
## Technical Corner: Watch out!!! Flange brace attachment with banded liner systems can be tricky Tucker Cope, PE, M-Eng.

When ordering a metal building with banded liner insulation systems, the standard flange brace connection does not allow for a smooth installation process. Since the fabric is required to be placed in large sheets under the purlins, the flange brace protruding thru the fabric makes a "patch tape" nightmare. It is recommended to specify a "double angle" flange brace connection to ensure a smooth and clean installation.

#### DOUBLE ANGLE FLANGE BRACE CONNECTION

PRO: The double angle method allows the fabric to be placed smoothly from main frame to main frame & then second clip is installed

CON: Higher material and fabrication cost due to additional parts and connections




## KNIFE PLATE FLANGE BRACE CONNECTION

PRO: More cost effective for material due to less parts and connections

CON: Requires cuts in the liner fabric during installation and may result in a less clean finish

with inexperienced crews
