WTHR - Bill holding landlords accountable passes Indiana House



This week WTHR pushed a story indicating that the Indiana House passed a bill dealing with bad property owners. **This story is incorrect.**

FACT: The Indiana House passed a bill which would allow the Attorney General to investigate non-profit corporations that receive public funds and fail to meet their mission. Additionally, it codifies basic record requirements for non-profit corporations operating in Indiana, and adds additional remedies for a court and the Indiana Attorney General when non-profit corporations are willfully violating state law. Finally, the bill also grants a court the ability, upon petition by the Indiana Attorney General, to dissolve or put into receivership when a non-profit corporation commits gross mismanagement of property and assets.

HB 1075 (bill text in the link), as described by the bill's author and the Office of Attorney General, is targeting USA Gymnastics, an exotic animal non-profit corporation featured on the hit Netflix Show Tiger King, and JPC Affordable Housing Foundation. This bill does NOT contain any new resident protections, nor does it allow the Indiana Attorney General to investigate landlord-tenant matters. However, to read WTHR's story and the quotes from democrat lawmakers, one would think otherwise.

1. FHA seeking comments on single Section 8 program regulation and single contract form



This week the Federal Housing Administration released an advance notice of proposed rulemaking for public comment regarding "an initiative under which MFH, in partnership with owners, tenants, and other program stakeholders, would move toward a single Section 8 program regulation and single contract form pursuant to which the Secretary would renew project-based Section 8 Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) contracts under section 524 of the Multifamily Assisted Housing Reform and Affordability Act of 1997 (MAHRA)." 2. EEOC Updates guidance on ADA and hearing disabilities



On January 24, the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission published an **updated Americans** with Disabilities Act guidance containing information about how the law applies to job applicants and employees who are deaf, hard of hearing, or have other hearing conditions. The new guidance answers questions about pre- and post-job offer inquiries; technologies that may enable free or low-cost reasonable accommodation; safety concerns; and new updated scenarios of potential discrimination that address technologies such as videoconferencing software.

3. US DOL proposes rule on independent contractors



The U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) has issued a proposed rule that modifies the legal framework for determining whether a worker is an employee or an independent contractor under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) The proposed rule would eliminate the current independent contractor rule adopted by the Trump administration, which weighed two core factors (worker's control over their work and opportunity for profit or loss) in determining the status of workers. The Biden Administration is proposing a "totality of the circumstances" approach, which balances all factors equally and will likely lead to more determination that workers are employees. This will especially impact gig workers. Mondag has the full story.

4. Local: IPS delays vote on \$400M Operating Referendum....again



On Saturday, January 28, the Indianapolis Public Schools Board of School Commissioners agreed to delay a vote on a \$400M operating referendum to support the district's Rebuilding Stronger plan. The delay came a day after the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce came out against the proposal citing that "more time and engagement was required to allow the community to fully vet the current proposal." Early this year, IPS' Board of School Commissioners approved a \$410M Capital Referendum, which will appear on the May 2 ballot for those voters within the IPS School district to consider. IPS has until February 17 to certify the operating referendum for it to be placed on the May ballot. IAA is closely monitoring this situation.
