Michigan's Integrated Behavior and Learning Support Initiative (MiBLSi)

- MiBLSi is piloting Math Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) in Dewitt Public Schools.
- Three MiBLSi staff were recently hired and housed at Alpena-Montmorency-Alcona ESD, Copper Country ISD, and Kent ISD.

Accessible Learning Environments (ALE)

- As of October 1, Michigan's Integrated Technology Supports (MITS) and Michigan's Integrated Mathematics Initiative (Mi)² have merged under the working title of Accessible Learning Environments (ALE). Jeff Diedrich is the Project Director. Jim Stachowiak, who was hired in May as the Coordinator of MITS and MI², is the Coordinator of the Project. Laura Taylor is the project's Assistive Technology Implementation Specialist. Kate Fanelli is the program's Math Accessibility Specialist. Cheryl Barry is the project's Administrative Assistant and the project will soon be hiring a new Lending Library Coordinator/Production Assistant.
- ALE is presenting several presentations at AssisTechKnow, including Consideration of AT:
 What is That?, Pure Michigan-Resources for Michigan Educators, and I Have Something to
 Say: Giving Students with Complex Communication Needs a Voice on October 9 and 10 at
 Kent ISD, Grand Rapids. There will also be an exhibitor booth at the conference.

- ALE is planning cooperative presentations on Content of the IEP and Considering AT in the IEP with Michigan Alliance for Families throughout the state. Presentations will take place at various locations throughout the state until May of 2015.
- ALE conducted a presentation for a public school system on August 19 on Accessible Educational Environments. This presentation introduced universal supports and universal design for learning (UDL) as beginning strategies to meet the needs of a wide range of learners. It will be followed up with presentations on targeted and intensive supports in November and March.
- Site visits will be scheduled for follow-up support for districts that have recently been trained in Pragmatic Organization Dynamic Display (PODD) including the regions hosting trainings this school year. The purpose is to ensure that practices are implemented with fidelity to ensure students have accessible communication strategies in place.
- ALE is providing professional development sessions for special education teachers with an ISD on October 16 and 21 on consideration of assistive technology and helpful assistive technology in Browser-Based and iPad settings.
- Foundations of Math with Dr. Chris Cain held two 2-day previews (Howell and Marquette) for the 5-day course developed at the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction to prevent and address math disabilities. It is a pedagogical content focused training for mixed audiences of K-12 educators, administrators, consultants and parents. Feedback is overwhelming positive and we are in the planning process to offer the 5-day course.
- Enhancing Mathematics Instruction for Students with Learning Difficulties we have 12 scheduled course implementations for the 2014-2015 school year at 10 sites around the state.
- ALE is collaborating with Detroit Area of Teachers of Mathematics to do one-day training in southeast Michigan with a focus on assisting general education teachers who teach students with special needs.
- ALE is offering a 3-part webinar series on accessible math instruction as part of the collaborative webinar series headed by Ohio Center for Autism and Low Incidence (OCALI).

Michigan Special Education Mediation Program (MSEMP)

- The MSEMP is scheduled to conduct workshops on collaborative communication and conflict resolution in special education for parents in Sanilac, Detroit, Cadillac, Muskegon, and Van Buren in October and November.
- The program also is scheduled to conduct presentations for the Michigan Association of School Social Workers, Michigan Association of School Boards, and the Michigan Association of Community Mental Health Boards on November 6, 8, and 19 respectively.

Michigan Transition Outcomes Project (MI-TOP)

• MI-TOP completed analysis and presented findings from district community conversations with staff, families, and community partners. The 19 community conversations

represented 504 local school districts. Findings emphasized the consensus among participants that transition planning needs to start earlier, it needs increased family involvement, and that interagency cash transfer agreements (ICTAs) and strong relationships are critical to providing the resources and services needed for successful student outcomes.

Reaching and Teaching Struggling Learners (RTSL)

- RTSL is in process of receiving the first round of applications for Cohort 1 schools. There will be an announcement of participating schools in the coming months and begin training the regional coaching teams to support early 2015 implementation.

Durand is currently a professor/researcher at USF-St. Petersburg and is an advisory board member for the Autism Society of America. Durand is co-editor of the *Journal of Positive Behavior Interventions* and author of 100 research publications and 10 books, including abnormal psychology textbooks used at more than 1,000 universities worldwide. Major themes of his research are the assessment and treatment of severe behavior problems for children and adults with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and other severe disabilities, parent training and the development of treatments for child sleep problems. His most recent book is the award-winning *Optimistic Parenting: Hope and Help for You and Your Challenging Child,* a guide for parents and caregivers of children with ASD.
