

RETRACTABLES – CLASS 1 or CLASS 2?

Personal fall arrest system (PFAS) connectors are the components that connect a fall protection harness to an anchor point. They come in the forms of shock-absorbing lanyards or retractables (SRLs – self-retracting lifelines). Their purpose is to help reduce deceleration force transmitted to the body in the event of a fall. Connectors come in different sizes and styles. When choosing a connector, consider available fall distance, anchor point location, needed mobility, leading edge applications, and special work task exposures (hot work, chemicals, etc.).



Only one connector may be used between a harness and the anchor point and it must connect to the D ring in center of the back, between the shoulders (dorsal D ring). Other D ring locations may be provided on a harness, but these are not for PFAS use – they're for other systems.

When choosing retractables, it is important to know that they are now classified as either class 1 or class 2. Class 1 devices are only rated for use at or above the harness dorsal D ring. Class 2 devices are designed for use at, above, or *up to 5 ft. below* the dorsal D ring. So, most applications that involve leading edge work or tying off in an aerial lift will require use of a class 2 retractable.

The business with class 1 and class 2 does not come from OSHA, but rather ANSI (Z359.14). OSHA would just expect us to use the retractable – as any equipment – in a manner intended by its manufacturer. So no need to throw away any perfectly good retractables as long as they're being used properly. However, be aware of these classes next time you are in the market for one.
