

Record Breaking Holiday Lights Parade

The 18th Annual Xcel Energy Holiday Lights Parade was held on Saturday, and what a night it was! Data tracking software shows that 15,000 more people attended the Parade when compared to the typical Saturday night downtown. In fact, over 29,000 were downtown Saturday making it the largest Holiday Lights Parade Saturday on record since data collection began in 2017. Not just a large parade day, last Saturday ranked as the 4th most active Saturday in Downtown Fargo's history—surpassed only by a previous St. Patrick's Day Parade (twice) and one Street Fair Saturday.

The beautiful weather certainly played a role, but the magic of downtown was amplified by over 50 festively decorated storefronts as part of the DCP's Window Wonderland event. Downtown Fargo never looks as good than when businesses come together to create memorable experiences for families, friends, and visitors.

The Holiday Lights Parade showcases what is best about our community: the joy of the season, the magic of our downtown, and what is possible when we foster a vibrant and active Downtown Fargo. City Commission Meeting Recap!

At Monday's City Commission meeting, Commissioner Michelle Turnberg <u>brought</u> <u>forward a proposal</u> regarding homelessness and downtown safety, an issue of increasing importance to our community. You can watch the full discussion here: <u>Full Meeting Discussion</u>.

The proposal marked an important step forward, as the conversation shifted from defining the problem to finding comprehensive solutions. While the City Commission ultimately voted down the proposal on a split vote, it's encouraging to see that everyone generally agrees on the urgency to take action.

Mayor Mahoney announced plans to bring a revised proposal to the Commission in two weeks. This new proposal will incorporate elements from the original while integrating feedback from city staff, community partners, and other stakeholders.

The DCP remains committed to working with the city to ensure these solutions balance the needs of those experiencing homelessness, downtown businesses, the customer experience, and the larger community. The most positive takeaway from the discussion was the shared determination to act swiftly and thoughtfully. Stay tuned for updates as this important work continues.
