

SBA ESTABLISHES INSTITUTE

As unveiled during the opening session of the Metal Building Contractors & Erectors Conference in Stone Mountain, Georgia, the SBA has established a new arm of the association. The Institute will be the metal building contractor and erector voice in many crucial areas of influence and need.

Specifically, the Metal Buildings Institute[™] will be responsible for the following initiatives:

- Contractor Certification Program
- Management Training
- Erection Training
- General Education
- Safety
- Regulatory Issues
- Legislative Issues
- ·Liaison with Associations and **Professional Societies**
- The Metal Building Contractors & **Erectors Conference**

As for the Systems Builders Association, it will be responsible for:

- Administration and management of both the Systems Builders Association, and the Metal Buildings Institute
- Membership Growth and Retention
- Member Services and Programs
- Chapter Administration and Management
- Financial Controls

The current leadership will be responsible for both the SBA, and the Metal Buildings Institute™. The Institute will be an extension of the association, reaching out to professional organizations, legislative and regulatory bodies, and to building owners and users.

Your association's leadership determined that the "mental picture" of a contractor boasting that his or her company is certified by the Metal Buildings Institute™ is extremely positive. INSTITUTE QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

As a member of the SBA, you may have a question pertaining to the Metal Buildings Institute[™]. The Institute is a major part of SBA's long-range strategic plan to provide the highest possible level of benefits to its membership, and to promote our industry to the general public. Here are some common questions and answers about the Institute:

Is the Metal Buildings Institute™ another organization that I will be asked to join?

No. The Institute is a member service formed as an educational arm of the association, and will be operated by the association for the benefit of our industry.

Will there be dues or fees associated with the Institute?

No. There will be no dues associated with the Institute. Programs that already or would otherwise involve fees will continue to do so. For example, the contractor certification program is currently funded through fees paid by participants, and through financial support of the SBA. Those fees will continue to fund the certification program. Any programs involving fees are optional and will not be required for membership in the Systems Builders Association.

How will the Metal Buildings Institute™ affect my business?

There are two primary ways the Institute will impact you. First, you will have expanded educational offerings that are specific to the business you own and operate. Programs and services managed by the Institute will give you new opportunities to validate and recognize your professionalism and commitment to excellence. Second, those in related professions, such as architects, specifiers and manufacturers, will recognize the professionalism of our industry as a whole through these activities. On balance, the Metal Buildings Institute™ will raise the level of professionalism of the industry, and broaden public awareness, too.

Why is the Institute formed as a subsidiary of the Systems Builders Association?

The Metal Buildings Institute[™] is a member service of the SBA, and has been formed as a subsidiary to re-

flect the scope of its activities. Many of SBA's existing services will remain under the umbrella of the parent organization. As a service for members of the SBA, the Institute will enable us to provide a higher level of service in some of the most crucial areas we face. For example, new training activities and educational opportunities, coupled with contractor certification, will help our members attract, train and retain workers. All of the programs offered through the Institute will be member services of the SBA.

Who will set policy for this new Institute?

The SBA Executive Committee will set direction, create programs, and establish policies. The activities of the Institute will be subject to the review and approval of SBA's elected officers.

NORTH DAKOTA STATE COLLEGE OF SCIENCE UPDATE

The Butler building has been completed and the first house was constructed in it during the spring semester. An additional bay was added last spring as part of student training.

An additional bay will be constructed soon as training for the next group of students.

Funding for the classroom addition has begun, and the addition is projected to begin in the 2002 school year. This will be the first time in North Dakota history that students have constructed their own school!

Underway for the fall session is a 4,000 square foot metal building that the students are starting now. They have just finished the footings and are forming the walls. This will be the home for the high school construction program of the Southeast Vocational Center (which is a good feeder program for the college courses). The vocational center is covering the costs for the building, and our students are doing the work.

The high-fork lift donated by Bob Ketenbrink has been reconditioned, and repainted, and looks like it was just delivered from the factory. We use it everyday, and the students all get certified in forklift operation before they leave the program.

The main problem we face is that our Freshman students seek summer employment in the construction industry, and the employers like them so much that the many students don't return. We hope to line up some scholarships for the second year students to help encourage them to return to finish their degree.




































INDUSTRY COOPERATION AT WORK For Metal Building

For Metal Building Certification

Meeting with representatives of the Metal Building Manufacturers Association and the Associated Builders and Contractors (Metal Building Council), the SBA has continued working toward an expanded, unified certification program for builders.

SBA Certification Committee Chairman Dick Howard hosted a meeting last month in Atlanta to discuss the plan. While there were no formal actions taken at the meeting, there was substantial progress made and the groups will meet again later this year.

The meeting was designated as the Policy Level Exploratory Steering Committee, which came about as a result of discussions among the three organizations. The intent is to find common ground among the groups in establishing an enhanced certification program for metal building contractors and erectors that will be recognized and supported at all levels within the industry.

The SBA Certification Committee has been working for two years on a plan to enhance the value of its certification program. Due to the renewed focus on industry celfication, the program has begun to experience heightened interest resulting in a steady flow of new applications. The number of SBA 2000 certified companies is expected to exceed 80 by the end of the calendar year.

STAFF VISITS PROJECT

In early October, SBA staffers' Debra Welhener, and Michael Overbay visited a jobsite in Piketon, Ohio. The new storage building for JNC, Inc. was manufactured by merican Buildings Company, and was being erected by Spacemark, Inc., Decatur, Illinois. The purpose of the visit was to provide specific information to the two regarding the actual construction of a metal building system.

The building size was quite impressive; a 250' x 400' x 28' structure. Spacemark superintendent, Carl Holstlaw provided a personalized tour of the job, and responded to various questions. When asked about the project and the process, Michael stated, "The project was quite impressive, and the personnel were true professionals who made it look easy." Debra was also impressed. She stated, "Having a visual helped me better understand what it's all about." Michael serves as the association's Marketing Manager, and Debra is the Membership Manager.

Workers Compensation
