

SOMEONE'S ALWAYS WATCHING

A few months ago, we took a quick look at Fed. OSHA most cited extendable boom forklift violations. This month, we'll do the same with aerial (boom) & scissor lifts (collectively known as mobile elevating work platforms, or MEWPs). When you're up in the air, you're pretty visible and someone is always watching.





Platform access gate/chain must be closed & feet must be on platform. No standing on toeboard, platform rails, planks, buckets, boxes, etc.

- 2. <u>Power lines</u> Min. 10 ft. clearance to power lines 50kV or less. This is clearance not only to the lift, but also to any object that may be handled from the lift.
- 3. <u>Falling object protection</u> No one is permitted to walk, work, or pass beneath an elevated boom or platform. As necessary, establish a restricted access area beneath your lift to prevent others from being struck by a dropped, falling, or collapsing object.
- 4. <u>Annual inspection</u> Aerial & scissor lifts require an annual inspection by a qualified lift mechanic. Inspectors typically look for a sticker or stamp denoting this.
- 5. <u>Missing information</u> Operator's manual, platform capacity, & safety decals must be legible. The operator's manual belongs in the weather-tight compartment on the platform.
- 6. <u>Trained operator</u> Operators must be trained. But unlike forklifts, OSHA does NOT require periodic (3-yr.) skills re-evaluations.

However, as an operator transitions between different lift makes & models, familiarization instruction may be needed. This training focuses on lift-specific capabilities, controls, safety devices, inspection points, & operating characteristics.


- 7. <u>Lift condition</u> Lifts must be inspected each shift before use. If the lift is damaged, modified (including unapproved attachments), or in a condition of poor repair, tag it out of service.
- 8. <u>Unsafe operation</u> This could take many forms, like overloading the platform, operating the lift in excessively windy conditions (many restrict wind speed to 28-31 mph), elevating platform on a surface that is not stable or level, using the lift as a crane, or operating in any other

manner not intended by its manufacturer.

Being a safe lift operator starts with meaningful training, then extends to evaluation of work area hazards and use of safe equipment. These are great machines, essential to our work. But the minute we do not respect a lift, it can kill someone. It doesn't care.


