# COMPLIANCE ASSISTANCE SITE VISITS FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

Compliance Assistance Site Visits (CASVs) are an excellent tool to understand compliance standing.

#### Requesting a CASV:

- DEP District Staff will inspect your site for compliance with its operating permit at your request.
  - Results of that inspection will be sent in a letter that simply brings the findings to your attention.
  - Corrective actions and follow-up to the letter are not required.
  - A simple and effective tool to prepare for future inspections and maintain good compliance standing.




## DISCHARGE MONITORING REPORT ASSISTANCE

#### FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

Reach out to your local district office for Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) assistance.

Requesting a DMR assistance meeting:

- DEP Staff will set up a date and time, either virtually or in-person depending on your preference.
  - Clarify DMR expectations as outlined in the department's Helpful Tips guidance document.
    - Method Detection Limit (MDL) and Practical Quantitation Limit (PQL) considerations, average calculations, data qualifiers, codes, etc.
  - Walk you through completing your DMR and properly transferring lab data.







#### FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

DEP has developed guidance on how Sanitary Sewer Oveerflows (SSOs) are addressed statewide, which was implemented July 1, 2019.

According to the guidance each incident is rated, and the appropriate following document is either filed

or issued:

- Memo-to-File.
- Compliance Assistance Offer Letter (CAOL).
- Warning Letter (WL).

SSOs can be rated based on the following:

- Amount Spilled and Amount Recovered.
- Spill Characteristic.
- Chronic.
  - Two or more spills in a 12-month period from the same location.
  - More than six spills per 100 miles of collection system piping.
- Waterbody/Waterbodies Impacted.





#### FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

#### SSOs/Unauthorized discharges can be reported through the DEP Business Portal.

Submitting through the DEP Portal notifies the appropriate District Office, populates a Public Notice of Pollution (PNP), and notifies Department of Health (DOH) if the spill was within one mile of healthy beaches monitoring location.

Waterbodies are auto-populated if needed for reporting. Additionally, the Department's Map Direct Gallery (DWRM Domestic Wastewater Facility Regulation Map) can be used to help identify the class of waterbody affected.

Submittal through the DEP Portal does **not** relieve users of the responsibility to call the State Watch Office (SWO).



## 62-604.550, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), details the requirements for reporting SSOs:

- Within 24 hours of discovery, notify DEP that an SSO has occurred.
  - For spills >1,000 gallons or where public health or the environment will be endangered, contact the SWO.
  - For spills <1,000 gallons and where public health or the environment will not be endangered, contact your local district office.
- Submit a PNP if you were required to contact the SWO.
- Submit a written abnormal event report within five days of discovery to your local district office.





#### FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

If an SSO is reported to the SWO, a PNP is required by 403.077, Florida Statues (F.S.) and 62-604.550, F.A.C.

PNPs may be filed in two ways:

- DEP's PNP web page at <a href="https://floridadep.gov/pollutionnotice">https://floridadep.gov/pollutionnotice</a>.
- By reporting electronically using DEP's Business Portal at <a href="https://www.fldepportal.com/go/">https://www.fldepportal.com/go/</a> (via "Submit" followed by "Report" or "Registration/Notification").

#### If you call the SWO, the PNP must show!

Approximately 19% of spills requiring a PNP in 2023, did not have one filed.

## Make sure your Emergency Response Plan (ERP)/Sanitary Sewer Overflow Response Plan (SSORP) is up-to-date!

Your ERP/SSORP must contain, at a minimum, the following:

- Assessment of system security including cybersecurity.
- Water quality monitoring for SSOs affecting surface waters.
  - Adequately describe how waterbodies classes are identified and what parameters are sampled. Parameters should correspond to 62-302, F.A.C.
- Hurricane and severe storm preparedness and response.

62-604, F.A.C., requires you to update your ERP/SSORP annually.

Your local district office can assist if you have questions.
