

WHERE DO I NEED AN EXTINGUISHER?

Don't let availability of fire extinguishers be an afterthought on your job! The table below provides you a quick reference for required fire extinguisher size & travel distance (per Fed. OSHA standards):



Location	Min. Exting. Rating	Distance
Each floor where combustible materials	2A per 3,000 sf	Within 100 ft.
Stairway landings	2A	Adjacent to
Storage/handling of more than 5 gal. of flammable liquids (or 5-lbs. flam. gas)	10B	Within 50 ft.
Welding, torching, hot work	2A:10B:C	Within 35 ft.
Refueling areas	20B:C	Within 75 ft.
Tank trucks (flams)	20B:C	Mounted on
LPG tank storage	20B:C	25 - 50 ft.
Interior flammables storage rooms	20B:C	Outside of rm, within 10 ft.
Exterior flammables storage areas	20B:C	25 – 50 ft.

You can find your extinguisher size (classification rating) on the label, right below the UL listing. Generally, an extinguisher that is at least 2A:20B:C rated will do the trick.

Make sure your extinguishers have a tag showing that they have been serviced within the past 12 months. A competent person should also inspect the extinguishers monthly to ensure they are in operable condition, are properly charged, have the handle pin in place, and are readily accessible for use. The monthly check should be documented on the back of the inspection tag – date & initials are all that is needed.


