## DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE POSITION

The Water Plant Operator is a skilled, technical position responsible for operating and maintaining water treatment plants, water wells, distribution sampling & flushing, and producing safe drinking water in accordance with Federal and State regulatory requirements. The Water Plant Operator is responsible for carrying out the day-to-day operation and maintenance duties of the water plant and providing assistance for the Division's projects and efforts.

## **DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Performs daily operations' duties as assigned by Chief Water Plant Operator for the Water Division, as well as for special projects.
- Collects water samples at various locations.
- Performs chemical tests and laboratory analysis of water samples.
- Performs lab equipment calibration.
- Operates, maintains, and repairs pumps, motors, and equipment.
- Takes readings of equipment settings and chemical levels, records data into computers.
- Monitors computerized display of plant operational status and water quality parameters.
- Adjusts valve and equipment settings which control chemical flows and mixing, as necessary.
- Maintains water reservoir levels, system pressures and industrial equipment.
- Prepares reports and logs for regulatory agency reports.
- Maintains a clean and safe physical environment in the plants and well fields.
- Responds to automatic system alarm calls after hours.
- Troubleshoots and corrects problems; advises supervisors as necessary.
- Maintains and updates distribution system fire hydrant flushing program and related records.
- Operates emergency power generators, electrical switchgears, and various industrial equipment.
- Provides advice and recommendations to supervisor.
- Assists other operators and supervisor with special projects as necessary.
- Assists other utility divisions as necessary.
- Assists in Town/SMRU preparations for severe storms, hurricanes and other weather emergencies and is considered an essential first responder following a major weather/emergency event.

- Assists in post-storm damage assessment, clean-up and repair.
- Drives throughout the service area.
- Trains and mentors other operators as needed.
- May be required to work all shifts including weekends, holidays, evenings and 24-hour emergency on-call.
- Performs related duties as necessary or assigned.

## **EDUCATION / CERTIFICATION / TRAINING:**

- Required: High School Diploma or equivalent education.
- Required: Educational training in water operations, water infrastructure management, equipment maintenance, facilities management, or fields related to the responsibilities of this position.
- Required: Water Plant Operator's Certification from FDEP, Class "C" minimum.
- This position may require use of personal or Town/Utility vehicles on Town/Utility business. Individuals must be physically capable of operating the vehicles safely and possess a valid Florida Driver's License.

#### **EXPERIENCE**

- One to three (1-3) years responsible experience in a similar position and/or organization strongly preferred.
- Experience in Reverse Osmosis (RO), groundwater treatment, and wellfield maintenance is preferred.

## **KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS & ABILITIES**

- Ability to carry out the duties and responsibilities of a certified operator.
- Knowledge of water utility operations including procedures, methods and materials used in water production.
- Knowledge of the occupational hazards and safety precautions applicable to water production.
- Knowledge of workplace safety issues such as hazardous chemical handling and proper emergency response and mitigation to exposure by inhalation, ingestion, or penetration.
- Strong communication skills including written and verbal correspondence, including report preparation.
- Ability to read, understand and comply with federal, state, and local regulations and operations and maintenance manuals.
- Ability to maintain records and prepare clear and concise reports regarding plant operation.
- Ability to use computer to record data, create reports, tables, use email and the internet.
- Ability to work effectively with utility staff, management, and members of the general public.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.
- Ability to analyze problems, identify alternative solutions, project consequences of proposed actions, and recommend solutions.
- Ability to operate specialized computer systems used in water production and distribution.
- Ability to work outside in non-air-conditioned environments and in all types of weather conditions while performing job duties.

- Ability to perform work effectively around moving mechanical equipment.
- Ability to bend or stoop repeatedly or continually over time to perform maintenance services or perform related duties.

## WORKING CONDITIONS

Potential for hazardous or unpleasant conditions exist. Work is predominantly outside in So. Florida weather with its extreme summer heat, rain, and often, tropical-force rain, winds, and flooding. # PHYSICAL DEMANDS
