The Lincoln-Douglas debate traces its roots to the 1858 Illinois U.S. Senate race when Abraham Lincoln and Stephen Douglas held nine debates across the state. We will be using a modified Lincoln Douglas debate format to address this proposition: *Transmission planning and regulatory reforms to "relieve congestion" are compatible with market design regulatory reforms to retain and incentivize dispatchable generation in ERCOT's Energy Only Market.* Mark Stover will present the affirmative case and Bill Barnes will present the negative case.
