

- Work to minimize potential trade constraints
- Elevate U.S. dairy industry voice in international standards setting bodies and increase adoption of scientifically-based regulations
- Support U.S. government (USG) engagement in issue resolution
- Represent U.S. dairy exporters' interests to USG for various market access concerns

- Provide on-call service and prompt individualized attention to members on trade-related questions
 - Documentation and health certification requirements
 - Product labeling
 - Compositional requirements
 - Assist to help clear detained consignments
 - Regulatory trade barriers
 - Tariff classification guidance

Asia - China


- Retaliatory tariffs
 - July 6: 25% additional tariff on Chapter 4 dairy
 - September 24: 5-10% additional tariff on remaining dairy products
- Approved CNCA plant list
 - AMS audits
- Permeate

- Taiwan health certificate
- Indonesia local content

- Turkey health certificate
- GCC Import Guide
- UAE conformity assessment





Mexico

 Milk powder and cheese compositional standards




- Drafts published in February 2018
- USDEC submitted comments and participated in working groups
- Revised standards posted, yet to be finalized
 - Milk powder specifications less restrictive; conformity assessment more flexible.
 - Cheese Codex specifications accepted for varietal cheese; conformity assessment pending



Latin America

- Argentina monograph
- Chile reconstituted milk, country of origin labeling, and type of milk labeling
- Peru import restrictions, labeling
- Panama potential ban on fluid milk





Trade Policy - USMCA

- The U.S., Mexico, and Canada are expected to sign the deal on November 30.
 - Congressional approval is needed before the agreement is enforced.
- Mexico
 - Duty-free, quota-free access to U.S. dairy products remains
 - Geographical indications
- Canada
 - New quotas for U.S. dairy products, with yearly increases





Other - Codex Alimentarius

- Permeate
- Ongoing work
 - Food additives Systems equivalence Food integrity and authenticity • Paperless certification • Third-party assurance • Food hygiene • Food import and export inspection and certification systems • Nutrition and foods for special dietary uses • Antimicrobial resistance • Contaminants • Food labeling
 - Methods of analysis and sampling
