Tilly Receives Fellowship

Charles Tilly, Center for Research on Social Organization, University of Michigan, was one of thirteen scholars selected to receive German Marshall Fund Fellowships in the Fund's ninth annual competition. The awards are designed to support research into significant contemporary economic, political, and social developments involving the United States and Europe. They support full-time research and writing for up to one year.

Tilly's research involves an examination of how in France, as in most other western countries, the principal means of collective action ordinary people use today took shape during the 19th century. He will examine how the development of capitalism and the concentration of power in the national state interacted to transform the interests and organization of ordinary Frenchmen, and to alter the circumstances in which they banded together to act on their shared interests.

Call for papers on social network measurement

We are developing plans for issues of Social Networks devoted to measurement. We want the coverage to be as broad as possible, and we hope that the set of papers will be a benchmark for further contributions. Consequently, areas for discussions will include enumeration of ties, mapping structures from the ties on a set of actors, and interrelations of those levels (the effects of tie measurement on structure and vice versa). The overall framework we propose is to explore continuities, clarifications, and extensions which arise from applications here of the concepts of neoclassical test theory (true score, systematic and random error; reliability and validity; content, criterion and construct validations; robustness; etc.). As suggested, we will select contributions to achieve comprehensiveness, but this will not rule out papers dealing with specific techniques, substantive problems, or data sets. Abstracts from Social Networks 5 (3) (1983)

Gabriel WEIMANN (Haifa). "The strength of weak conversational ties in the flow of information and influence"

The "Strength of Weak Ties" theory is used to analyze the flow of information and influence in the network of conversational ties in a kibbutz community.

The flow of six information items and two decision-making items was measured by indicators of communicative efficiency - speed, accuracy and credibility. The strength of ties activated and the direction of the flow (within groups or between groups) was analyzed.

The findings reveal the actual, everyday functioning of weak ties as inter-group bridges, confirming the "Strength of Weak Ties" claim.

The communicative advantages of weak ties are examined, applying structural analysis methods. The tendency of weak ties towards intransitivity and low multiplexity, is suggested to account for their frequent activation as inter-group bridges.

The findings highlight the potential of social network analysis as a bridge between micro-level interaction and macro-level patterns including diffusion of innovation, formation of public opinion and social solidarity. Weak ties serve as the crucial paths between groups, thus providing the means by which individual behavior and ideas, originating in small face-to-face groups, are routinized and agglomerated into large-scale patterns.

Stephen B. SEIDMAN (George Mason). "Network structure and minimum degree"

Social network researchers have long sought measures of network cohesion. Density has often been used for this purpose, despite its generally admitted deficiencies. An approach to network cohesion is proposed that is based on minimum degree and which produces a sequence of subgraphs of gradually increasing cohesion. The approach also associated with any network measures of local density which promise to be useful both in characterizing network structures and in comparing networks.

Gabriel WEIMANN (Haifa). "The not-so-small world: ethnicity and acquaintance networks in Israel"

The present study applies the small world method to examine cross-ethnic acquaintance networks in Israeli society. The experimental design consisted of 144 starting persons who were presented with either an Oriental or Ashkenazi target person, thus yielding four types of ethnic combinations: (1) Ashkenazi to Ashkenazi; (2) Ashkenazi to Oriental; (3) Oriental to Oriental; and (4) Oriental to Ashkenazi. The various chains are analyzed by measures of activation efficiency, completion rates and length of chains, as well as probabilistic analysis for small world statistics. Finally, the analysis focuses on the intergroup bridges, the "gatekeepers" who perform the crossing of the ethnic boundary.

The findings prove that acquaintance networks in Israeli society are impinged upon by ethnic distinction, thus rejecting the "integration-through-modernization" concept. While ethnic segregation in Israel was empirically documented in the political, cultural and economic aspects of social life, the present study's main contribution is in highlighting the interpersonal dimension of ethnicity.

Ian McALLISTER (Australian National). "Social contacts and political behaviour in Northern Ireland, 1968-78"

Using Northern Ireland as a case study, this note examines the political consequences of different types of social contacts between two rigidly segregated religious communities. Multivariate analysis is applied to two large sample surveys, one collected in 1968 before the present civil disturbances began, the other in 1978, some nine years after the start of the violence. The results show that while social contacts between friends, workmates or neighbours of the opposite religion have no consistent political importance, social contacts with relatives by marriage of the opposite religion is significant for both surveys. Certain types of social contact therefore have a stronger political contact than others, and in the context of Northern Ireland social contacts involving immediate kin are more important than other forms of contact.

David W. CONRATH and Christopher A. HIGGINS (Waterloo) and Ronald J. McCLEAN (York). "A comparison of the reliability of questionnaire versus diary data"

The crucial role that communication plays in organizations has led to the development of various methodologies to collect communications data. Two of the more common techniques are one-shot questionnaires and self-recording diaries completed at the time of the interaction. Questionnaires are often viewed as unreliable since they are based on the memory and perceptions of the participants. Diaries, on the other hand, are considered to be more reliable since they are completed immediately following an interaction when the event is still fresh in the individual's mind. This paper compares the cross-recorder reliability of these two data collection instruments. A reliability measure which indicates the degree to which an individual concurs as to the occurrence of interactions across all individuals is introduced. The results, based on studies in three organizations involving 49, 61 and 110 participants respectively, indicate that diary data are significantly more reliable than data obtained from questionnaires.

Dirigé par les professeurs Jacques Alary et Claude Brodeur, ce groupe travaille à la mise au point d'un nouveau mode d'intervention psycho-sociale: l'intervention de réseaux.

THESIS SUMMARIES

Susan H. FOLEY (*Public Health, Columbia*). 1984 "Social networks and self-perceptions of health"

Research on social factors and health status has produced a substantial body of evidence which generally indicates that social ties and health are related. The consistency of the finding across a wide variety of health outcomes together with directional evidence from a few longitudinal studies suggests that the association is largely due to the influence of social ties on the individual's general susceptibility to disease. It has been proposed that this influence takes place through a biologic mechanism which is sensitive to emotional and psychological stimuli.

Data from the National Survey of Personal Health Practices and Consequences (National Center for Health Statistics, 1979-1980) were used to establish the existence of an association between measures of

Survey data, which contains social network information on a broad cross-section of United States residents, were also used to explore the factors which give rise to the relationship. The role of potential confounds and the direction of effects were examined, and a possible model for the social networks--self-perceived health relationship was developed. The association remained significant when controls for age, sex, race, education and income were introduced, and appeared to be due, at least in part, to the influence of social networks on self-perceived health. That influence was largely indirect: social networks affected self-perceived health most via their influence on general psychological well-being. Such a mode of influence is consistent with the theory of general susceptibility. Thus, the association between social networks and a global measure of health corroborates the evidence for a general relationship between social contact and health provided by the multitude of studies of the association between social support and various specific health outcomes.

Kathleen L. GREGORY (*Anthro, Northwestern*). 1984 "Signing-up: the culture and careers of silicon valley computer people"

Rapid change, related to technological innovation and marketplace uncertainties, is the central feature of Silicon Valley's (Santa Clara County, California) computer industry. I studied this complex environment through the cultural perspectives of technical professionals (software and hardware engineers, marketers, technical writers, and technical managers). My central research questions were: how do insiders conceptualize careers in this turbulent environment? and, how do the trajectories of larger contexts (e.g., projects, companies, the industry as a whole) interact with individuals' careers?

The dissertation has three parts: (1.) an introduction, that defines theoretical concepts (culture, careers, and rapidly changing environments), places this study in context with careers research, presents a theoretical framework for studying careers anthropologically, and discusses ethnographic methodology;

R.J. RICHARDSON (Soc., Toronto). "A 'structural-rational' theory of financial-nonfinancial directorship interlocks"

Among the longest-running current debates within the field of social networks is the one concerning the function and consequences of directorship interlocks. Although there are well over 100 empirical analyses of this topic, their results have been generally inconclusive and contradictory. This seems to have been primarily the result of a tendency toward conceptual imprecision and a history of advocacy-oriented research.

Of course, there are important exceptions to these general assertions. We have learned much from advanced network analytical techniques about the structure of networks of intercorporate relationships. But we still know very little about the consequences of these structures (Carrington, 1981).

This paper presents an original theory of the functions and consequences of directorship interlocks between financial and nonfinancial corporations. The theory, in turn, results from an attempt to develop a logically consistent and conceptually precise synthesis of elements of the theories of interorganizational cooptation, finance capital and financial control, along with elements from exchange theory and organizational behaviour. This synthesis is seen as the beginning of a "Structural-Rational" theory of intercorporate relationships: "Structural", because it follows the network analytic paradigm's emphasis on social structure and process; "Rational", because it attempts to attribute instrumentally rational meaning to the actions of the social actors involved. Thus, relationships between financial and nonfinancial corporations will reflect the tension between goal seeking actions by those in command of dominant corporations and the constraints of socio-economic structures.

This theory is strongly supported in an empirical analysis of the top 50 financial and 150 nonfinancial corporations in the postwar Canadian economy.

Rumi Kato PRICE (Sociology, Cal, Berkeley).

The objective of my Ph.D. thesis will be to show the manners in which the structures of social environments, as seen in the network structure, constrains individuals' ability to change their behavior. Taking advantage of panel data on social networks, psychosocial and health-related data, I shall study the re-entry process of heroin addicts to their "normal" communities. The structural descriptions of their ego-networks will use such computer packages as STRUCTURE, and SSA-I. The focus would be the complexity of relational domains in the addicts' social life rather than of their positions that could be generated from metric variables such as network size, density and multiplexity. My planned temporal analysis, using simple differential equation models, is aimed at capturing addicts' re-entry process to the "normal" society.

COMPUTER STUFF

OSIRIS Meets Egocentric Networks

OSIRIS IV, Release 7 includes a new program for aggregating individual records (e.g., network members) into group records (e.g., network summary statistics; focal individual info.) by computing the summary descriptive stats for the larger group. OSIRIS itself is a SAS-like package, with the usual regressions and xtabs, plus good recoding, matrix input/output and the ability to handle both rectangular and hierarchical datasets.
