Atypical & Designer Drugs with Laura Moss, MD

Wednesday, July 10, 1 PM

Passionate about wellness and recovery, including her own, Dr. Moss is boarded in General and Addiction Psychiatry. She was director of Women's Trauma and Recovery Center at Seattle VA, Assistant Professor at UW, and later became Med. Director and Director of the Health Care Professionals Program at HBFF, OR. Currently, she serves as Assoc. Med. Director for WA Physicians Health Program and as a Western Region Director for the Board of the Federation of State Physician Health Programs Board.



The Future of PHP with Michael Baron, MD, MPH, DFASAM, FAPA

Thursday, July 11, 10 AM

Michael Baron obtained an MD and MPH degree at Tulane University. He completed his Anesthesiology residency at Washington University in St Louis and his Psychiatry residency at Vanderbilt University. He is board certified in Anesthesiology, Psychiatry and Addiction Medicine. He is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at Vanderbilt University. In 2006, he published original research showing that high dose opioids increased chronic pain scores.

Dr. Baron was appointed to the Tennessee Board of Medical Examiners (BME) in 2010 and reappointed in 2015. He helped write many different Tennessee Department of Health rules pertaining to the treatment of pain, prescribing controlled substances, and Office-Based Opioid Treatment. He also served on two workgroups for the Federation of State Medical Boards: Physician Sexual Misconduct and Physician Illness and Impairment. Dr. Baron resigned from the Tennessee BME in January 2017 to accept the Medical Director position of the Tennessee Medical Foundation – Physician's Health Program. In 2023 he helped write 2 book chapters: Fitness for Duty for the Encyclopedia for Neurological Disorders and Supporting Patients Working in Safety Sensitive Occupations for the 4th Edition of the ASAM Criteria.

Dr. Baron joined the Federation of State Physician Health Programs in 2017. In May 2024, he was installed as President of the FSPHP.

Maureen Murphy-Ryan, M.D. is a board-certified psychiatrist specializing in Addiction Psychiatry. She graduated *magna cum laude* from Duke University and received her medical degree from the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine. She entered abstinence-based recovery from an alcohol use disorder in 2016. IDAA connections led to the opportunity to complete her disrupted residency training in Psychiatry at the University of Washington in Seattle, where she served as a Chief Resident and stayed on as a Fellow. Maureen's career goal is to leverage her skills in psychopharmacology, psychotherapy, and teaching along with her lived experience as a woman physician in recovery to make a significant impact helping others overcome addiction.



Medically Unexplained Symptoms with Mel Pohl, MD, DFASAM

Mel Pohl, MD, DFASAM is a Family Practitioner. He is the Senior Medical Consultant of the Pain Recovery Program at The Pointe Malibu Recovery Center. He is certified by the American Board of Addiction Medicine (ABAM) Dr. Pohl is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the University of Nevada School of Medicine.

He is the author of several books including *A Day without Pain*, revised edition and *The Pain Antidote - Stop Suffering from Chronic Pain, Avoid Addiction to Painkillers, and Reclaim Your Life*. Dr. Pohl filmed a show for PBS on chronic pain which aired around the country in 2016.



History of Burnout with Vita McCabe, MD

Dr. McCabe, a University of Chicago Medical School alumna and former cardiothoracic surgeon, shifted her career focus after retiring due to health issues in 2015. With a master's in health management and policy from the University of Michigan, her expertise now spans physician impairment, wellness, and resilience, deeply influenced by her personal journey and family history of addiction. McCabe has made significant contributions, including serving on the Illinois State Medical Board Impairment Council and chairing Michigan's Health Provider Assistance Committee. Her work has notably impacted policies and support systems for impaired physicians across six hospitals and within a national healthcare system, targeting the enhancement of wellness and professional satisfaction.

Recently, McCabe embraced her passion for mental health, completing a psychiatry residency and addiction psychiatry fellowship at the University of Michigan, where she will be joining as faculty in August of 2024. Outside her professional life, she enjoys a fulfilling family life with her husband Sean and their two children, Jack and Rory, and is a passionate equestrian, specializing in Saddlebred horses and embarking in competitive show riding.



All Forms of Addiction with Emily Brunner, MD

Physician Consultant, Hazelden Betty Ford Foundation

Dr. Emily Brunner is both certified in family medicine and a distinguished fellow in the field of addiction medicine. She has experience treating addiction in both inpatient and outpatient settings. She is an experienced speaker and specializes in trauma-informed clinical treatment of substance use disorders

with a comprehensive and compassionate approach.

Dr. Brunner has been involved in leadership of the Minnesota Society of Addiction Medicine and is now on the national board of the American Society of Addiction Medicine.



Diversity in Recovery with Tommie Lauer, MD

Dr. Lauer graduated in December of 1977 from UNC School of Medicine, became a resident in Psychiatry at North Carolina Baptist Hospital, Bowman Gray School of Medicine.

Private practice in psychiatry began in 1982. Sobriety was a gift of Alcoholics Anonymous in 1987. Additional training in addiction medicine resulted in becoming a Fellow of the American Society of Addiction Medicine in 1989. She served as Medical Director of High Point Regional Hospital's chemical dependency unit, which treated over 4,000 alcoholics and addicts up until her retirement in 2003.

For over twenty years she has provided morning programs in treatment centers on an every four weeks basis.



Psychosocial Aspects of Recovery with Wendy Coughlin, PhD

Derailed by a SUD in the 70's, Wendy entered recovery in 1980. By 1995 she had recovered sufficiently to complete a PhD and become eligible to join IDAA. Today IDAA is an invaluable component of her continued growth. Besides the PhD, Wendy has multiple certifications in addiction and in mental health positions serving family courts. She provides local and national trainings on how substance use disorders impact families and offers guidelines to the courts to facilitate families' reunification after being devastated by addiction.



Relapse Prevention/Intervention with Chris Darnell, MD

Christopher Darnell, MD is board certified in Family Medicine and Addiction Medicine. He worked as a general practitioner for 8 years, hospital medicine for 8 years, and has done full time Addiction Medicine for the last 4 years in the Twin Cities for HealthPartners. He currently spends half time doing inpatient consults at Regions Hospital in St. Paul, MN and spend the other half seeing patients in the outpatient setting.

Dr Darnell was born and raised in Carmel, Indiana and attended Indiana University for both undergraduate and medical school. He moved to Minneapolis in 1998 for residency and has been there since.

In his free time he enjoys traveling the world with his wife, hanging out with his dog, downhill skiing, learning and speaking French, and Lego.



Post-Inpatient and Intensive Outpatient Best Practices with Bob Levy, MD

Robert Levy M.D. is board certified in Addiction Medicine and Family Medicine. He is an associate professor of Family Medicine and Community Health at the University of Minnesota and a fellow of the American Society of Addiction Medicine. In addition to his teaching responsibilities, he also practices full-spectrum family medicine, including obstetrics. He is the Immediate Past President of the Minnesota Society of Addiction Medicine. He recently received a grant from SAMHSA to help Minnesota address the opioid and stimulant epidemic. In 2018 he was awarded the Minnesota Society of Family Medicine Teacher of the Year award. His interests are in complex withdrawal management, chronic pain management, the integration of addiction treatment into primary

care, and addiction in pregnancy and the neonatal period.

Dr. Bundy is the Executive Medical Director of the Washington Physicians Health Program (WPHP) and Immediate Past President of the Federation of State Physician Health Programs. Dr. Bundy draws on his experience as a healthcare leader, medical educator, and physician in recovery to support education and advocacy efforts related to physician health and well-being.
