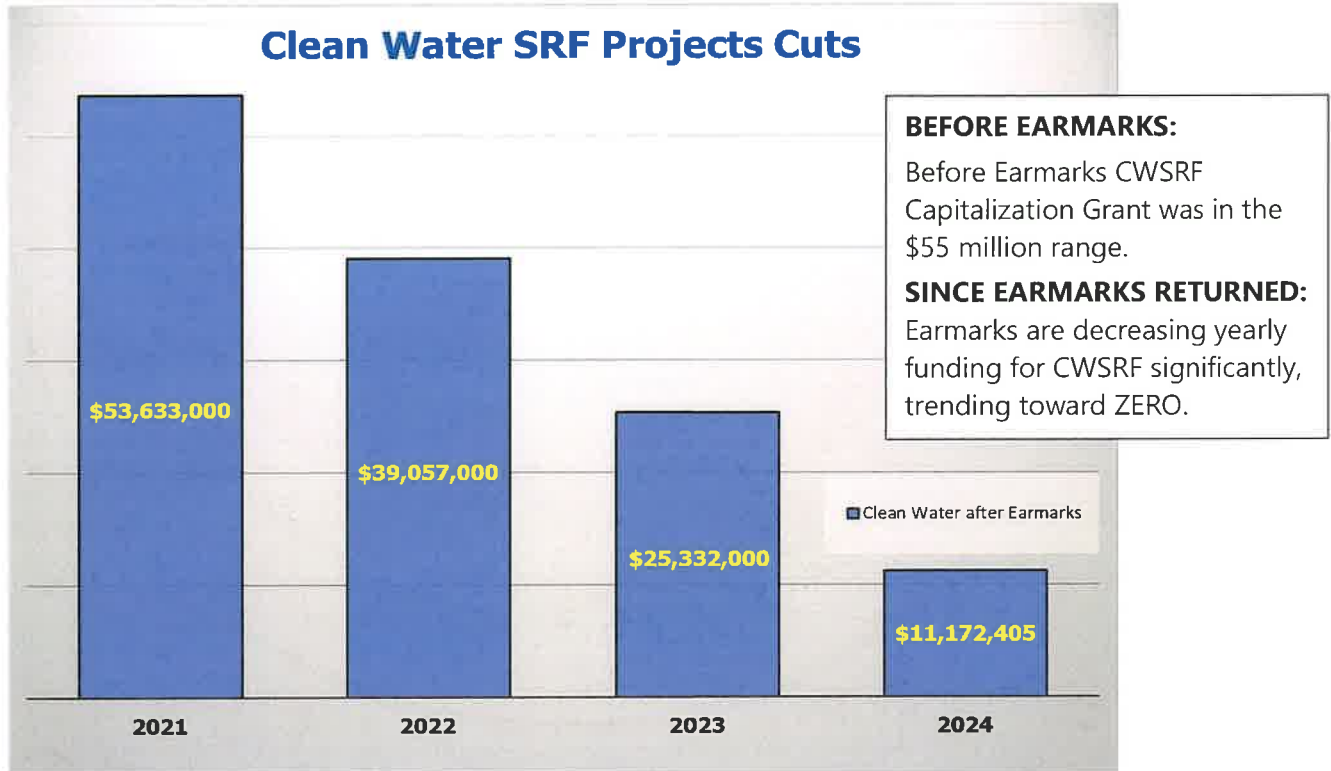
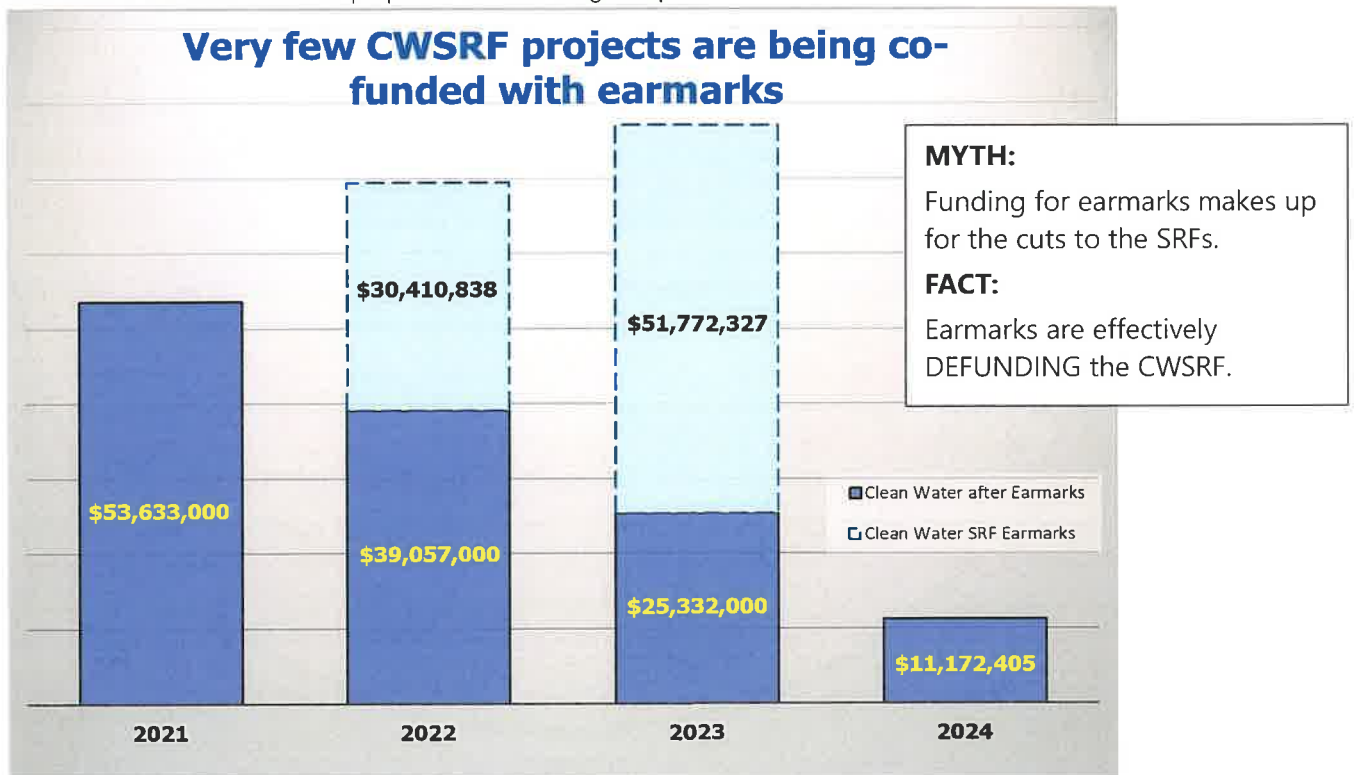


Florida has lost tens of millions in federal funding for water infrastructure because of earmarks.

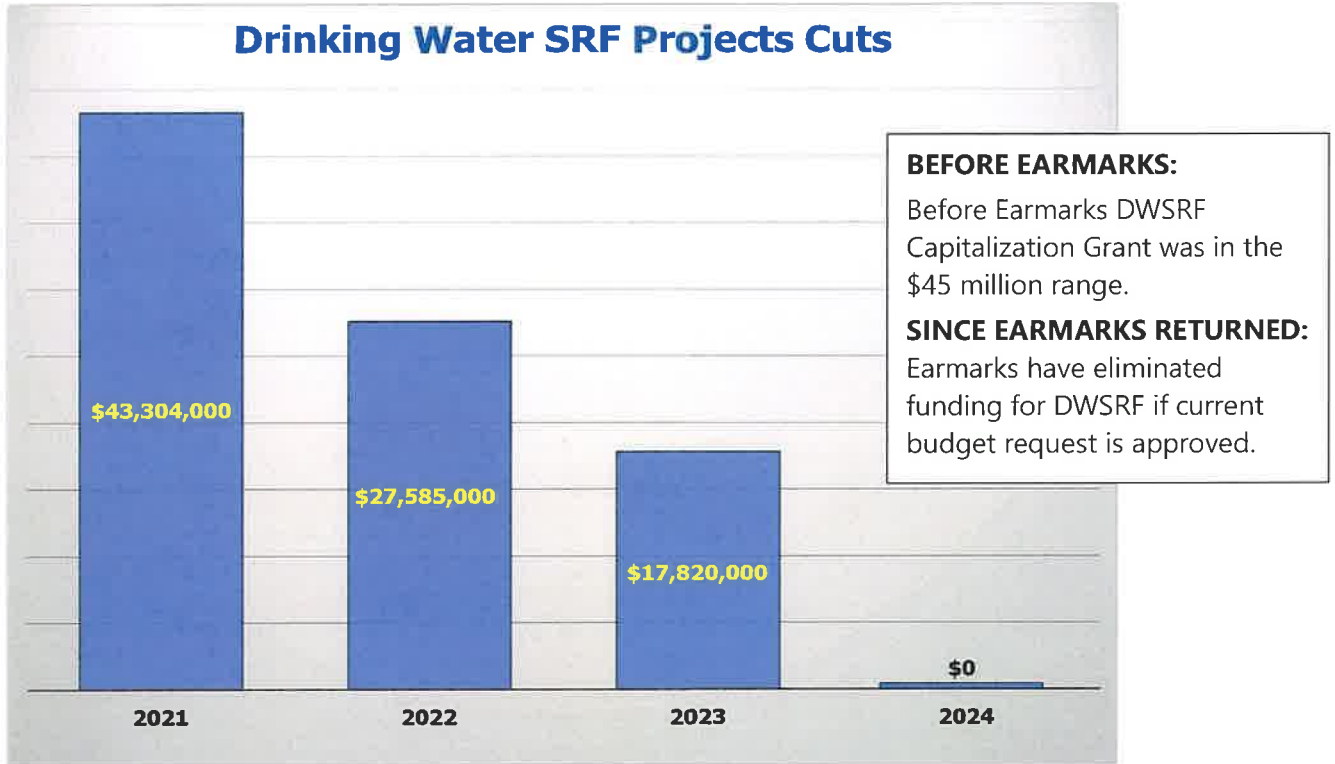

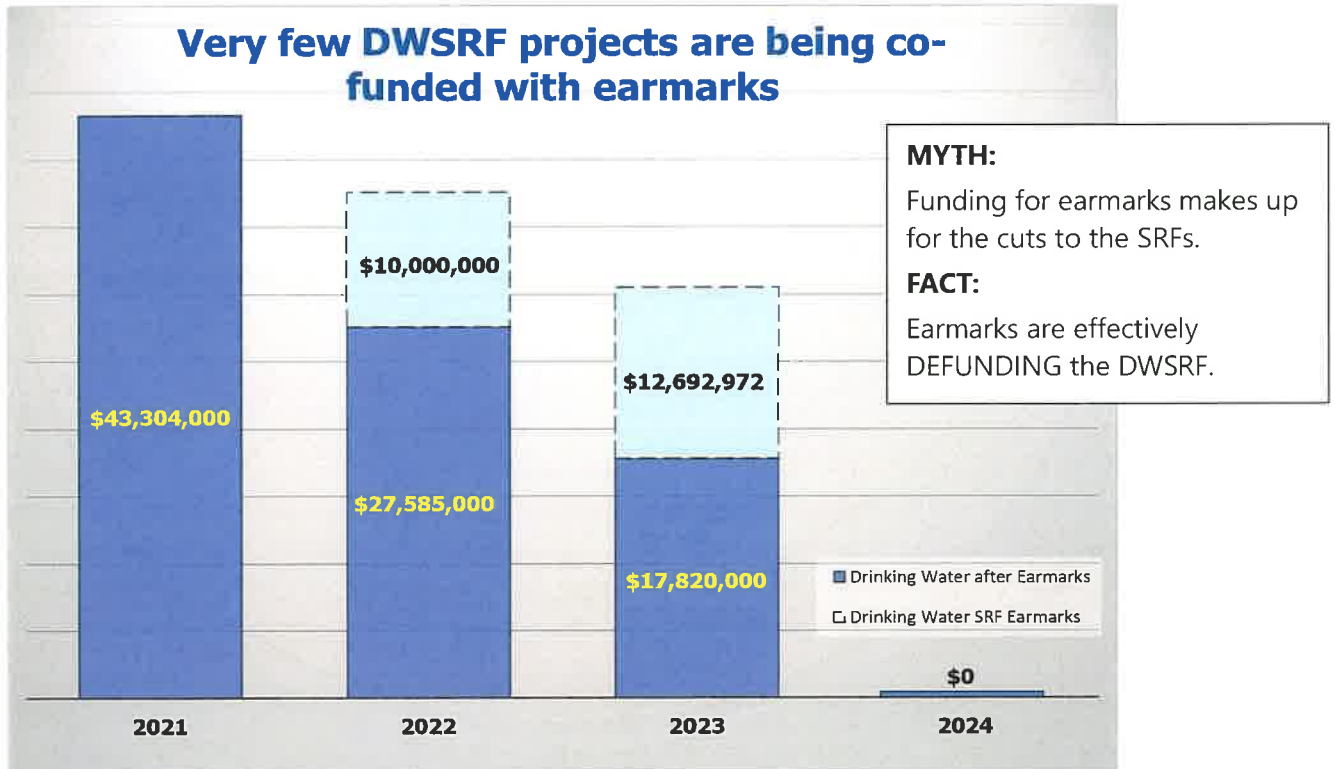
