Requirements: To obtain the CAM credential, candidates must complete the following: Minimum of 12 months of onsite property management experience, successful completion of all CAM coursework (totaling 40 hours). Must meet all examination standards within 12 months of declaring candidacy.





KidsPeace—May is Foster Care Awareness Month What can you do?

"Foster a Ribbon" is a campaign to hang 24 inch ribbons that have been fostered (purchased) by people of Fayetteville. The 24 inch long ribbons symbolizes the average 24 months that children spend in foster care. The ribbon swaying in the wind symbolizes the unstable environments the children have endured.

Ribbon fostering (ribbon sales) will begin in April. The goal is to sell 2000 ribbons that will be hung from trees in 2 separate locations in Fayetteville. 1000 ribbons will be hung per location in symbolism of the approximate amount of children in need in Cumberland County. The ribbons would be hung on the trees from May 17, 2019 until May 24, 2019. There would also be a sign placed at each location with information regarding the Cumberland County needs in foster care. We intend to have a media

moment for each location with a public official present. The goal of the "Foster a Ribbon" campaign is to bring awareness of the continued need for foster parents and funds to support these children because "They are our Future".
