MANAGING SILICA DUST EXPOSURES

Respirable crystalline silica dust (RCS, or just "silica dust") is generated anytime we cut, saw, grind, crush, jackhammer, drill, chip, or otherwise process any material that has sand in it. Think concrete, brick, block, asphalt,



etc. If a silica dust is generated from our work task, then it must be managed, and this has

been a focus of OSHA since their construction silica standard debuted in 2017.

While this standard mainly affects masons, concrete, & heavy highway contractors, the standard applies to EVERYONE who generates silica dust, no matter the quantity of dust produced.

So, here are a few things to know:

- There are few exemptions to OSHA's silica standard. If you generate silica dust, you almost certainly need to manage it.
- Your options for managing dust mainly fall into one of two categories wet methods (use of water) or filtered vacuum (dust capture) systems that usually incorporate HEPA filtration.
- · Simply using a dust mask is not considered "managing" the dust. Sometimes a dust mask is still required IN ADDITION TO wet methods or dust collection, but dust masks alone do not replace the need for water or dust collection.
- · OSHA's Table 1 in the construction RCS standard (29 CFR 1926.1153) prescribes dust mitigation methods for a variety of silica dust-producing tasks, as well as indicates whether a dust mask is also necessary.
- · Silica is a serious chronic (long-term) health hazard. You are required to train your exposed personnel not only in the hazards of RCS, but also in how they can be exposed at work (tasks that produce it), and the means/methods that must be used to control the dust.
- OSHA requires a written RCS dust program that needs to be reviewed annually. Make sure to have one, make sure it is up-to-date, and that your employees know about it.

Last year, silica dust violations increased 38% over the prior year. It is now the #15 most-frequently cited construction OSHA violation. A 29% increase in respirator violations accompanied this rise. With more and more tools becoming battery powered, there are fewer electrical safety violations... silica & respirator violations have begun to fill this citation void.

There is much more to the OSHA respirable crystalline silica dust standard – this article on hits a few of the main points. But understand that when a company is caught failing to manage its silica dust control obligations, it is often cited for more than just one violation. So, plan accordingly. If you will be generating silica dust out on your sites – even minor amounts – make sure your crew knows how they are to manage it.
