What's New?

Alt+Shift

- Alt+Shift utilizes a phased approach to partnerships with intermediate school
 districts (ISDs) to strengthen their capacity to sustain implementation efforts
 at member districts and ISD programs. The approach yields improved
 outcomes for all learners. Visit the Partnership Page on our website to learn

- Two new "Quick Wins" have been added to our website: <u>Assistive Technology</u> <u>Fundamentals</u> and <u>Assistive Technology Skills Inventory</u>.
- <u>3D printed assistive technology</u> Select low-tech assistive technology can currently be 3D printed and shipped at no cost to Michigan public schools.
- On April 24, 2024, the Federal Register published the final rule updating regulations for Title II of the *Americans with Disabilities Act*, with specific requirement regarding web content and mobile applications. The <u>fact sheet</u> provides a summary of the rule.

Low Incidence Outreach (LIO)

MDE-LIO will begin a transition to separate our operations into two divisions.
The purpose of this is to help the field clearly identify who we are and who
we serve. Part of this reorganization will entail rebranding with two separate
names: Michigan Department of Education Resource for Blind or Low Vision
(MDE-RBLV) and Michigan Department of Education Resource for Deaf or
Hard of Hearing (MDE-RDHH).

Additionally, we are changing our use of "Blind or Visually Impaired" to "Blind or Low Vision." This reflects a shift away from outdated language toward more inclusive language, much like updating "hearing impaired" to "hard of hearing".

These changes will be gradual, with updates to our website, communications, and materials being made over the next year. Please stay tuned to the MDE-



<u>LIO email list</u> and <u>MDE-LIO website</u> for more communication about the change.

Michigan Alliance for Families (MAF)

- MAF staff support families through outreach, mentoring, and by providing a wealth of printed and electronic information and resources throughout the year.
- The MAF training team has grown to include a new part-time early childhood and youth training specialist. Kelsey Biswanger, one of the Oakland County regional parent mentors will move to her new role this fall.
- MAF recently hired two new regional parent mentors to cover openings in Northern Oakland and Northern Macomb counties as well as the central region of the state that covers Clinton, Eaton, Ingham, and Shiawassee counties. The mentors will begin working with families once they complete their four to six-week training period.



- MAF provides information through a wide variety of virtual learning opportunities with MAF staff and partner agencies; recorded videos; and courses that are free to families, educators, and caregivers. - The Leaders in Policy Advocacy Series (LIPA) has wrapped up. LIPA is a leadership development program for adults with developmental disabilities and parents of minor children with developmental disabilities. - MAF continues to collaborate with Disability Network Southwest Michigan
 (DNSWM) for the DD Council's Family Empowerment Initiative through the
 end of 2024. This initiative works with local and statewide disability
 organizations to educate family members of children (birth-12) to raise
 expectations families have for their children with developmental disabilities to
 live self-determined lives. Training will continue to be announced on our

- MAF continues to work with the OPTIMISE core planning team, taskforce, and action teams. The goal is to build, support, and sustain a new education system that can enthusiastically attract, prepare, and retain an effective and diverse special education workforce to serve individuals across Michigan. Michigan's MTSS Technical Assistance Center (MiMTSS TAC)

- MiMTSS TA Center, in partnership with the Michigan Department of Education, has shifted terminology from social, emotional, behavioral (SEB) to social, emotional, behavioral health (SEBH). <u>Transition of SEB to SEBH</u> is a one-page document describing the language shift.
- Passing of Senate Bills 567 & 568 (Literacy bills)
 - MiMTSS TA Center will provide professional learning opportunities to support the requirements of the legislation.
- Two SEB professional learning specialists were recently hired. One with a PKelementary classroom strategies focus and the other with an elementarymiddle school classroom strategies focus.

Special Education Mediation Services (SEMS)

 As a result of continued increases in referrals, SEMS trained 14 new mediators and facilitators over the summer.

Statewide Autism Resources and Training (START) Project

- Paths to Learning is START's training framework. Designed to give learners the opportunity to direct their professional development experience through flexible options and formats, START's Paths to Learning involves both live learning opportunities (in-person and virtual) and self-paced learning.
- The 24th Annual START Conference will be held on April 28, 2025 at the Lansing Center in Lansing. More details, including conference presenter information, will be available on the <u>START website</u> later this fall. Registration will open in January 2025.
- START is excited to introduce new and updated Peer to Peer resources.
 - The Peer to Peer Elementary Curriculum is an organized package of resources that Peer to Peer teams can use at the Elementary level to structure their Peer to Peer implementation. Flexibility is also built into the curriculum given the unique needs of each Peer to Peer program.



- Both the <u>Elementary</u> and <u>Secondary</u> Peer to Peer Playbooks have been updated and revised. The Playbook is designed to assist school teams in creating or enhancing elementary Peer to Peer programs by providing comprehensive guidance, essential resources, and ready-touse materials for developing high-quality programs.
