

# **POWER LINE SAFETY** – part 1

Power lines account for the largest share of electrocution fatalities in the construction industry. In fact, 2 out of every 3 construction workers who are electrocuted work in a non-electrical trade.

A crane (or any equipment), its boom, load line, load, or tag line may become energized from direct contact with a power line, by an arc from the power line, or even from a charge induced from a nearby transmitter tower. This energized equipment – often at thousands of volts – can gruesomely kill workers touching or working in the vicinity of it.

A few things to remember (referencing federal OSHA):

- Prior to work, identify the location of power lines on or near the site and determine if your work or equipment
- could approach them. Look for lines at the start of each day circumstances can change.
- Presume all power lines are energized and uninsulated unless confirmed otherwise by the line owner.
- Maintain a minimum of 10 ft. clearance between energized power lines up to 50kV and any non-crane equipment, which can include personnel lifts, forklifts, ladders, scaffolds, & heavy equipment. (Lines over 50kV require more clearance.)
- With cranes, a clearance of at least 20 ft. is required for energized power lines up to 350kV. However, if the crane company verifies line voltage with the line owner and the lines do not exceed 50kV then this clearance can be reduced to 10 ft.
- Where these clearances cannot be maintained, arrangements must be made to have the lines de-energized & grounded, relocated, or protected with an appropriate voltage-rated covering.
