"We received more than 1,500 applications from U.S. medical students and physicians from all around the world," says Alfred Gitu, M.D., Program Director of the residency program at Lee Health. "Our program continues to grow and expand with residents who are passionate, compassionate and academically strong. The new class of residents scored in the top 20% in the nation on the United States Medical Licensing Examination, and they are dedicated to caring for the underserved."

Based at Lee Memorial Hospital with The Florida State University College of Medicine as its institutional sponsor, the residency program was created to abate the shortage of primary care physicians anticipated nationally, an issue that is compounded locally by rapid population growth in Southwest Florida. Medical school graduates are required to complete residency training in their chosen specialty to become independently practicing physicians.

Statistically, about 60% of residents will practice medicine in the same area in which they are trained. Since 2014, when the program started, 18 of the 32 graduates (56%) of The Florida State University College of Medicine Family Medicine Residency Program at Lee Health have stayed in Southwest Florida following graduation from the program. Four graduates of the residency program were accepted into fellowship programs with one planning to return to the area to practice medicine following her fellowship training. Membership news for Nov. 

One of the greatest achievements that our local society has made over the years is the creation and

continual funding of the Physician Wellness Program. As part of your yearly physician dues, you have access to up to eight meetings with a licensed psychologist. This year alone has seen an increase in utilization of this fantastic program.



It will be a challenge this coming year to fund this excellent and essential program. Our physicians need and many rely on the ability to have access to mental healthcare. We have seen a significant increase in physician burnout rates and physician suicide. We NEED to continue to support our colleagues' mental well-being. The annual 5K charity race directly funds this program. I hope that we will see our community step up to the challenge of participating in this charity run/walk. Keeping Focused on the Passion

This year is nearly over but Covid continues, uncertainty reigns supreme and everything seems a mess. A week or so, at my virtual staff meeting, I was hashing over such uncertainties when my membership coordinator, Diana, said something to me so poignant and appropriate. Don't forget why you are passionate about the Medical Society. Her comment was the words I needed at that very moment; an encouragement to look up from the weeds and see the big picture. Too often, and especially this year, we get bogged down with the little details and forget the main mission and purpose of why we do what we do. As physicians, I am sure that all the things that include insurance payments, government regulations, Covid liabilities, financial strain and HR stressors can cloud the real reason you became a physician.

The mission of the Lee County Medical Society is to advocate for physicians and their relationships with patients; promote public health and uphold the professionalism of the practice of medicine. We have definitely lived this mission in 2020 by advocating for physicians and patients with a mask mandate letter to officials, a letter to the Florida Governor requesting that elective services restart in May, creating a Public Service Announcement video encouraging the public to wear masks, providing PPE to over 100 physician offices in Lee County, and opening up our Physician Wellness Program to ALL physicians in Lee County regardless of membership status.

My passion for the past 5 years within the Society has been about physician mental wellness. Losing a physician 5 years ago, who was my own age and had a similar family life to mine, left a great impact on me. I am so thankful that our physician leaders saw the need to act quickly and create a program to help physicians stay mentally healthy. If you are not familiar with this membership benefit, please let me share with you my passion!

The Medical Society has a great program that allows physician members (and non-members until December 31, 2020) to see a vetted psychologist 8

times a calendar year to talk about things that are causing mental stress. These topics can include family issues, relationship problems, work related difficulties, burnout, stress management, health issues and if



needs be, mood swings and suicidal thoughts. These psychologists use their usual protocols to refer to physiatrist when it is appropriate. The beauty of this program is that it is confidential and free. No staff at the Medical Society knows who has visits. Monies raised for the Foundation pay for the visits.

This year the program has been used by almost 40 physicians. A new trend of physicians being seen, is that physicians are recommending their physician colleagues to the program. This is great in so many ways. It shows that despite being behind a mask, physicians are caring for their fellow physicians. It shows that this program is a testament to the quality of care that is being given.
