ONLINE VOTER REGISTRATION	 If you have a North Carolina driver's license or DMV-issued ID, you may now access the online voter registration tool using these 6 steps: 1. Go to <u>https://payments.ncdot.gov/</u> 2. Click on the <u>Continue to myNCDMV Services</u> button 3. Click on the <u>Continue as a guest link</u> 4. On the <u>Let's get started.</u> page, scroll down and click on <u>Submit a Voter Registration Application</u> 5. Enter your <u>North Carolina Driver License or DMV-issued ID Card number, Social Security Number</u>, and your <u>Date of Birth</u> in the designated fields and click the <u>Submit button</u> 6. Follow the prompts to register OR If you are already registered, update your address or change your party affiliation ★ Register by October 9th for November 3 General Election Day
Who can register to vote?	 NC citizens who are at least 16 years old. You must be 18 years old to vote. Citizens who have completed the terms of a felony sentence.
How do I know if I am registered?	 ★ Voter Card from your county Board of Elections - look for it in the mail 2-6 weeks after submitting your voter registration application ★ Use the Voter Lookup tool on the NC State Board of Elections website (use the Vote tab) vt.ncsbe.gov/RegLkup/ ★ Contact the Board of Elections (BoE) in your county ★ vote411.org
VOTING IN 2020	 2020 General Election Day is November 3 ★ This year's ballot includes: ☆ President ☆ US Senate & House of Representatives ☆ NC Governor & Council of State ☆ NC Senate & House of Representatives ☆ county offices ★ Due to the uncertainty of COVID-19 and its effects in the fall, all are encouraged to request a mail-in Absentee ballot NOW for the November election. Any registered voter may request and receive a mail-in absentee ballot - no excuse needed. The voter or the voter's near relative or legal guardian must complete, print, sign, and return the NC Absentee Ballot Request Form. Be sure to include all required information and don't forget the signature & date at the bottom! Mail or deliver the signed request form to your county Board of Elections (BoE). Must be received by that BoE no later than 5pm on the last Tuesday before the election. ★ Vote the ballot you receive in the presence of two witnesses (one if the witness is a notary-public). Seal the voted ballot in the return envelope and complete the information on the back of the return envelope. The witness(es) must complete and sign the envelope in the space assigned to them. If someone assists the voter, they must sign and date the certificate as well. The voted ballot must be returned to the county board of elections no later than 5pm on the night of the election. ★ Go to the NC State Board of Elections website (use the Vote tab) for further information & instructions, as well as the address for your county BoE.
