- Brigance IED III is approved for Child Outcomes Summary Forms (COSF) assessment, effective July 1, 2016.
- Effective September 1, 2016 assessment data used to determine preschool special education eligibility may now be used for the COSF assessment data component. The completed assessment tool must be within the past 30 school days in order to use it for COSF.
- A reminder the COSF must be completed within 30 school days of the first receipt of special education services/programs for preschool aged children (2 ½ - 5 years of age).
