WHAT'S NEW?

Michigan Alliance for Families (MAF)

Parent Engagement Project (PEP):

 During the 2015–2016 school year, MAF initiated a pilot project called the Parent Engagement Project (PEP). In addition to the other services, programs, and learning opportunities provided for parents and districts, the PEP focuses on identification of resources in a district and creating collaboration between schools, parent groups, and multiple organizations and agencies within the community. Ypsilanti and Saline were the first districts to participate in the initial PEP.

During the 2016–2017 school year, MAF expanded the PEP and added Mecosta-Osceola Intermediate School District (MOISD) and the Chippewa Hills School District. This is the first time an ISD has been a focused participant in the PEP.

Throughout the 2016–2017 school year, MAF collaborated with MOISD extensively, including:

- Multiple planning meetings with administrators from MOISD and County administrators.
- Meetings and presentations with MOISD and Chippewa Hills staff.
- Parent advisory committee meetings.
- Learning opportunities.
- Stakeholder meetings at Big Raids and Mecosta.

Collaboration and support of an ISD in the PEP is a new opportunity for MAF to reach more districts and parents and families. The programs and services MAF can provide can be tailored to the needs identified by the ISD and the districts.

• MAF and MOISD identified goals for the 2017–2018 school year, including:

- Involvement with incarcerated youth facilities to make parents aware of programs and services available through MAF.
- Facilitation by MAF to increase collaboration and involvement between MOISD, MAF, and the Office of Special Education (OSE) IDEA Grant Funded Initiatives.
- Facilitation by MAF for greater collaboration and involvement between MAF, MOISD, and restorative justice programs.

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- Intensive focus on free appropriate public education (FAPE) and least restrictive environment (LRE) issues, including learning opportunities for parents as well as for ISD and district staff members.

- The <u>Alt+Shift website</u> (altshift.education) is now live.
- Foundations of Communication: Module 1 training has been developed and is available for sites interested and ready to work on communication for students who use Alternative and Augmentative Communication and have complex communication needs.
- Pragmatic Organization Dynamic Display (PODD) Implementation Sites have been established across the state and will begin to engage in training and implementation supports during the upcoming school year.
- Two new *Foundations of Math* usability study and implementation support sites have been added for the upcoming school year.
- Based on user feedback, *Enhancing Mathematics Instruction for Students With Learning Difficulties* is undergoing revisions and will be offered as a statewide training and facilitator certification in November.

Statewide Autism Resources and Training (START)

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- During the 2016–2017 academic year, more than 900 teachers, parents, social workers, and administrators attended START Early Childhood, K–12, and Building Your Future (BYF) Intensive Trainings, while another 627 people attended statewide trainings on selfmanagement, education-based evaluations, educational supports and strategies, and peerto-peer supports.
- START's 16th annual conference was held May 1 at the Kellogg Conference and Event Center in East Lansing. The theme of this year's conference was Integrated Supports Through the Lifespan. The 532 people in attendance heard keynote presentations from Ilene Schwartz, Jessica Minahan, and Randy Lewis. The speakers touched on topics including employment, inclusion, and supporting those with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) in school, at work, and in the community.
- The START Passport, a tool to assist families and school personnel in ensuring that typical grade-appropriate opportunities and experiences are provided for students with ASD, is now available in both Spanish and Arabic. It is also available in a non-ASD specific form for use with any student with an IEP. To find out more information about the Passport, visit the <u>START website</u> (gvsu.edu/autismcenter).
