

Construction Law Corner by Joshua Quinter, Offit Kurman Addressing the Talent Drain

I help clients with both legal and business problems in my role as an out-of-house general counsel for construction companies. One the most common issues I am asked to help address these days is the talent shortage in the construction industry. It's a tough issue to tackle.

The economy – especially in the construction market – looks shaky at the moment. Inflation is on the rise and there is also the possibility of a large tax increase coming in the next 12 months. The construction industry lost roughly 3,000 jobs in July and August; and when one removes the residential construction numbers from the mix the picture gets a little more discouraging with more than 20,000 jobs being lost. Higher materials costs, fewer skilled workers, and supply chain issues are keeping construction employment down. This is an empirical way to say that the talent drain that existed before the pandemic hit is real and getting worse.

My construction clients and others are struggling to find workers who can fill open positions that they desperately need in order to get the work done and grow their companies. market" right now, employers need to think more strategically to ensure they get and retain the best

people. Here, in no particular order, are some suggestions to consider...
