Step Up for Students Scholarships

Step Up for Students has released new information about the school choice legislation, HB 1, signed early in the 2023 session. There is now no income threshold for individuals to apply. Through these programs, there are three ways to use the scholarship: tuition and fee assistance to an eligible private school, transportation assistance to a public school different than the one your student is assigned to, or to meet the educational needs of students who are not enrolled in full-time private or public school through the Personalized Education Program (PEP). FEDERAL UPDATE

The Charitable Act

The House version of the *Charitable Act*, S. 566, was introduced on Wednesday, May 17. The bipartisan bill, already introduced in the Senate, would enable taxpayers who take the standard deduction (about 88% of taxpayers) to deduct charitable donations of up to one-third of the standard deduction, or about \$4,600 for individuals and \$9,200 for married couples based on the current standard deduction.

Economic Recovery Corps Program

The Economic Recovery Corps (ERC) program is now accepting applications from

organizations interested in hosting a full-time fellow for 2.5 years (30 months). Host organizations will have until June 30, 2023, to submit their expression of interest and initiate the application process. ERC Fellow applications will open in mid-June, with additional details on the process and criteria to be announced soon. There is no cost to an organization or community to host a fellow. Broadband Technical Assistance Program

DEADLINE: June 20, 2023

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced in April the availability of \$20 million to deliver broadband technical assistance resources for rural communities, and to support the development and expansion of broadband cooperatives. USDA is offering the funding under the new <u>Broadband Technical Assistance Program</u>. The program supports technical assistance projects such as conducting feasibility studies, completing network designs and developing broadband financial assistance applications. Funding is also available to help organizations access federal resources, and to conduct data collection and reporting. Environmental Justice

DEADLINE: June 30, 2023

The Environmental Justice Thriving Communities Grantmaking (EJ TCGM) Program's Request for Applications (RFA) has extended the application to June 30, 2023. The entities eligible to apply under this RFA and serve as an Environmental Justice Thriving Communities Grantmaker fall into four categories. They include:

· A community-based nonprofit organization;

- A partnership of community-based nonprofit organizations;
- A partnership between a Tribal Nation and a community-based nonprofit organization; or,
- A partnership between an institution of higher education and a community-based nonprofit organization.

Tech Hubs Program

DEADLINE: August 15, 2023

The Tech Hubs Program will make place-based economic development investments to drive technology- and innovation-centric growth by strengthening a region's capacity to commercialize, manufacture, and deploy critical technologies. This program aims to invest in regions with the assets, resources, capacity, and potential to become globally competitive, within approximately ten years, in the technologies and industries of the future. The Phase 1 NOFO has two components: EDA will fund Strategy Development Grants and will Designate certain regions as Tech Hubs. Applicants can apply for (a) Designation only; (b) a Strategy Development Grant only; or (c) both Designation and a Strategy Development Grant.
