WHAT's NEW?

Michigan Alliance for Families (MAF)

- Michigan Alliance for Families filled five parent mentor vacancies this fall. The MAF is happy to welcome the new parent mentors who began training and work in October and November. Vacancies in these regions have been filled: Genesee/Tuscola, Macomb, Eastern UP, northern-lower Michigan, and Kalamazoo.
- The MAF was awarded additional funding to increase the amount of advocacy services available for parents. The MAF contracts with nonprofit advocacy organizations throughout the state for free parent advocacy services.
- In October, the MAF began a new series of One-Day Regional Events. These learning
 opportunities are provided for parents, school personnel, and anyone interested in
 learning about the basic foundations of an individualized education program (IEP); the IEP
 process and procedures; and tools for resolving special education issues. The events are

Michigan's Integrated Behavior and Learning Support Initiative (MiBLSi)

- The 2016 Application for Participation in Michigan's Project for Promoting Positive School Climate is now available on the MiBLSi website (www.miblsi.org). This project works to develop local implementation capacity of positive behavior intervention and support (PBIS) at the intermediate school district (ISD) and local educational agency (LEA) level. Applications are due December 16.
- Last year MiBLSi supported more than 639 professional development events (approximately 3,800 hours) in the implementation and support of an integrated multitiered system of support (MTSS) model.
- There are currently 94 online MiBLSi learning modules posted to Michigan Virtual University's LearnPort website (www.learnport.org).
- Based on a capacity assessment (developed in partnership with the State Implementation and Scaling-up of Evidence-based Practice (SISEP) National Center), the longer ISDs/LEAs have been working with MiBLSi, the greater the capacity to support local implementation of MTSS.

Accessible Learning Environments (ALE)

The project:

- Changed its name to **Alt+Shift:** Rethink the possible. Realize potential. The new name captures the essence of the project's work, which is to encourage alternative instructional practices to address learner variability, requiring a shift in adult behaviors.
- Conducted Introductory Pragmatic Organization Dynamic Display (PODD) trainings in two intermediate school districts (ISDs) for 100 participants.

- Made three presentations during the AssisTechKnow conference at Kent ISD in Grand Rapids:
 - Designing Your Learning Environment to Reach Every Student (25 participants)
 - Accessible Educational Materials: Beyond Bookshare, Making Your Classroom Materials Accessible (25 participants)
 - Strengthening Mathematics Instruction and Understanding for Students with Disabilities (25 participants)
- Began conducting "bug-in-ear" coaching trials (coach watching remotely and providing feedback via an ear piece the teacher wears) for PODD implementation with weekly observations (ongoing until January).
- Made two presentations for parents on aided language input via PODD at the Traverse Bay Area ISD.
- Hosted a retreat for those who have been trained in advanced PODD methods to discuss support of PODD implementation on a regional basis.
- Presented on accessible learning environments that meet the needs of all learners for the Leaders in Policy Advocacy group.
- Continued work with the Computer Science Engineering and Information Technology (CSEIT) group on developing a needs assessment for usability testing.
- Began recruiting small districts or K-12 feeder systems to be sites for Foundations of Math
 usability testing in 2016 and 2017. Sites will benefit by having entire district or system
 trained, being able to offer the training regionally going forward, and gaining insight into
 their own capacity to implement and sustain new practices. If interested in being a

- Developed support for development of Tier 2 Elementary and Secondary resources based on *Foundations of Math* pedagogy.
- Hosted days 4 and 5 of Foundations of Math in Traverse City and Novi with 94 participants.
- Hosted a retreat for regional assistive technology contacts to develop action items around best practices in assistive technology implementation.
- Conducted two one-day, hands-on accessible document training sessions for MDE staff with a total of 42 participants.
- Hosted Creating a Chrome Toolbox for Supporting Struggling Learners training for 11 participants.
