Alt+Shift

- Alt+Shift contractor Joel Selby recently provided an <u>ADA digital accessibility</u> federal rule update and a comparison of <u>WCAG 2.1 Level AA standards</u> versus previous standards in <u>WCAG 2.0</u> for the Michigan School Public Relations Association.
- "Quick Wins" are short, self-paced modules focused on a specific topic.

Data Collection

- The Part B FFY 2023 State Performance Plan/Annual Performance Report (SPP/APR) has been submitted as of February 1, 2025.
- The federal regulations implementing the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) at §300.602(b)(1)(i)(A) require public reporting on the performance of each local education agency in Michigan on the targets established in the SPP/APR. For a two-week period beginning approximately May 7, 2025, Intermediate School Districts (ISDs) and member districts will be able to preview ISD and member district level data.
- By June 1, 2025, the ISD and member district level data will be publicly available at: MI School Data portal.

Since 1993, Michigan ISDs have participated in a federal and state-funded Medicaid reimbursement program.
