# 1. EPA seeks to eliminate the presence of lead in housing/child care facilities



On Wednesday, July 12, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposed tougher standards on lead in paint in older homes and apartments, potentially triggering its removal in millions of buildings. **The new rules would almost completely prohibit lead in dust in older buildings. The only contamination allowed would be the lowest levels that current removal efforts cannot eliminate.** The EPA estimates that this change in rules will reduce exposures from 250,000 – 500,000 children younger than age 6.

Under the proposal, after testing results of a child show the presence of lead, inspections that find any level of lead in a home or child-care facility would require the location to be classified as a lead hazard. That would trigger requirements for disclosures to families or home buyers, and in some cases that lead be reduced to levels that are functionally invisible.

2. HUD Releases Notice on Housing Trust Fund Allocation for Indiana



On Tuesday, July 11, 2023, the United States Department of HUD announced that Indiana received **\$5,391,554.02** as part of its allocation of the Housing Trust Fund. In total, \$382.4M was allocated nationwide. Click **here** for the full notice including funding for all states.

### 3. NSPIRE Inspects Public Housing July 1; Other HUD RAP's October 1



As of July 1, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has the authority to begin inspecting public housing under the Final Rule for the National Standards for the Physical Inspection of Real Estate (NSPIRE) after July 1, 2023. As of October 1, that authority will expand to all remaining HUD Rental Assistance Programs. HUD published the **final NSPIRE** rule on May 11, 2023, that made changes to inspections for the Public Housing and Multifamily Housing programs. That was followed by the NSPIRE companion publications of the **final Standards Notice** on June 22, 2023, the **Administrative Notice** on June 30, 2023, and today's publication of the **final Scoring Notice**. ### 4. HUD awards another \$30M to State and Local Fair Housing Enforcement Partners



On July 7, 2023, HUD announced more noncompetitive funding under the Fair Housing Assistance Program to provide protection against discrimination in housing. IAA has warned since the Biden Administration took office **that substantially more funding is being awarded annually for testing, education, and prosecution of these housing cases**. IAA is hosting two more Fair Housing Seminars this year that are offered virtually for **FREE** to help property staff remain educated on the latest developments and trends in fair housing enforcement.

# 5. Indiana Courts: Property Owner's lawyer fights back against Small Claims Court



On July 12, 2023, the Indiana Court of Appeals **reversed a Small Claims Court judge** who refused to grant interest on attorney fees in a post-judgement interest calculation after a damages hearing. Despite what is clearly stated in statute, some courts have begun a practice of eliminating interest from attorney fees to help residents, which is a dangerous precedent that could spread to damages directly impacting property owners. Sandlin Ferguson LLP's Jeramy Ferguson obtained the ruling, which can be relied upon in all Small Claims Courts in Marion County.

IAA commends Jeramy Ferguson (Sandlin Ferguson, LLP) and Piccadilly Management for appealing the case and obtaining favorable case law for the industry. As some judges refuse to comply with existing laws, appeals are the only method of accountability.

# 6. Local: South Bend introduces an Ordinance extending protected status to the Homeless



Councilwoman Lori Hamann filed a proposed ordinance for First Reading on July 10, 2023, amending the city's Human Rights Ordinance to prohibit discrimination based on being homeless. This protection applies for education, employment, access to public conveniences and accommodations, and the purchase or leasing of real property. Violations of the statute are prosecuted by the South Bend's Human Rights Commission. To read the full ordinance, click here.
