Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

Responsible for the assembling tank products using air/power tools, machines, and basic hand tools. Also expected to fabricate various types of products.

- Fabricate and assemble components for tanks
- Determine if all parts are present.
- Read and interpret blueprints and sketches.

- Operate fabrication machines such as rolls, shear, seam welder, and knuckler.
- Ensure working environment is clean and safe.
- Report error in product line.
- Place orders for stock inventory and tools needed for production.
- Participate in product development.
- Perform GTAW (TIG) welding of 300 series stainless steel.
- Learn and become proficient in GMAW (MIG) welding of 300 series stainless steel.
- Must provide sufficient shop floor presence.
- Maintain compliance with all company policies and procedures
