

Corporate Owner Clarification/Examples

Corporate Owner membership in COAA affords membership benefits to an unlimited number of staff. To help clarify the limitations of such membership, these examples are provided:

- Higher-Ed: Each campus must join. For example, the University of Texas has 9 campuses and 6 health institutions, each of which requires its own membership.
- Healthcare: Each facility must join. For example, Memorial Healthcare Systems has 6 hospitals, each of which requires its own membership.
- K-12: Each district must join. For example, the Dekalb County (GA) School District has 145 schools and centers. Only one membership is required for the school district.
- Federal/State Government: Each agency/department and divisions thereof must join. For example, neither the Department of Defense nor the Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC) could join as a corporate member, but local/regional subsets of NAVFAC could.
- Local Government: Each city or county must join. For example, membership for the City of Gainesville (FL) does not afford membership to staff employed by Alachua County (FL).
