Hello Sasha,

Construction Law Corner by Joshua Quinter, Offit Kurman

Top Ten Mistakes Contractors Make In Their Construction Contract

I am often asked at the end of speaking engagements and in other social settings about the common mistakes contractors make in their agreements. I'm typically reticent to answer because the reality is that there are so many variations in contract language now that it's hard to classify a decision to accept any specific version as a "mistake". This being said, there is some common subject matter at the heart of litigation fights over contract clauses. These themes provide some insight into how to evaluate your next agreement. In the humorous spirit of David Letterman, "here's the construction contractor's top ten list":

- 10. Choice of law language that requires application of the law from a jurisdiction other than where the project is located. This can make things like mechanic's lien claims, which are dependent on the law of the state where the project is located, a little more tricky.
- 9. Allowing other terms and condition to preempt scope of work language from the proposal. When these impact scope, they impact cost and time.
- 8. Agreeing to language that requires you to continue working when there is a disagreement over a change order or payment. This usually makes a small problem and big one.


Participate in Air Leakage Testing!

To increase energy conservation, energy codes and standards have been stepping up the effort to reduce air leakage, moving toward a requirement for whole building tests to ensure an adequate air barrier in addition to, or in place of, the prescriptive requirements for materials and assemblies.



In order to help prepare builders, contractors, and erectors for upcoming code requirements, the Metal Building Manufacturers Association (MBMA) is performing these tests and developing a best practice guide. Four buildings have been tested to date and more are needed with the following characteristics:

- Plan area of 5,000 to 20,000 ft².
- Conditioned interior space.
- Compliant with 2012 IECC or ASHRAE 90.1-2013 or later editions.
- Lower U-value / higher R-value insulation systems, such as filled cavity, rigid board continuous insulation, insulated metal panels, and spray foam insulation.
