black, White

Directions

1. This plaque features an ombre effect, going across the plaque horizontally from Bright Red to Light Pink (from base to top). Using a fully loaded fan brush for each color, try to blend the colors seamlessly as you paint across the plaque. The aim is to apply 2–3 coats of each color evenly. Make sure to apply color to the bottom and sides of the plaque as well as the front. Use small round brushes to get into the nooks and crannies of the 3D plaque. Allow to dry.
2. Using the splatter brush, lightly splatter Black onto the plaque. Allow to dry.
3. With the lettering pattern and picture of the finished project as a guide, use a writer bottle filled with White to write out the quote following the curve of the plaque letters. Allow to dry.
4. Glaze and fire to cone 06. (If you are certain the painter has applied 3 coats over the entire piece you can omit the clear glaze.)

“Love’s True Colors” Vase Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Tall square vase
Pattern printed clay carbon paper
Pencil
Fan brush
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Writer bottle

Glaze Colors

White, Red, Orange, Yellow, Bright Green, Bright Blue, Pink, Black

Directions

1. Paint 3 coats of White on all four sides of the vase. Allow to dry.
2. Transfer the heart pattern to 3 sides of the vase.
3. Using round brushes, paint the hearts following the finished sample as a guide. Allow to dry.
4. On the fourth side, use a large round brush to make 7 horizontal swipes of alternating colors from top to bottom. Allow to dry.
5. Transfer the lettering pattern to the swipes of color.
6. Fill a writer bottle with Black and paint the letters. Allow to dry.
7. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

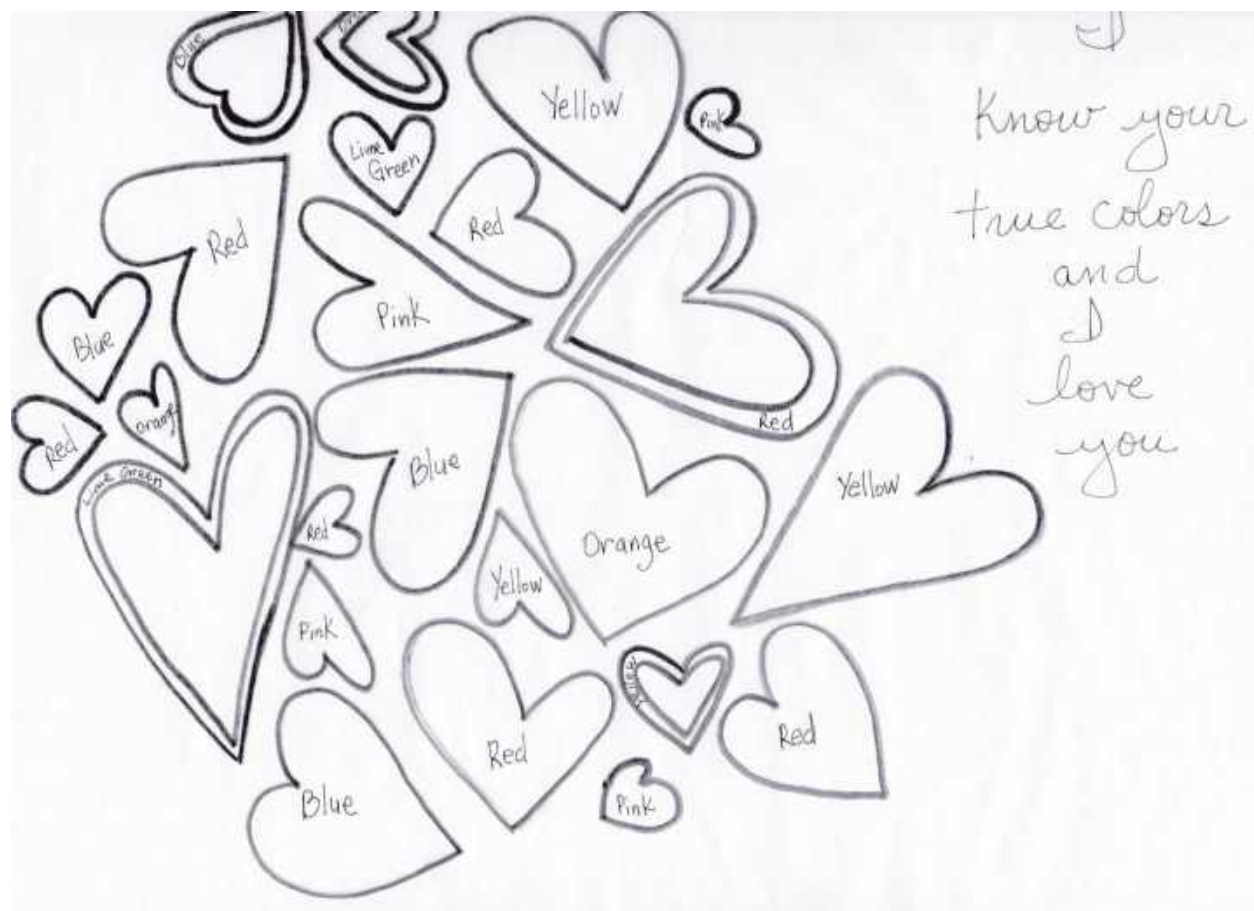

“you & me” Plate Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Round or square coupe plate
Pattern printed on plain paper
Pattern printed on clay carbon paper
Scissors
Pencil
Fan brush
Writer bottles

Glaze Colors

White, Black, Red



Directions

1. Cut out the ampersand from the plain paper pattern.
2. Using a fan brush, paint 3 coats of White on the front of the plate. Allow to dry.
3. While still slightly wet, center the cut-out ampersand on the plate. Seal the edges of the paper with a damp brush.
4. Paint 3 coats of Black on the front of the plate. Allow dry, then remove the paper pattern.
5. Transfer the lettering pattern to the upper left and lower right of the ampersand.
6. Using a writer bottle filled with Red, paint the letters and the hearts in the ampersand. Use the picture of the finished project as a guide. Allow to dry.
7. Paint 3 coats of Black on the back of the plate. Allow to dry.
8. Glaze and fire to cone 06. (If you are certain the painter has applied 3 coats over the entire piece you can omit the clear glaze.)

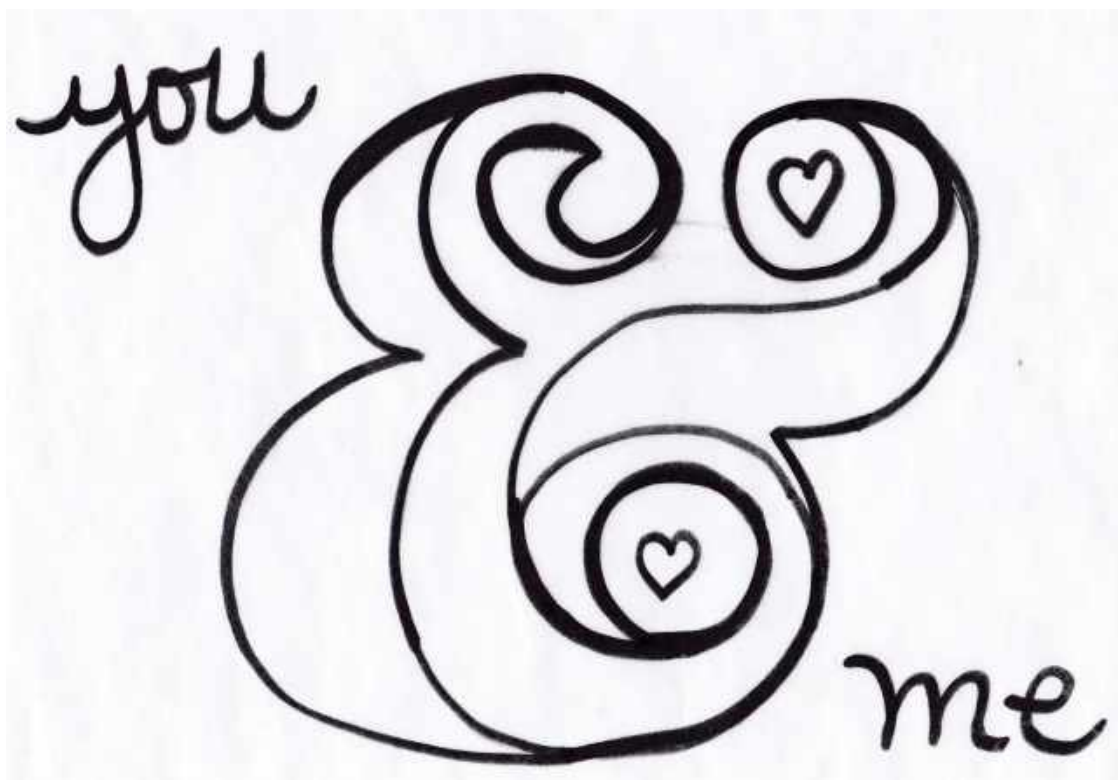

Key to My Heart Dish Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire clay with light grog
Foam work mat
2 Chiné salad-size paper plates
Picture of finished project to use as painting guide
Wooden skewer
Toothbrush or other scoring tool
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Words printed on plain paper
Ink pads in distressed brown and black
Decoupage medium



Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Tan, Yellow Gold

Directions

1. Cut off enough clay to form a softball-sized ball. Roll, pat, and squeeze the clay between cupped hands to make a lumpy ball.
2. Throw ball onto the foam mat. Using the sides of your fists, pound the clay ball into a $\frac{1}{4}$ " slab.
3. With the pointy end of the skewer, cut out a $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
4. Gather the excess clay from around the cutout shape and form it into a ball. Set aside.
5. With wet fingertips, smooth the edges of the clay.
6. Place the clay square in the center of one of the paper plates. Press the other plate on top of the clay square so it causes the four corners of the square to curve up slightly. Remove the top plate.
7. Pinch off a piece of clay from the clay ball you set aside. Pull, roll, and pinch it into the shape of a key using the pattern as a guide.
8. Score the back of the key and press it onto the left side of the plate.
9. Allow to dry to a leather-hard stage. This may take 24–72 hours.
10. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
11. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
12. Cut the words out of paper. Run the 4 edges of each word paper across the ink pads to stain the edges.
13. Arrange the papers to read "You hold the key to my heart" on the right side of the key. Apply a light coat of decoupage medium to secure them to the dish.

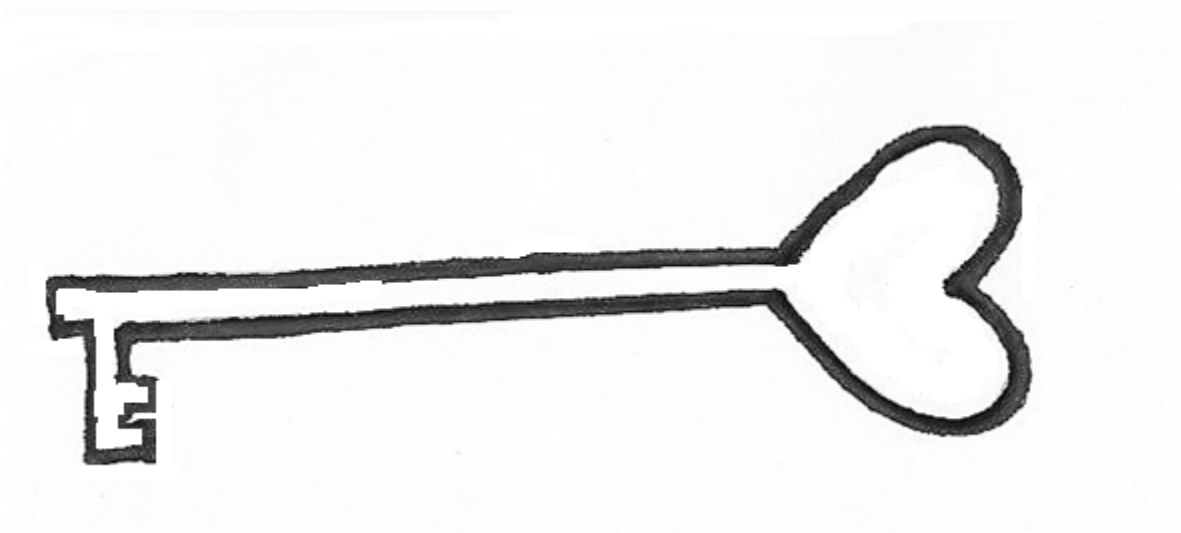

Supplies

Low-fire clay with light grog
Foam work mat
Pattern cut out from cardboard
Mini heart cookie cutter
Picture of finished project to use as painting guide
Wooden skewer
Toothbrush or other scoring tool
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Splatter brush



Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Bright Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue

Directions

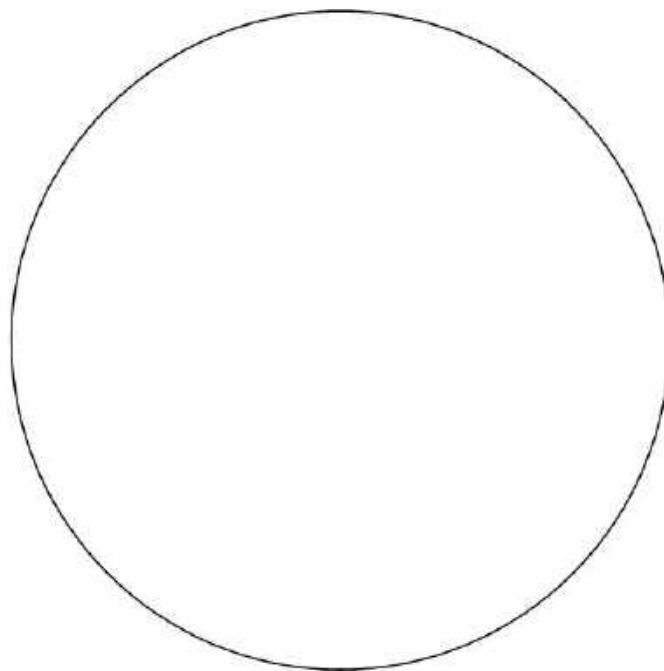
1. Cut off enough clay to form a softball-sized ball. Roll, pat, and squeeze the clay between cupped hands to make a lumpy ball.
2. Throw ball onto the foam mat. Using the sides of your fists, pound the clay ball into a ¼" slab.
3. Place the patterns on the clay slab. With the pointy end of the skewer, trace around the shapes to cut them out.
4. Gather the excess clay from around the cutout shapes and form it into a ball. Set aside.
5. With wet fingertips, smooth the edges of the clay.
6. With the cookie cutter, cut out several heart shapes all over the rectangle of clay. Don't make the cutouts too close together or too close to the top or bottom edge.
7. Bring the 2 short ends of the rectangle together to form a short cylinder and check to be sure it's the right size to wrap around the outside edge of the clay circle. Make adjustments accordingly.
8. Score the outside edge of the circle. Wrap the rectangle around the circle and press together.
9. Pinch off some clay from the clay ball and roll a long coil.
10. Score and press together, and then smooth the long coil along the inside seam of the circle base and upright cylinder of clay.
11. Allow to dry to a leather-hard stage. This may take 24–72 hours.
12. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06. Use the splatter brush to add interest when painting.
13. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.

"You Hold the Key to My Heart" **Canvas Painting Project**

Supplies

Canvas: 8"x10"

Pattern

Graphite paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes

Bubble Wrap

Heart stamps

Decoupage medium (optional)



Acrylic Paint Colors

Deep Red, Venetian Red, Burnt Sienna, Gold, Black

Directions

1. Using a square brush with long strokes, paint the whole canvas Deep Red, allowing some areas to be lighter than others.
2. Load the brush with Venetian Red and paint over the lighter areas.
3. Paint the corners and along the upper and lower edges Burnt Sienna. Allow to dry.
4. Position the pattern on the canvas with the graphite paper underneath. Trace the pattern onto the canvas.
5. Using either a long liner brush or small round brush, paint the letters Black.
6. Paint the key Gold.
7. Lightly outline the key in Black, smudging the lines slightly.
8. Apply Gold paint to a piece of bubble wrap and press it onto the corners of the canvas.
9. Use the heart stamps to stamp Black hearts randomly around the canvas. Allow to dry.
10. If desired, apply a coat of decoupage medium to the whole canvas for a high-gloss finish.

Donut Box Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Round box with lid
Patterns printed on clay carbon paper
Pen or pencil
Picture of finished project to use as a painting guide
Assorted brushes (fan brush, round brushes, long liner brush)

Underglaze or Glaze Colors

White, Light Golden Brown, Pink, Red, Black, Yellow, Blue, Dark Brown



Directions

1. Paint 2–3 coats of White over the entire box, both inside and outside. Allow to dry.
2. Transfer the donut pattern to the lid and sides, and lettering to the inside.
3. Using the picture of the finished project as a guide, paint 2–3 coats of color to each of the design elements: Light Golden Brown for the donuts; Pink or Dark Brown for the frosting; Pink, Red, Yellow, Blue, and Dark Brown for the sprinkles; and Black for the lettering inside the box. Allow to dry.
4. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Foam work mat
Rolling pin
Wooden skewer
Scoring tool
Plastic straw
Pattern of heart cut out of cardboard
Texture tool/stamp
Picture of finished project to use as sculpting and painting guide
Round brushes in assorted sizes
Fun Wire or twine

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Deep Red, Black



Directions

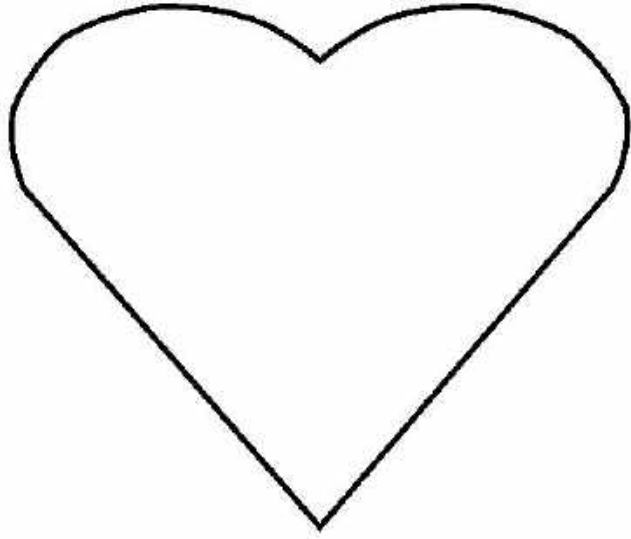
1. Roll out an 8"x8" slab of clay, ¼" thick.
2. Place the cardboard pattern on the clay slab. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, trace around the pattern and cut it out twice. Ball up the remaining clay and set it aside.
3. With a plastic straw, poke 2 holes along the top edge of one heart for hanging.
4. Press the texture tool or stamp on the clay heart that doesn't have the holes.
5. Score the back and side edges of the textured heart and the top and side edges of the heart with the holes.
6. Place a small wad of crumpled newspaper in the center of the heart with the holes.
7. Place the textured heart on top of the other heart. Press the sides together, making sure to keep the top of the pocket open.
8. Use dampened fingertips to smooth out the edges of the stacked heart shapes.
9. Allow clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
10. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
11. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
12. After firing and painting, loop a length of Fun Wire or twine through the 2 holes to create a hanger.

Tree Stump Bud Vase Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Foam work mat
Rolling pin
Wooden skewer
Scoring tool
Picture of finished project to use as sculpting and painting guide
Round brushes in assorted sizes

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Brown, Black

Directions

1. Roll out a 6"x6" slab of clay, ¼" thick.
2. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, cut out a 4"x6" rectangle, leaving the top of the rectangle jagged and uneven.
3. Bring the 2 short ends together, score the sides, and press together to form a hollow tube.
4. Stand the clay tube with the smooth, straight end on the remaining clay slab and trace around it.
5. Score the bottom of the tube and the top of the cut out circle. Join the 2 pieces. Use dampened fingertips to smooth out all the seams.
6. Run the end of the wooden skewer gently over the clay tube in vertical wavy lines to create a textured tree bark effect.
7. Allow clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
8. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
9. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.

In My Heart of Hearts Mixed Media Project

Supplies

Canvas: 9"x12"
2 sheets of newspaper or several book pages
Scissors
Pattern
Pencil
Scissors
Rubber stamp with swirly pattern
Large flat brush
Metal gear charms
Metal lock
Key charm
Glue
Decoupage medium

Acrylic Paint

Turquoise, Red, Violet, Metallic Gold



Directions

1. Wrap the canvas with a sheet of newsprint or book pages. Secure the paper to the canvas with decoupage medium. Allow to dry.
2. Paint the background Turquoise. Allow to dry.
3. Paint some newspaper or book pages in Red and in Violet. Allow to dry.
4. Transfer the heart pattern to the painted papers.
5. Cut out 8–10 of each size heart.
6. Arrange the different hearts on the canvas to form a large heart shape that stretches across the canvas. (You can keep it simple, not overlapping any hearts and keeping them all going in the same general direction, as in the example, or you can overlap and mix things up a bit!) Secure the hearts to the canvas with decoupage medium.
7. Stamp the swirly pattern around the large heart shape in Metallic Gold. Allow to dry.
8. Scatter the gears and lock around the large heart shape. Secure with pinpoints of glue.
9. Glue the key charm to the canvas outside the heart. Allow to dry.
10. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal all the papers. Allow to dry.

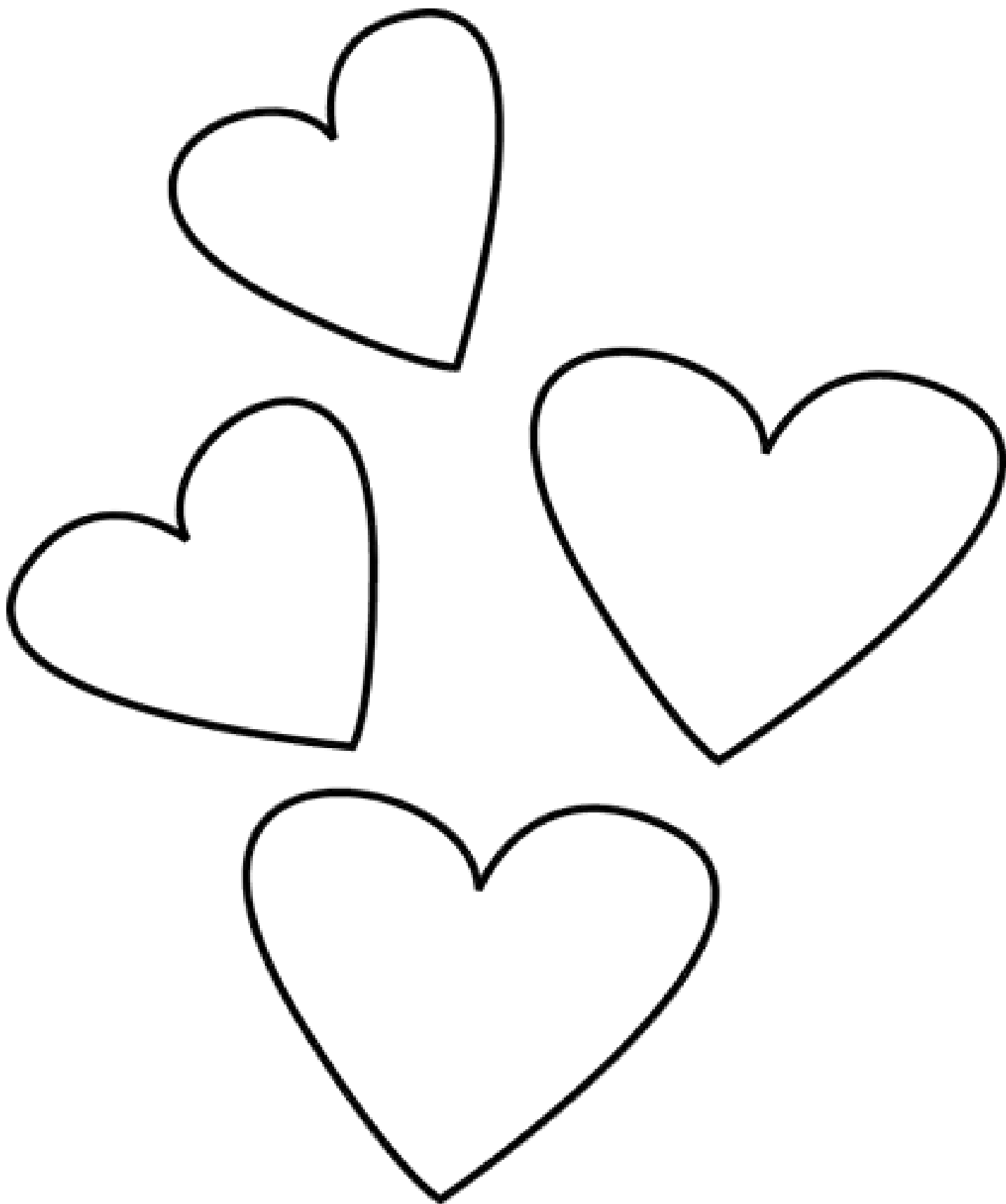

Green Clover Dish Fused Glass Project

Supplies: System 96 Spectrum Glass

Glass blank: 6" square

Design glass:

Assorted chips and bits: Dark Green, White

Rods: Green

Noodles: White, Green, Amber

Pebble: White

Stringer: Green

Scissors

Scoring tool

Running pliers

Nippers

Pattern printed on plain white paper

Picture of project to use as design guide

Sharpie marker (to mark cutting lines)

Alcohol (to clean off marker lines)

Glue

Thinfire paper

6" square plate or mold for slumping

Directions

1. Cut out the clover design from the pattern. Center it on the glass blank and trace around it with the marker.
2. Arrange chips and bits of Dark Green glass to fill in the entire clover shape.
3. Place a White pebble in the center of the clover.
4. Arrange 3 White noodles radiating out from the center of the clover. Place a Green stringer on top of each noodle.
5. Place a 1" square White chip at each corner.
6. Place a Green nip in the center of each White chip.
7. Place a Green noodle and an Amber noodle side by side along each of the four sides.
8. Affix each element with a pinpoint of glue.
9. Clean off the marker tracing lines.
10. Place the project on a piece of Thinfire paper.
11. Fire to a full fuse.
12. Place the fused project in a prepared slump mold or on a piece of Thinfire paper in the mold.
13. Fire for slumping.

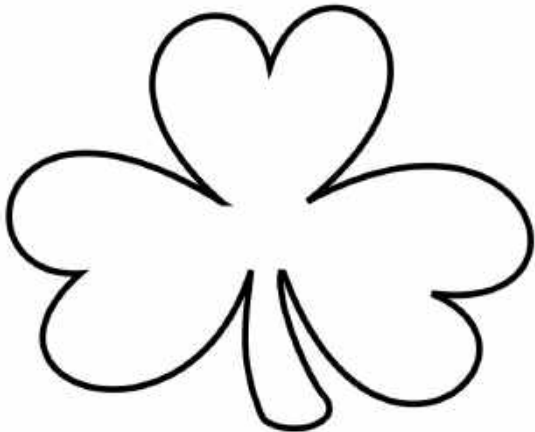

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Foam work mat
Rolling pin
Pattern
Scoring tool
Wooden skewer
Picture of finished project to use as sculpting and painting guide
Round brushes in assorted sizes

Acrylic Paint Colors

Black, Metallic Gold, Red, Orange, Yellow, Blue, Indigo, Violet

Directions

1. Form a pinch pot. Tap the open end to flare out the sides a bit.
2. Create 3 small round balls. Score the tops of each and attach them to the bottom of the pinch pot.
3. Roll out a small $\frac{1}{4}$ " slab of clay. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, cut out a half circle that will fit inside the opening of the pinch pot. Also cut 5–7 circles to create coins that will fit in the pot.
4. Allow all the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
5. Fire to cone 04, then paint with acrylics. Or paint with glazes and fire to cone 06.

CACT-US CHARGER Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe charger
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Black Sharpie or washable marker
Assorted brushes (fan, large round, small round, liner)

Glaze Colors

Pastel Orange, Coral, Pink, Pale Blue, Tan, Green, Light Green, Dark Green
Writer bottles in Black, White

Directions

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the lines with a marker (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design to the pottery.) Remove the tissue paper.
2. Dip a fan brush in water and then dip in Pastel Orange. Gently mix to create watercolor look. Start at the second section from the bottom of the plate and paint area in a wash. Slightly rinse the brush, dip in Coral, and paint the next section, slightly overlapping the Pastel Orange. Repeat technique using Pink in the next section, slightly overlapping the Coral. Repeat technique using Pale Blue in the top part of the plate, slightly overlapping the Pink.
3. Paint 3 coats of tan at the bottom of the plate for the sand.
4. Paint the large cactus with 3 coats of Green. Paint the small cactus with 3 coats of Light Green. Paint the cactus detail lines in Dark Green on both cacti.
5. Using a Black writer bottle, paint the faces and the lettering.
6. Remove the tip from a White writer bottle and squeeze paint in heart-shaped puddle. While this is still wet, add Pink to center of the puddle and swirl color to create a marbled look. Allow to dry.
7. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

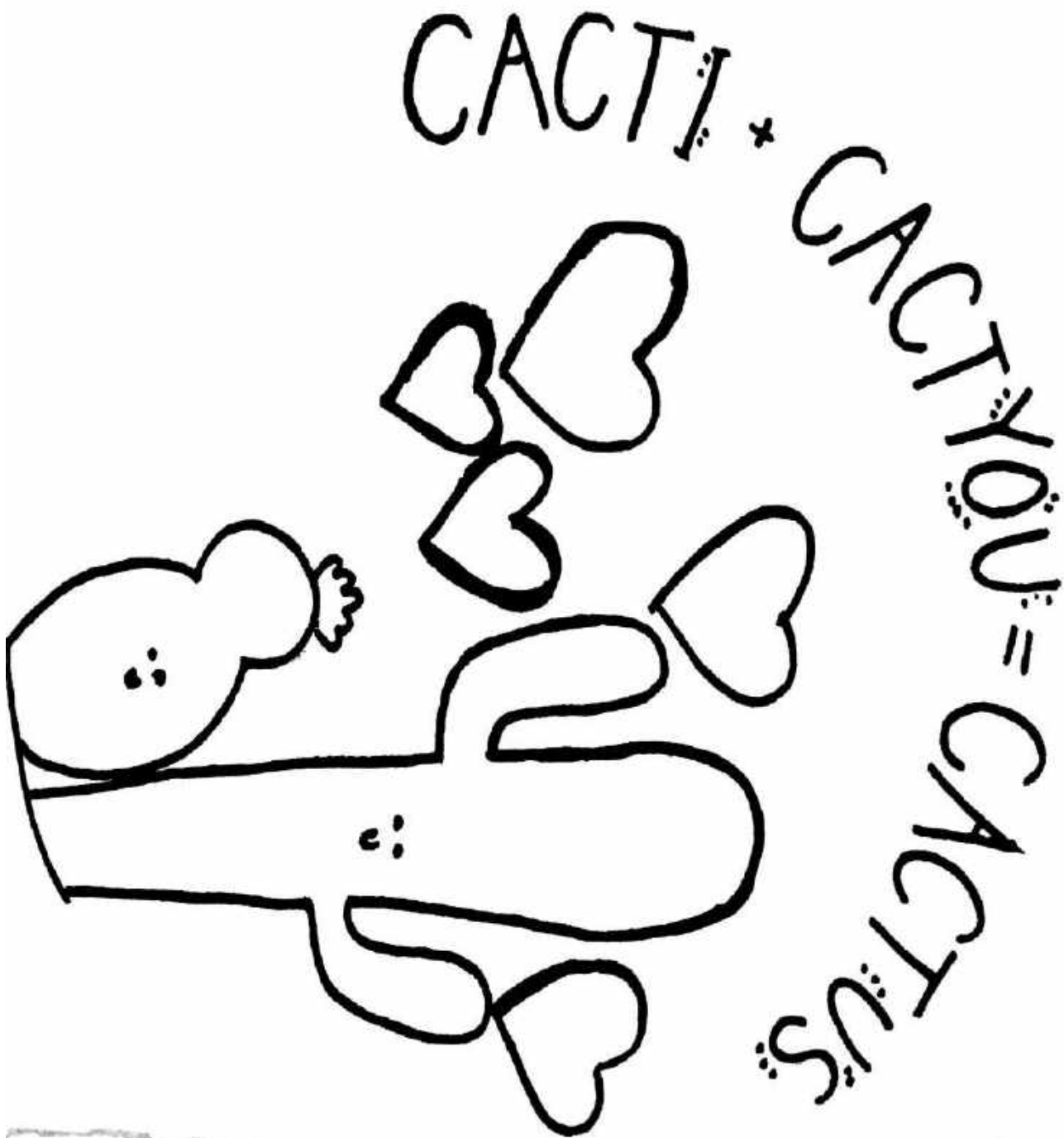

LOVE SNAPS PLATTER Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Square coupe charger
Tissue paper
Pattern
Black Sharpie or washable marker
Assorted Brushes (fan, large round, small round, liner)

Glaze Colors

Cream (or other skin tone), Red, Pink, Black, Tan
Writer bottles in Black, Red, Dark Gray



Directions

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the entire design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the lines with a marker (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design to the pottery.) Remove the tissue paper. Do not trace the letters onto the bisque yet.
2. Paint the hand with 3 coats of Cream or other skin tone.
3. Using a small brush, paint the hearts with 1 coat of Red or Pale Pink. Using a Black writer bottle, add 3 or 4 dots between hearts.
4. Using a medium brush, paint the sleeve with 3 coats of Black.
5. Using a Tan writer bottle, outline the hand and nails, and add knuckles. Allow to dry.
6. Reposition the tissue paper tracing over the painted design and trace the letters on the right edge of the sleeve. Use a Red writer bottle to fill in the letters.
7. Use a Dark Gray writer bottle to outline the sleeve and make the line for the cuff. Allow to dry.
8. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

LOVE YOU FOR ALL TIME PLATE Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Rectangular plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Black Sharpie or washable marker
Assorted brushes

Glaze Colors

Cream, Dark Blue, Light Teal, Dark Teal, Red
Writer bottles in White, Light Teal, Dark Teal, Red



Directions

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the lines with a marker (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design to the pottery.) Remove the tissue paper. Do not trace the lettering onto the bisque yet.
2. Paint the inside of the hourglass with 3 coats of Cream. Paint the top and base of the hourglass with 3 coats of Dark Blue.
3. Paint the heart-shape background with 3 coats of Light Teal.
4. Using a small brush, paint small hearts inside the hourglass with 3 coats of Dark Teal and Red.
5. Using a small brush, outline the Cream part of the hourglass in Dark Teal.
6. Using a Light Teal writer bottle, make various dots on the Navy Blue.
7. Reposition the tissue paper over the painted design and trace the lettering, Fill in the capital letters with White and use a Dark Teal writer bottle for the cursive words and for the small. Add small dots on White letters.
8. Add dashes around the outside edge of the heart with a Red writer bottle. Allow to dry.
9. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

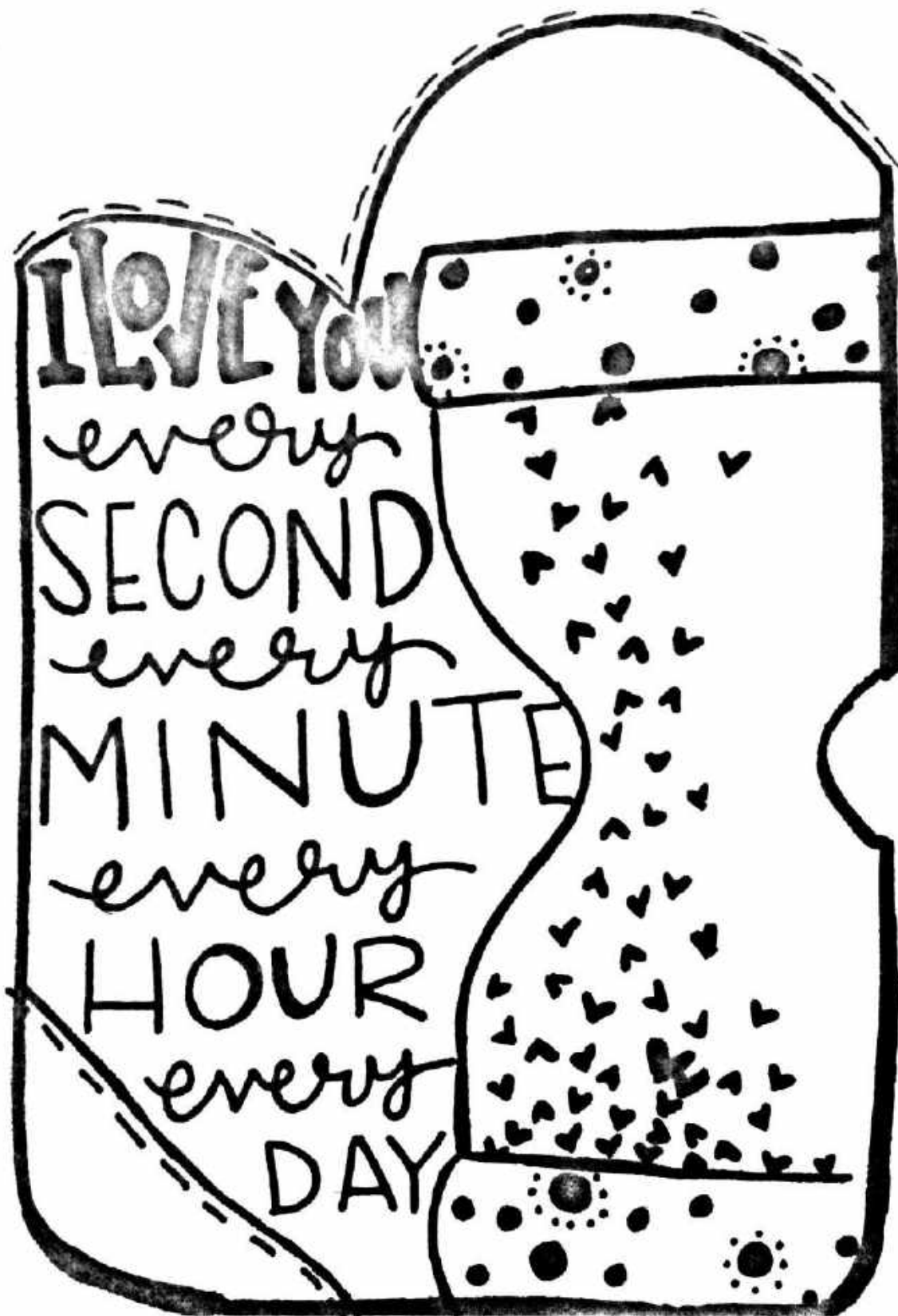

STUCK ON YOU PLATE Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe charger
Tissue paper
Pattern
Black Sharpie or washable marker
Assorted brushes (fan, large round, small round, liner)

Glaze Colors

Green, Medium Brown, Light Green, Red, Taupe, Cream
Writer bottles in Lime Green, White, Red



Directions

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the entire design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the lines with a marker (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design to the pottery.) Remove the tissue paper. Don't trace the lettering onto the plate yet; it will be traced on at a later step.
2. Paint the cactus with 3 coats of Green.
3. Paint the flowerpot with 3 coats of Medium Brown.
4. Use a Lime Green writer bottle to create stitching around the inside of the cactus and to add vertical lines within the cactus.
5. Use a White writer bottle to make small heart shapes to suggest cactus spines.
6. Use a Red writer bottle to make small hearts at the top edges of the cactus.
7. Reposition the tissue paper pattern and trace the lettering onto the flowerpot. Use a Red writer bottle to write the letters.
8. With a round brush, paint waves around the edge of the plate in Red, Taupe, and Cream.
9. Use a White writer bottle to add lines and dots between the waves of color. Allow to dry.
10. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

Small liner brush

Acrylic Paint Colors

White, Light Blue, Gray, Red, Neon Pink, Light Pink, Silver

Directions

7. Embellish with dots mug above the black and white stripes. Add clovers by painting 3 small heart shapes with points that touch in the center and draw a line for the stem. Allow to dry.
8. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Directions

1. Roll and cut a 3" x 5" clay slab $\frac{1}{4}$ " thick. Set aside.
2. Roll a small piece of clay ($\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2"), on the work surface to create a long stick. Repeat 8 times so that each edge will have two sticks. The top and bottom sticks are about 5.5" and the sticks along the sides are about 3.5". Pinch the ends of the sticks to flatten them, or use a toothpick to split the ends into a V shape.
3. Slightly intertwine the sets of sticks. Score the overlapped edges and add a little water to adhere.
4. Starting at the top of the slab, score a pair of the longer intertwined sticks and attach to the slab base, adhering with water. Repeat the process at the bottom of the slab.
5. Roll a pea-size ball of clay and flatten slightly. Score the top and bottom and adhere with water to the side edge of slab in the middle. Repeat on the other side. (This is to prevent the side sticks from sagging.)
6. Attach the side sticks, overlapping the top and bottom sticks. If there is too much overlap, pinch off the excess or use a toothpick and to split the end.
7. Once all the sticks are attached, use a toothpick to carve lines into the sticks to represent bark. Poke a hole in the top corners if you want to hang the frame.
8. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint. Be sure to let the clay dry thoroughly before firing (may take 24–72 hours).
 - a. Paint the slab background cream.
 - b. Paint the sticks with 2 coats of Medium Brown. Highlight the carvings in the sticks and along the edges here and there with Dark Brown.
 - c. Lightly sketch a grid pattern to space the letters proportionately on the base.
 - d. Using a small paintbrush or writer bottle with Black, write out the alphabet, but use the Red for the letters I and U and for a heart that will serve as the letter O.
9. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.

7. Peel off the stickers. Paint the heart with 3 coats of Red. Paint the clouds with 2– coats of white.

6. Paint the outside of the dish with 2–3 coats of Taupe.
7. Peel off the paper pie shape. Be sure the pattern lines are still visible.
8. Paint the pie plate with 1 more coat of Cream. Let dry.
9. For the pie plate design, slightly water down Salmon Pink and paint the stripes. Over lap the stripes in the other direction to create a plaid effect.
10. Paint the crust with 3 coats of Tan, avoiding the heart cutouts. Paint the hearts with 3 coats of Red. With a small brush, add the scallops along the bottom of the crust, the lines around the hearts, and the outline around the edge of the pie in Pumpkin.
11. Paint the whip cream with 1–2 coats of White. With a White writer bottle, add swirls from top to bottom and outline the whip cream shape.
12. Outline the pie plate with a Taupe writer bottle or a small brush.
13. Add the lettering with a Salmon Pink writer bottle. Let dry.
14. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

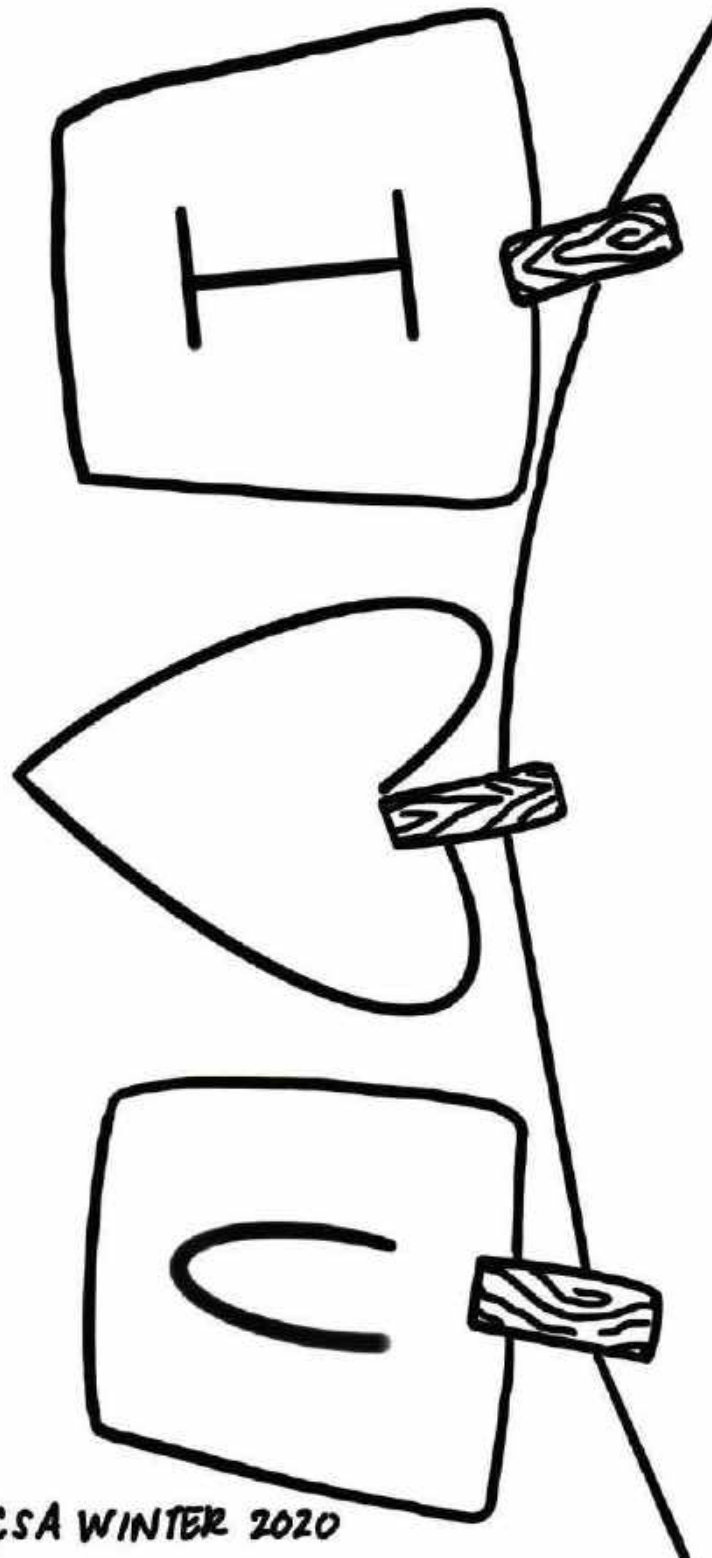

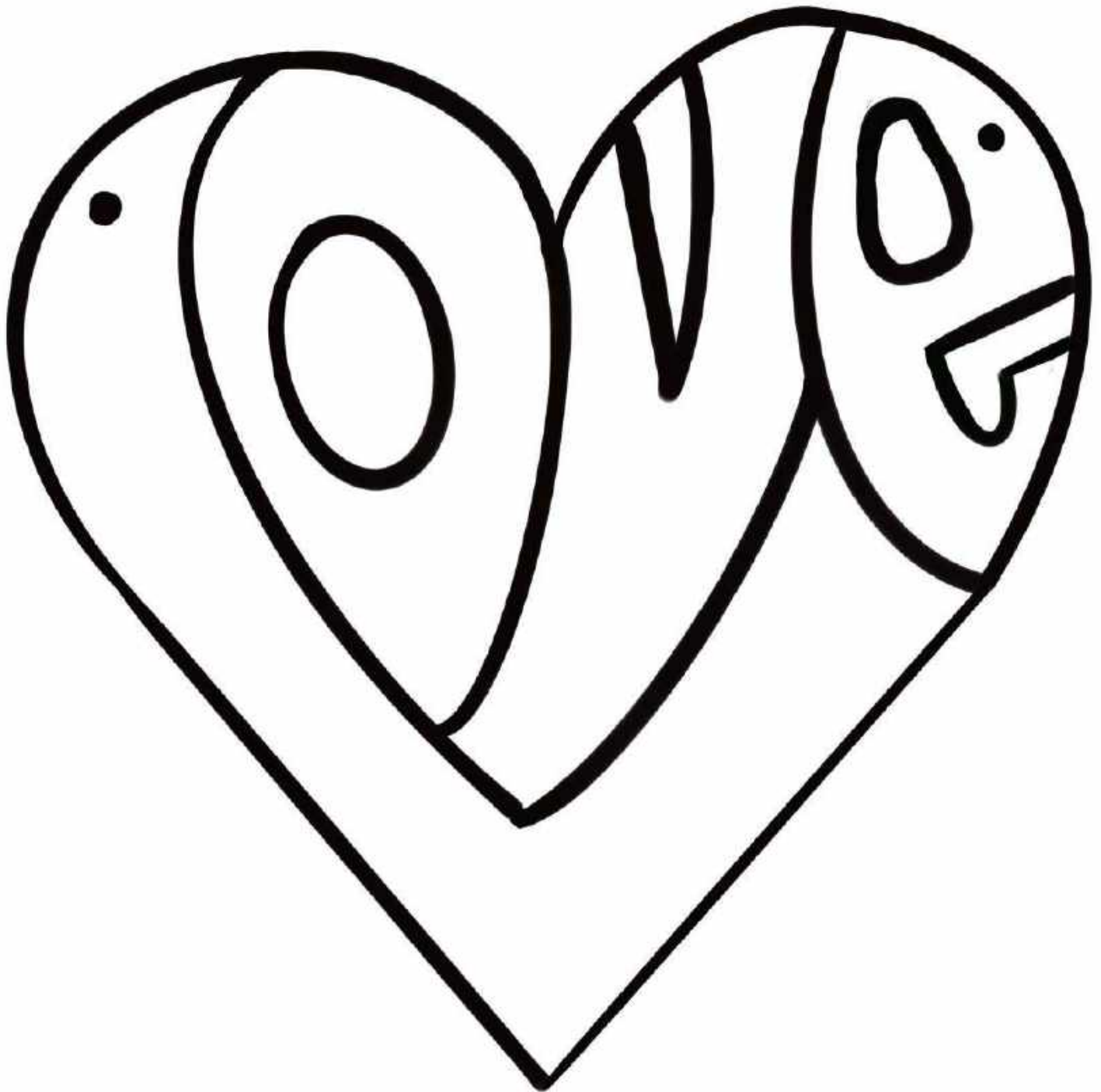

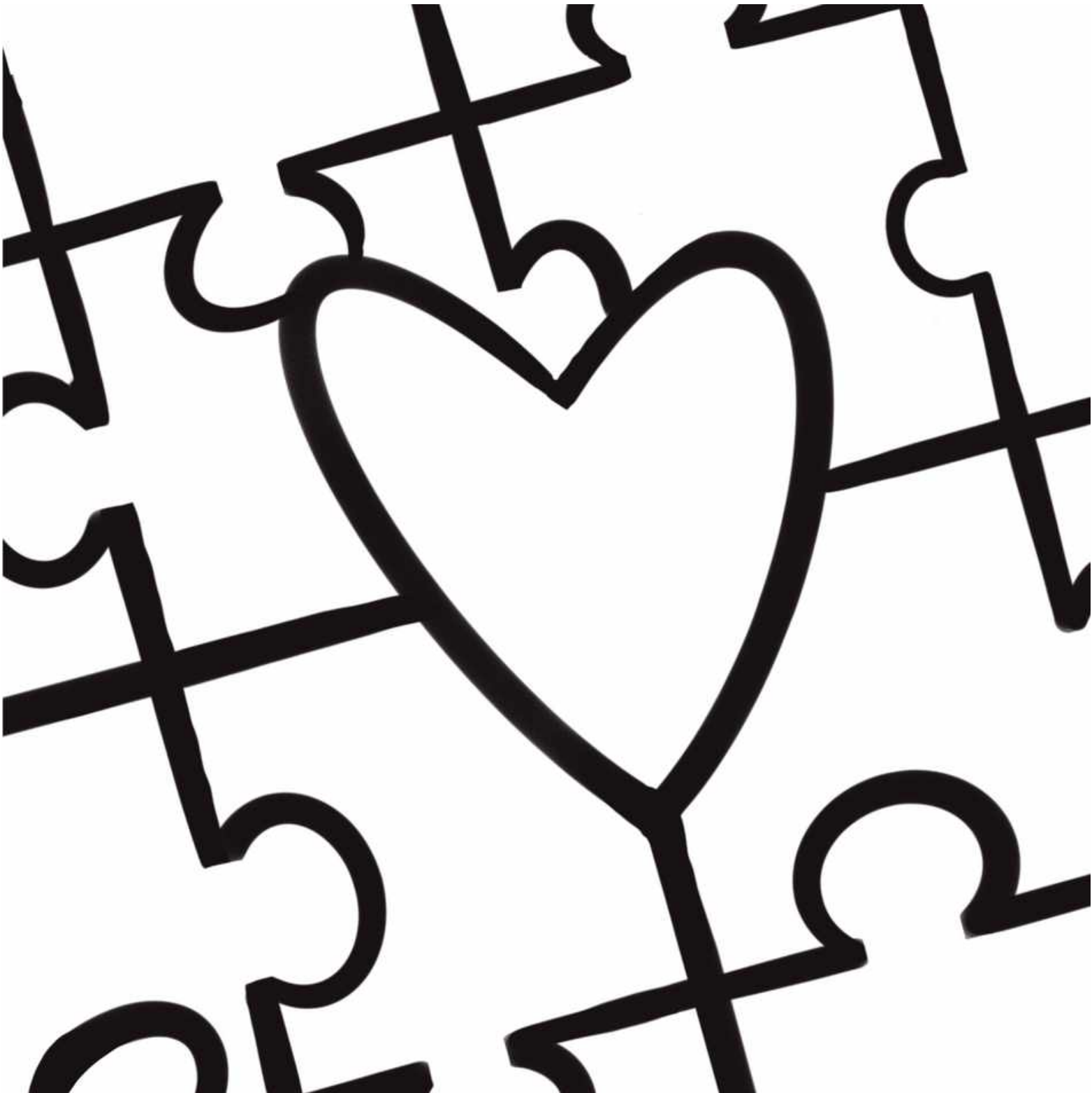

DIRECTIONS

2. With messy brushstrokes, paint 1 coat of Pink all over the outside of the mug. Using the same technique, paint 1 coat of Cream over the Pink.
3. Paint the handle and the inside of the mug with 3 coats of Red.
4. With a liner brush, paint the dog face and neck with 2 coats of Light Gray. Add Dark Gray to the same brush and make quick brushstrokes following along the shape of the head, eyebrows, ears, snout, and neck of the dog.
5. Paint the pupils with 2 coats of Teal Blue.
6. Paint the nose and outline the body and features with a Black writer bottle.
7. Paint the glasses with 2–3 coats of Red.
8. Use a Pink writer bottle for the hearts above dog's head.
9. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

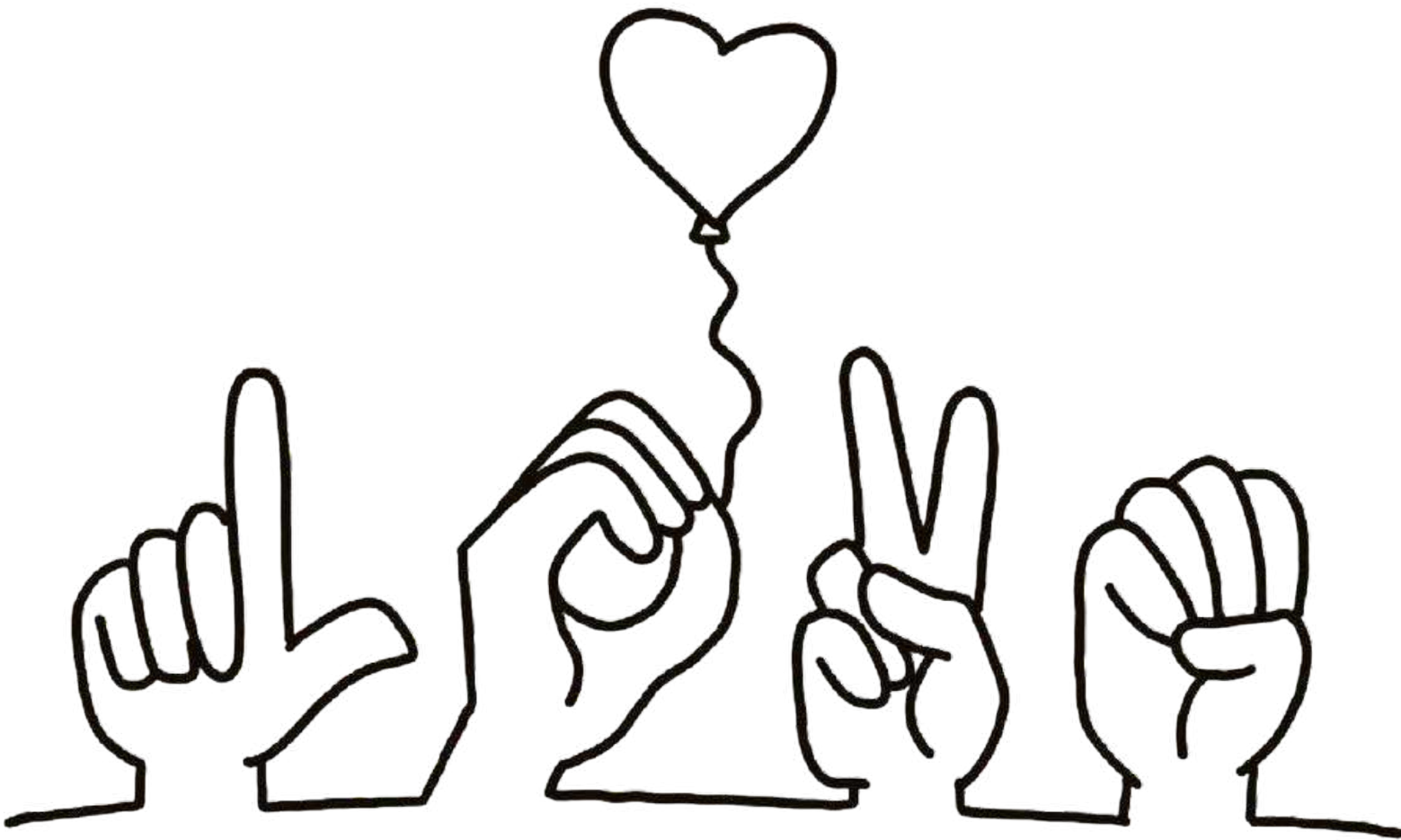
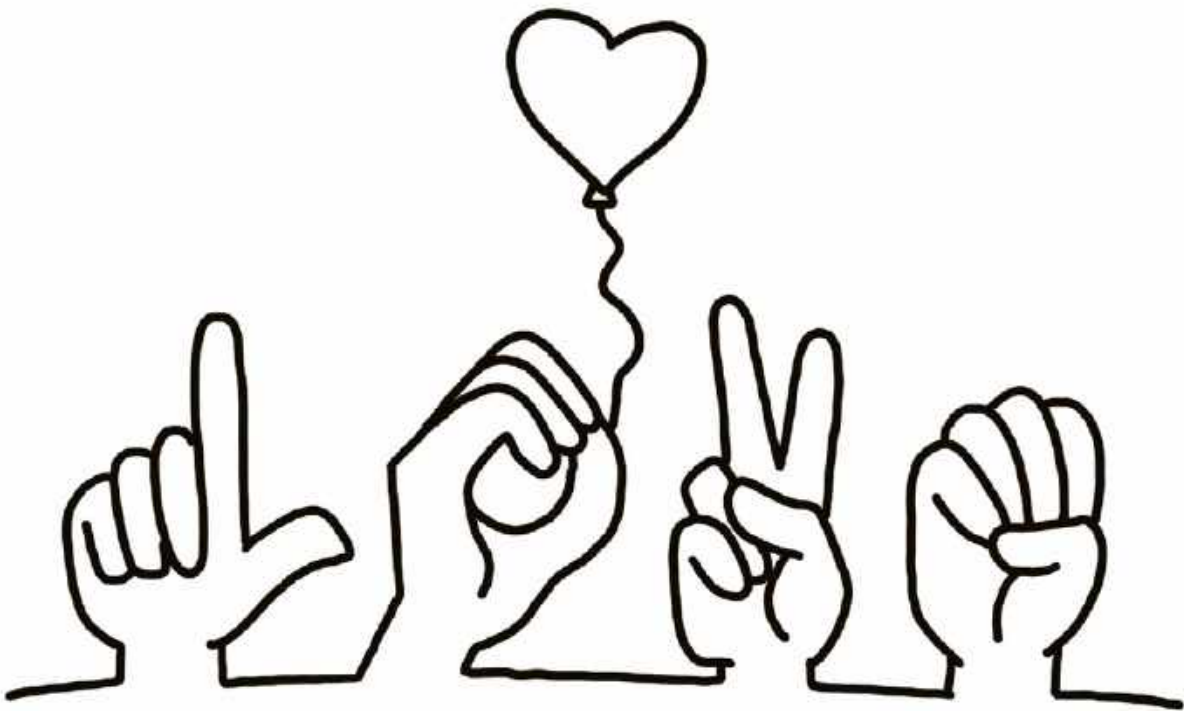
DIRECTIONS

2. Paint 1 coat of White over the surface of the platter. Without rinsing brush, dip brush in Light Pink and paint from the top of edge to about one-third down, creating an ombre look. Rinse the brush, dip in White, and paint over where the Pink meets the White to blend the colors.
3. Paint the heart balloon with 2-3 coats of Red.
4. Using a liner brush or writer bottle, outline the hands with Black.
5. Paint the balloon string Black.
6. Paint a White highlight line at the edge of the heart balloon.
7. Sponge-paint the edge of the platter with 2 coats of Red.
8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

3. Paint a thick coat of White on the square cutout and place painted side down over the traced design on the plate.
4. Paint a thick coat of Dark Green on two of the shamrocks and place them painted side down near the square.
5. Paint a thick coat of Light Green on one shamrock and place it painted side down in the upper left-hand corner. Leave the paper cutouts in place for the next step.
6. Using a fan brush, paint the background of the plate with 2-3 coats of Light Bright Blue.
7. Once dry, remove the paper cutouts.
8. Using a liner or small detail brush, paint the inside edge of the square with 2-3 coats of Light Green.
9. Paint the border of the dark shamrocks with 2-3 coats of Light Green.
10. Paint the border of the light green shamrock with 2-3 coats of Dark Green.
11. Paint Dark Green dashes on the inside of the light green within the square.
12. Fill in the lettering with a Black writer bottle.
13. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

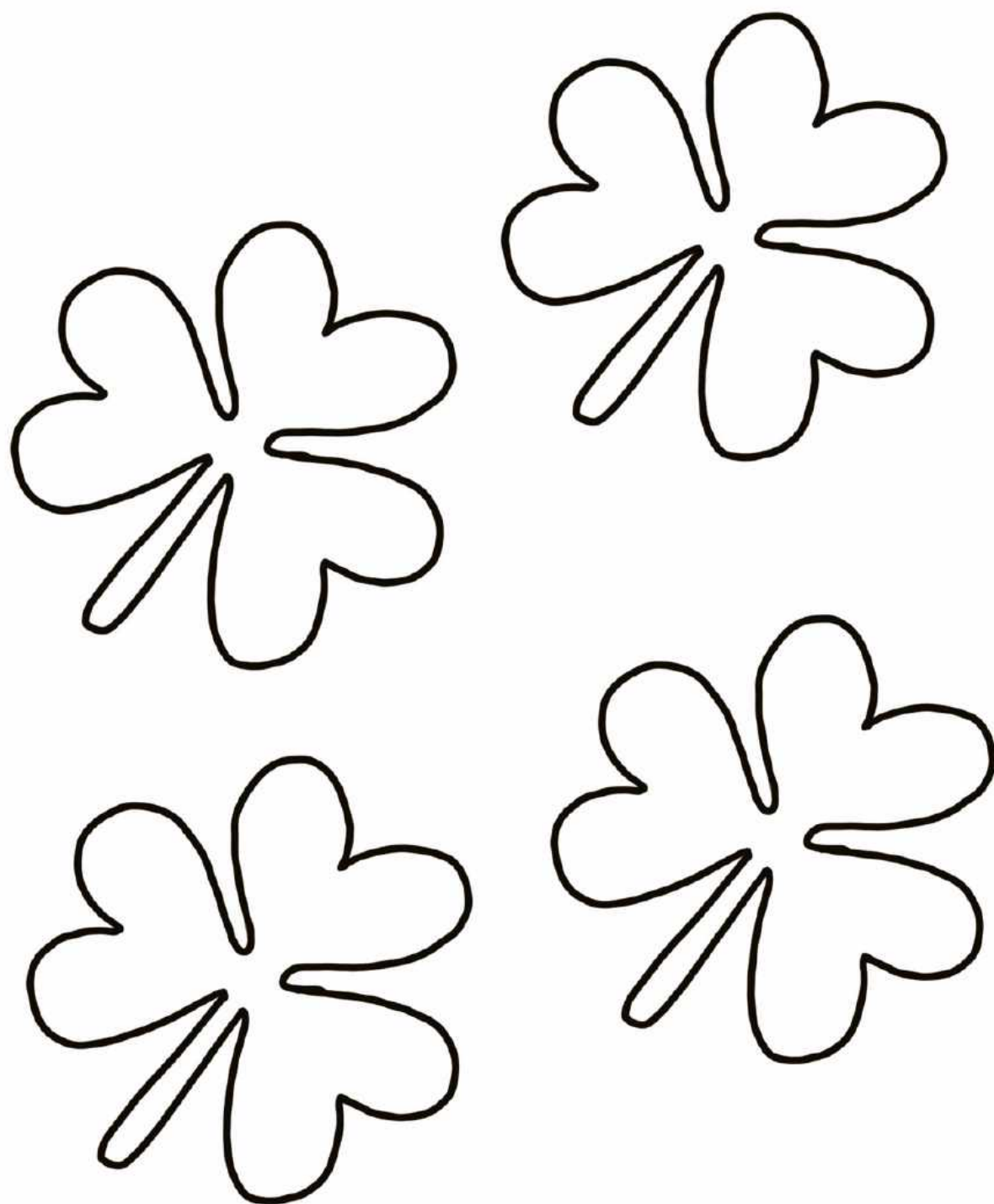

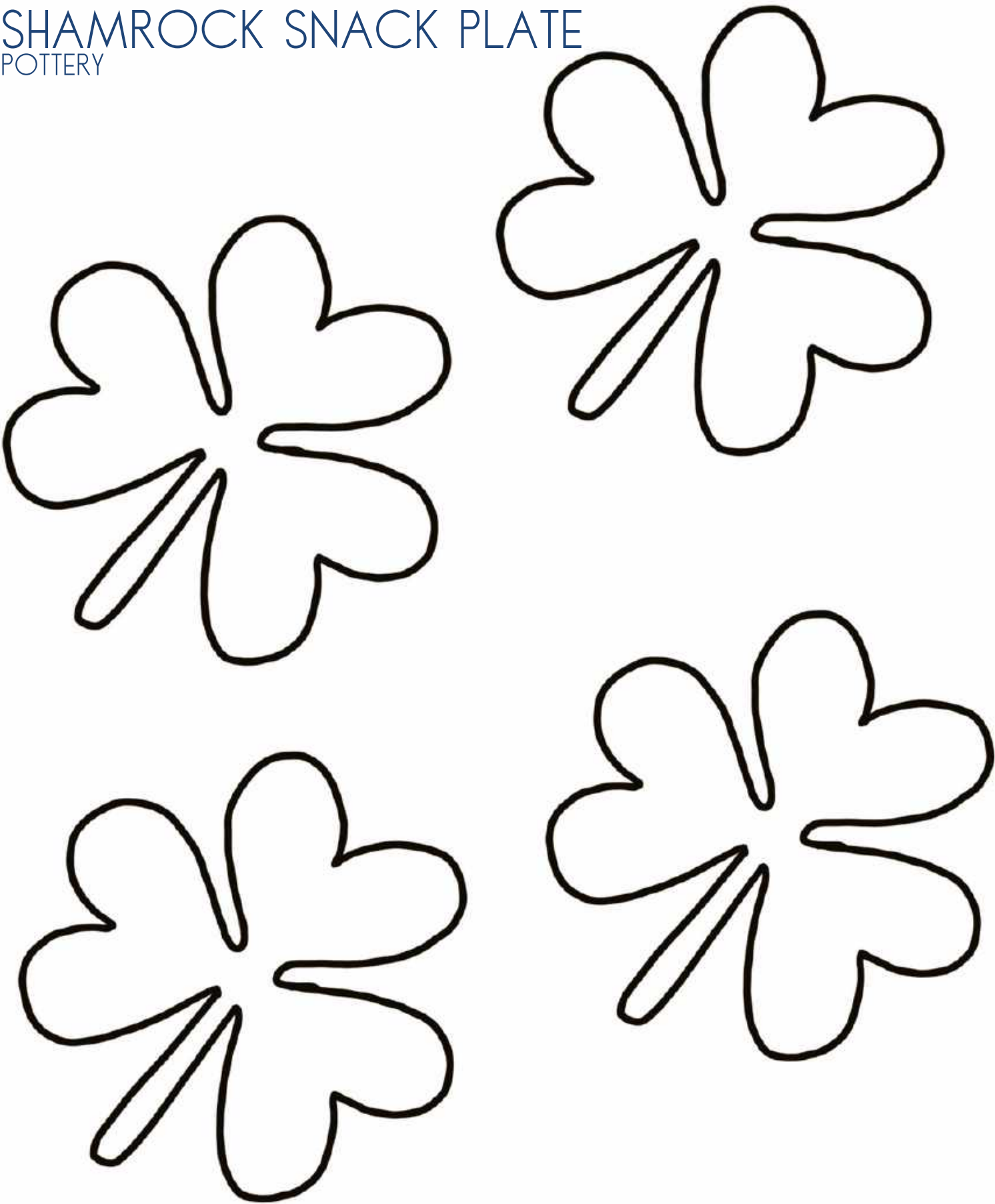

Pattern
Graphite paper
Pencil
Black Sharpie marker
Assorted brushes
1" finishing nails (3–4)
Hammer

Directions

1. Trace the pattern onto the plank using the graphite paper.
2. Paint the cactus Green. Using the same brush, add Yellow and blend into the green for more dimension.
3. Paint the background Coral.
4. Paint small heart shapes in Yellow. Shade on top of the hearts with Coral. Let dry.
5. With a black Sharpie, outline the cactus with a sketchy line.
6. Hammer 3–4 nails in random areas of the cactus to hang jewelry or accessories on. Be sure the nail does not go through the back of the board.

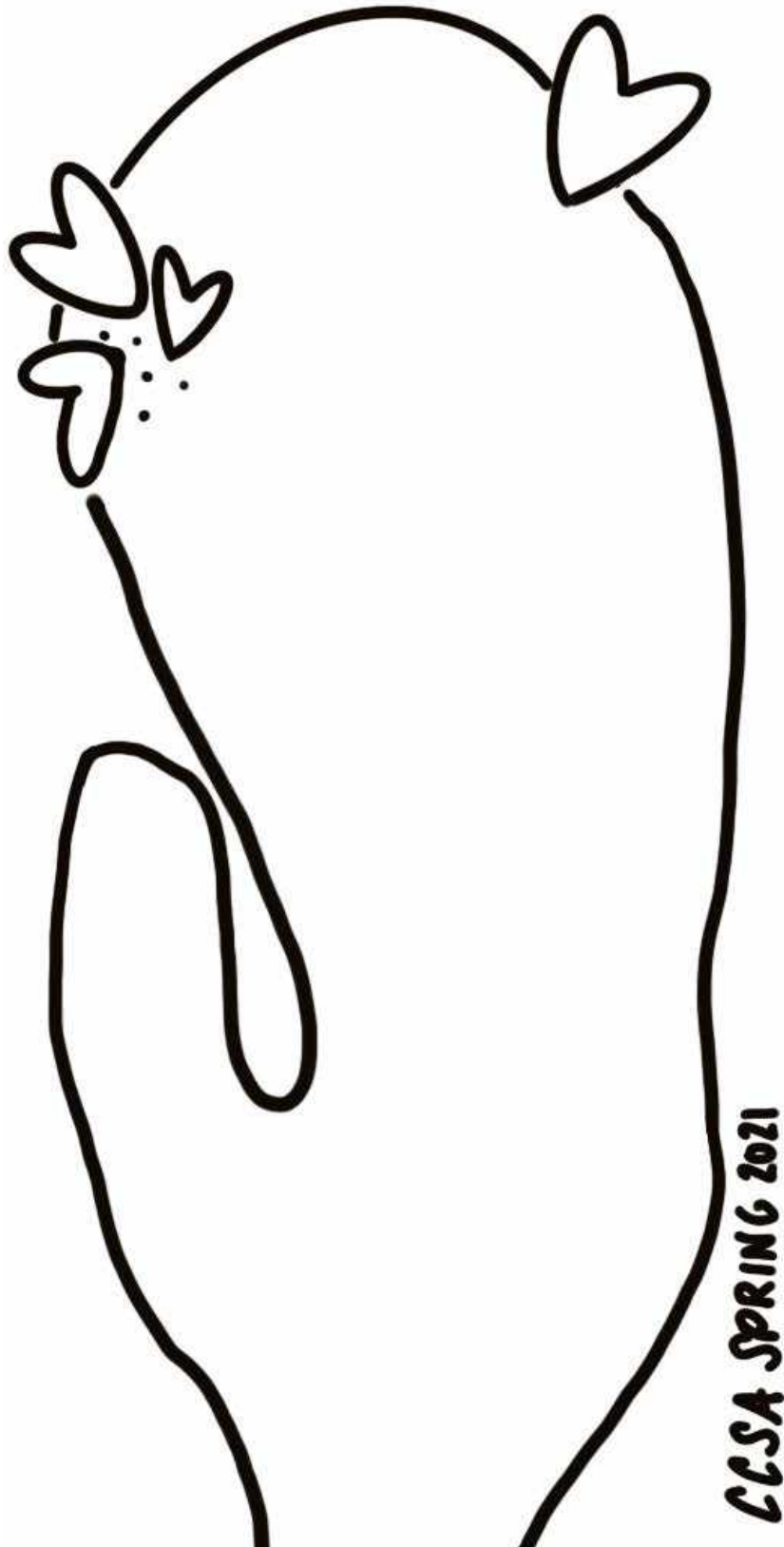

2. Trace the heart shape onto contact paper. Cut out the shape and adhere it over the traced heart shape.
3. Add water to each color separately (Cream and Red) until watercolor consistency is achieved.
4. Use the fan brush to cover the entire background with Cream.
5. While still wet, slowly drip Red into the background area with a fan brush. Use the brush to push and manipulate the color until a marbling effect is achieved. Once dry around the edge of the sticker, remove the contact paper.
6. Paint the central design with 2–3 coats using both thin and medium liner brushes.
7. Using a small liner brush, outline the heart design with Red. Let dry.
8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

2. Paint 2 coats of Dark Taupe on the inside of the letter O. Paint a third heavy coat of Dark Taupe and before dries, use the thin liner brush to draw the outline of the biggest heart with Cream. As the brush drags, the colors should blend slightly. Paint smaller concentric hearts inside the large heart.
3. While the Cream is still wet, quickly place the liner brush at the top of the heart and drag down. The paint should still be wet enough to form a blended line.
4. Paint sketchy lines into the design with a Cream writer bottle, and add small groupings of dots around the hearts.
5. Use the thin liner brush to add 3 coats of Red in a circle around the O.
6. Using a large brush, paint 3 coats of Red inside the mug.
7. Use the thin liner brush to paint the cursive lettering with 2 coats of Black.
8. Use a wet toothbrush to fleck Red and Dark Taupe onto the mug. Let dry.
9. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

6. Paint a solid line around the outside edge of each clover leaf.
7. Paint the center where the leaves meet with a solid dot of White. Let dry.
8. Sign and date your masterpiece.

DIRECTIONS

1. Roll out 8"x8" slab about $\frac{1}{4}$ – $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick.
2. Trace the circular base and 12 heart shapes onto the slab. Cut out with the skewer. Smooth the edges.
3. To attach the hearts, begin with slightly tapping a heart cutout to create a flat edge. Score the edge with toothbrush dipped and water and attach to the edge of the base. Repeat this step until a heart ring is formed around the edge of the base. Continue to score and attach the remaining hearts on top of the bottom hearts to create a dish shape. Let dry.
4. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
5. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
