• MAASE/MICC Initiative

The MICC Fiscal Ad Hoc Committee and the MAASE Early Childhood Community of Practice are collaborating to explore the viability of a single unified system that serves a single cohort of infants and toddlers eligible for both *Early On* early intervention services and Michigan Mandatory Special Education. The first committee meeting was held in May where survey data was reviewed to ascertain the field's perspective on the concept.

- Early Childhood Personnel Center (ECPC)
 On May 22, a representative from the ECPC at the University of Connecticut worked with a
 Michigan team to develop a plan to coordinate early childhood personnel development
 initiatives in the state. The state team consisted of representatives from Higher Education,

 who have at least one year with a risk ratio greater than 3.0 for over-identification or

- June 20, 2017 <u>BrailleNote Touch Basics Workshop</u> Lansing, MI Join Peter Tucic and Jim Sullivan of HumanWare for an introductory review of the BrailleNote Touch and its educational benefits for elementary, middle, and high school students.
- June 20, 2017 to June 21, 2017 Outdoor Education Workshop: Confidence Greenville, MI

 Middle school students in grades 6th-8th are encouraged to sign up and attend this 2 day/1 night workshop at Camp Tuhsmeheta. Middle school students are developmentally ready to discover and test their physical, social-emotional and mental capabilities. The program will include one-touch self-defense training, outdoor recreation activities and team-building challenges which are all focused on building self-determination.
