#### What's New?

#### Alt+Shift

- Training began at two sites for Foundations of Math: Teaching Students with Significant Disabilities. We are piloting a training and implementation format that presents the content in a series of short presentations. The presentations are spread out over a longer length of time and interspersed with strategic implementation planning for on-going, job-embedded supports as practitioners enact their new learning.
- The Assistive Technology Journey, a 40-hour symposium led by Mike Marotta and Carolyn O'Hearn, began at three intermediate school districts (ISDs). This symposium includes face-to-face training, online coaching sessions, and online experiences including webinars and Twitter chats. The symposium will continue throughout the 2018-2019 school year and includes strategic implementation planning as sites work to construct systems that support a collaborative approach to assistive technology services.

# Office of Great Start/Office of Early Childhood Development and Family Education (OGS-ECDFE), Office of Great Start/Office of Preschool and Out-of-School Time Learning (OGS-POSTL)

- The MDE *Early On* team is finishing reviews of the applications made for the new state funding under section 54d grants. Future communication will share common themes found in the requests and plans. In addition, the team worked with CEPI on the initial data collection needs that were generated by this new legislation. Immediate attention to the REP is requested to ensure that all ISDs are entering personnel assigned to providing services for *Early On*.
- Early On local service areas will benefit from over \$2 million in re-purposed funds awarded Michigan through the Races to the Top Early Learning Challenge. Each ISD was able to designate need for hearing and vision screening equipment/materials, and additional resources have been ordered to support the SSIP focus on social-emotional health of infants and toddlers.
- Vanessa Winborne retired as Michigan's Part C Coordinator on October 5. Interviews for her replacement will occur in December.



#### **Statewide Autism and Resources Training (START)**

- START's 2018-2019 Early Childhood, K-12, and Building Your Future (BYF) year one intensive training series continues at four locations across the state. The host sites for these trainings are: Shiawassee Regional Education Service District (RESD)/Baker College of Owosso (Early Childhood), Jackson ISD (BYF), Oakland Schools (K12), and Jackson ISD (BYF).
