The Government Affairs Council (GAC) shall include the following FAA officers, staff, and any other individuals who may act as the “lead” person on an issue that the GAC and/or the FAA leadership considers to be a priority:

- President
- President-Elect/Legislative Chair
- Vice President/Incoming Legislative Chair
- Immediate Past President
- APAC Chairman
- Executive Vice President
- General Counsel
- Government Affairs Director
- State Lobbyist

The GAC shall serve as the government affairs arm of FAA for the purpose of communicating both internally and externally regarding legislative and political issues important to the FAA and the multihousing industry in the state of Florida. The GAC is not a policy-making entity, but shall serve as the strategic decision-making group for all legislative and political issues and priorities as directed and set forth by the FAA Executive Committee and/or Board of Directors. Further, the members of the GAC shall have the authority to represent the FAA and the multihousing industry before state and local legislatures/governing bodies, lawmakers, and representatives of other industries and associations.

The members of the GAC shall agree to act as the core communications group. Everyone in this group will be included in every discussion on issues of priority to FAA and the multihousing industry, but they shall maintain confidentiality, when needed, on the most sensitive legislative and political information.

The GAC shall have the discretion to expand their discussions beyond the members of the GAC.

The FAA Legislative Committee Chairman will serve as the Chairman of the GAC.
