May-June: 'Monthly Snapshot'

• The World in the Time of COVID-19: As we write (23.5.21), the WHO Coronavirus Disease 'dashboard' indicates that there are now 166,346,635 cases of COVID-19, including 3,449,117 deaths world-wide, an increase of 14 million cases in three weeks (compared to 1.5.21; 152,535,452 confirmed cases, including 3,198.528 deaths; 22.3.21: 22,524,424 cases, including 2,703,620 deaths; 22.2.21: 111,102,016 cases, 2,462,911 deaths; 25.1.21: 99,363,697 cases, 2,135,959 deaths; 28.12.20: 79,673,994 cases, 1,761,381 deaths; 23.11.20: 57,882,183 cases, 1,377,395 deaths; 29.10.20: 43,766,712 cases, 1,163,459 deaths; 26.7.20: 15,581,009 cases, 635,173 deaths; 20.6.20: 8,385,440 cases, 450,686 deaths; 26.4.20: 2.8million cases, 200,000 deaths). A.35million new cases were recorded this week, the lowest total since the first week in April, and just under 85,750 deaths, the lowest in five weeks - although both numbers are amongst the highest weekly totals since the pandemic began, and the death toll may be substantially undercounted. India's disastrous second wave seems to be peaking, but accounted for 45%% of all new global cases this week, with Brazil: 10%; Europe: just over 9%; the USA just under 5% - but infections are rising in South East Asia with 3% % of all cases this week; there has also been a surge in Taiwan. Economic consequences of the pandemic remain unclear, with international borders remaining largely closed. The ongoing sequelae of the pandemic will continue to be monitored.

Our monthly Division 17 E-News also provides an opportunity to reflect on other key events of the past month and the possible professional implications of these.

Ongoing uncertainty in the Middle East with war between Israel and Hamas in Gaza:

At least 230 Palestinians and 12 Israelis have been killed and Gazan cities wrecked after 11 days of fierce fighting between Israel and Hamas - with a 'mutual unconditional cease-fire' finally agreed to (20.5.21). Diplomatic attempts to secure a long-term and sustainable situation in the region remain complex if not intractable, as Israel tries to establish a workable government after four national elections in two years.

- US Congress bill to combat anti-Asian hate crimes (see item below):
 President Joe Biden has signed legislation (20.5.21) to curtail a dramatic rise in hate crimes against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, subsequent to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in early 2020. The bill was passed by a vote of 364-62 on 18.5.21.

International Congresses:

ICP: International Congress of Psychology in Prague: is to be held 'virtually' in July, 2021 (postponed from July, 2020). Our Division team will be present (via zoom) a symposium entitled: "The role of psychology in integrated mental health care: an international perspective".

Brief Description of the Symposium: An overview of current progress in integrated psychological service delivery in the primary care setting in a number of western countries. These integrated services attempt to redress the ongoing "medicalisation of unhappiness" across the western world and the sub-optimal care provided in which medication is still frequently the first (and often only) treatment of choice, leaving the crucial psychosocial dimensions of mental and general health under-treated. Integrated primary mental and general health service delivery has evolved over the past twenty years to include evidence-based psychological interventions in the primary care setting. Symposium participants will canvas progress in a number of different areas in their specific countries and provide an up-date internationally on key issues relevant to this mode of practice. All welcome to attend!
