1. IAA Hosting Webinar on Security Deposits and Indiana Unclaimed Property on August 29



IAA has received multiple messages about Indiana's Office of the Attorney General sending "self-audit" inquiries to management companies and property owners seeking to learn how residents' unclaimed property is handled. Namely, the Unclaimed Property Division is curious regarding how residents' unclaimed security deposits are treated by properties. Under Indiana law, after three years, unclaimed property must be sent to Indiana Unclaimed, which is administered by the Attorney General. IAA is hosting a webinar to review the law on security deposits and provide a brief overview of Indiana Unclaimed. Click here to learn more and register.

2. U.S. Inflation Rises for the First Time in a Year to a 3.2% Rate



After 12 consecutive months of declines, the government reported that consumer prices increased 3.2% from a year earlier. That was up from 3% in June. While that figure is below last year's peak of 9.1%, it is still above the Federal Reserve's 2% target. A jump in energy prices has rekindled some of the inflation pressures underlying the economy. 3. Rental Housing Cost Rises to Slow Significantly Over Next 18

Months



Shelter inflation, or the pace of the rise in the cost of accommodation or housing in the U.S., is expected to "slow significantly" over the next 18 months, according to research from the Federal Reserve's Central Bank. "The forecasts we present...indicate that future shelter inflation may decline considerably, reflecting the signals of slowing in recent rental markets. At a minimum, our results imply that the risk of surprise increases in shelter inflation has become significantly smaller with the rapid rise in interest rates since early 2022." 4. Indiana Ranks 47th in Annual Pay Growth



According to a National Employment Report that looked at nearly 10M individual employees over the last year, Indiana ranked 47th. Joining Indiana was Iowa, Arkansas, New Jersey, and Delaware. Indiana's year-over-year annual pay growth was 5.2% while the median was 6.2%. Fox59 has **more**.

5. Utility Regulators Meeting with Utilities Over Responses to Storm-caused Outages



The Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) will meet with the state's "big five" investor-owned utilities about their reactions to storms a month ago. Storms left an estimated 100,000 customers without power between June 29 and July 4, which prompted consumer advocates to ask regulators for an investigation.
