

LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

Guiding Principles

- □ IASPA believes in and supports positive/proactive leadership from the Illinois State Board of Education and State Superintendent of Education
- IASPA believes public education must provide all students with the opportunity to develop to their fullest potential
- IASPA believes public education must promote an appreciation for cultural diversity
- □ IASPA believes the State has the responsibility for ensuring adequate and equitable funding of public education
- □ IASPA believes the most important factor in improving public education is to attract, develop and retain highly effective, high impact educators

Priority Areas

IASPA will actively support legislative initiatives that positively impact the following areas:

School Funding

- Funding the Evidence-Based Funding for Student Success Act (ESSA) and Mandated Categorical programs at levels sufficient to provide an adequate and equitable education for all students.
- □ Funding quality public education by making the education the State's primary budgetary program.

Educator Preparation

- Create opportunities that encourage early exposure to the profession through programs in high school and partnerships with teacher training institutions
- Recruitment/development/retention of a diverse educator workforce reflective of the ethnic/racial makeup of the Illinois student population
- □ Addressing the teacher shortage
 - □ Streamline the path to eligibility for Professional Educator Licensure
 - □ Reciprocity agreements
 - □ Alternative licensure programs
 - □ Substitute teacher options
 - Appropriation of funds to expand student loan forgiveness to all individuals
- □ Professional Development
 - Financial support for required mentoring (new teachers, principals, superintendents)
 - Support comprehensive, fair, objective performance evaluations of teachers and principals.

Student Learning

- □ Maintaining and strengthening of the Illinois Learning Standards
- Provision of a safe, clean, healthy learning environment, free from bullying, harassment, and any types of physical or emotional abuse.
- Adequately funded programs that provide students the opportunity to fully develop their skills and talents.
