



Regional Group Lead FAQ

Interested in being a leader for one of CITE's Regional Groups? Below are frequently asked questions and you can find more details about CITE Regional Groups at <https://cite.org/regionalgroups>.

- What is a CITE Regional Group?
 - CITE has 21 groups throughout the state that serve as a local network for both CITE members and non-members.
- Who can attend Regional Groups?
 - Any professionals working in IT in education are welcome to join CITE Regional Groups. Membership is not required.
- How do I become a Regional Group leader?
 - The only requirement to become a leader is CITE membership. Once you have that, if there is an open position, you are welcome to volunteer or run, depending on the group's specific protocol.
- How are Regional Group leaders supported?
 - There are resources available to leaders and Touda Bentatou, CITE's Community Engagement Manager provides additional program support as requested and needed.

- Can I join more than one group?
 - Yes! However you are only able to serve as a leader to one group at a time.
- How often do groups have to meet?
 - Groups are required to meet 4 times per year. One of these meetings is covered by the All-Regional Group Meeting at the CITE Conference, so groups should meet virtually or in-person at least 3 times.
