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U.S. PROCESSED TOMATO STOCKS-ON-HAND REPORT FOR DECEMBER 1, 2010

Inventories of U.S. processed tomato products were close to 11.9 million tons, stated on a raw product equivalent basis, as of December 1, 2010, according to a report released today by the California League of Food Processors. Inventory is up 1% from prior year levels. Apparent disappearance of tomato stock increased 1%, totaling approximately 6.7 million tons during the six month period of June 1, 2010 to December 1, 2010, as compared to the prior reporting period.

Total bulk tomato paste stocks, including inventory held for remanufacture, were estimated to total close to 8.8 million tons, on a raw product \bar{o} paid-for tons \bar{o} equivalent basis, as of December 1, 2010.

The U.S. bulk tomato paste-for-sale inventory on December 1, 2010 was approximately 5.8 million tons, on a raw product \bar{o} paid-for tons \bar{o} equivalent basis.

CLFP statistics reports are estimates of the total U.S. processed tomato supply, based on voluntary reports from processors throughout the United States. Participating processors handle approximately 93.4% of total U.S. tonnage of processing tomatoes.
