- Shipments 7% down in April, 15% down in May from GA Port Authority.

Comment Jason: Common thread among leaders: the power of communication to their teams.

Participants guesses: home improvement, technology, games, alcohol, toilet paper, essentials in groceries since restaurant spending is down, hand sanitizer, personal grooming.

AJC Result: Clothes! Spending is up but still 30% down from last year.

Comment Jason:

We have an unique opportunity ahead. The workers are looking to leadership in business for guidance. As manufacturing in GA gets rolling again, everything else follows. GA is the leader.

What are you seeing in the marketplace?

Russ Dunlap, Taylor English. Russ focuses on patents and intellectual property.

- Have stayed busy.
- Few clients have new ideas with different virus related matters, ie masks and new ideas for when market picks back up
- Today our office is opening back up. Not a requirement but we are open if you want to go in.
- My customer, Muehler water products, their products and business has not changed
- Another customer, Pratt industries, manufacturer of cardboard boxes/packaging, their business has not changed.

Bruce Siegal, Taylor English: we appreciate your support as well. Works in the intellectual property department but more in trademarks. Lots of sports related, but corporate as well. Seeing an increase in fraudulent requests regarding immediate action with US Trademark Office = scam.

Comment Jason: Taylor English is a big sponsor of GMA, had legal education sessions scheduled this year at Taylor English, look forward to starting that.

JT Taylor, Adhesives and Equipment.

- Doing customer calls inside their facility. Wear masks, sign paperwork. In SC and TN as well, we are putting business on the schedule!
- Auto industry in MI, some manufacturers are rolling products off.

Jason Lammers, Grenzebach Corporation. We manufacture material handling equipment, we do sheet metal. See website.

- Soft opening today, engineering is back. Everyone is getting screened, and needs to wear a mask. Only in your own office can you take your mask off.

LD DeKatch, Fastsigns Snellville:

Covid related signage is online at https://p.widencdn.net/r2qlw8/COVID-Sign-Guide. We can modify for the specific needs of your space, and brand items.

 Lot of Covid guideline signage: pick-ups, parking directional signs, HOAs with new pool guidelines. So you can tell which industries are opening back up.

- New business openings, some rebranding as well.
- Did signage for Ryan Carver's sports facility.

Roger Grabman, Grab Innovations, professional engineer specializing in safety/OSHA.

- The savings rate has jumped.
- An alphabet of different anticipated recoveries.
- Scott Sherline coming up with advice regarding control systems
- I spoke with Joe Paolini this morning. I have a contact with used bottling equipment.

Rob Kuehl, Maier American, we manufacture rotary joints and have a repair center here. We supply Coca Cola, Pepsi, Nestle for bottled water, also Clorox, Proctor & Gamble. Our small piece for equipment is crucial, especially for essential businesses so we are essential as well.

- Nobody here had Covid, but family members have.
- WFH is totally new and will extend beyond Covid.
- Our business has taken a small hit, as our customers have taken a hit.
- Expecting to be slower the next 90 days.
- Used to work for Grenzebach about 5 years ago!

Jason: what are you doing about marketing and trade shows through the end of 2020?

- We put all exhibits on hold
- We let the product do the speaking, we dont market a lot.
- We are putting a lot of effort into direct emailing for lots of prospecting.

Jason: new sales opportunities because other states are still in lock down. Our website is exploding with requests from other states, who is manufacturing what?!

Keaton Smith, owner of Country Innovation and Supply, small labeling company.

- Serves the elementary schools
- Prices are coming down in K95 masks, 3 layer masks
- Producing pre-saturated hand sanitizing towelettes
- Turner Properties, bought 200,000 towelettes from us. Easier for them to hand out to individuals than constant company wide sanitizing. Have 20,000 employees.
- Stickers: health stickers for elementary schools.
- How about masks for kids, great for advertisers to put on washable face masks for kids.
- Noticing the trend that companies are evaluating their employees to see how well they persevered during this time. Who are their real drivers.
- We are part of an innovation with baseball training aid, may need Russ and Bruce for patents.

Brian Marshall, DieselGrid. Supply chain trucking company, 150 mile radius Atlanta.

- Visited the GMA office last Friday, loved meeting everyone in person!
- We have new automated technology coming out to communicate driver with factory
- We are thriving
