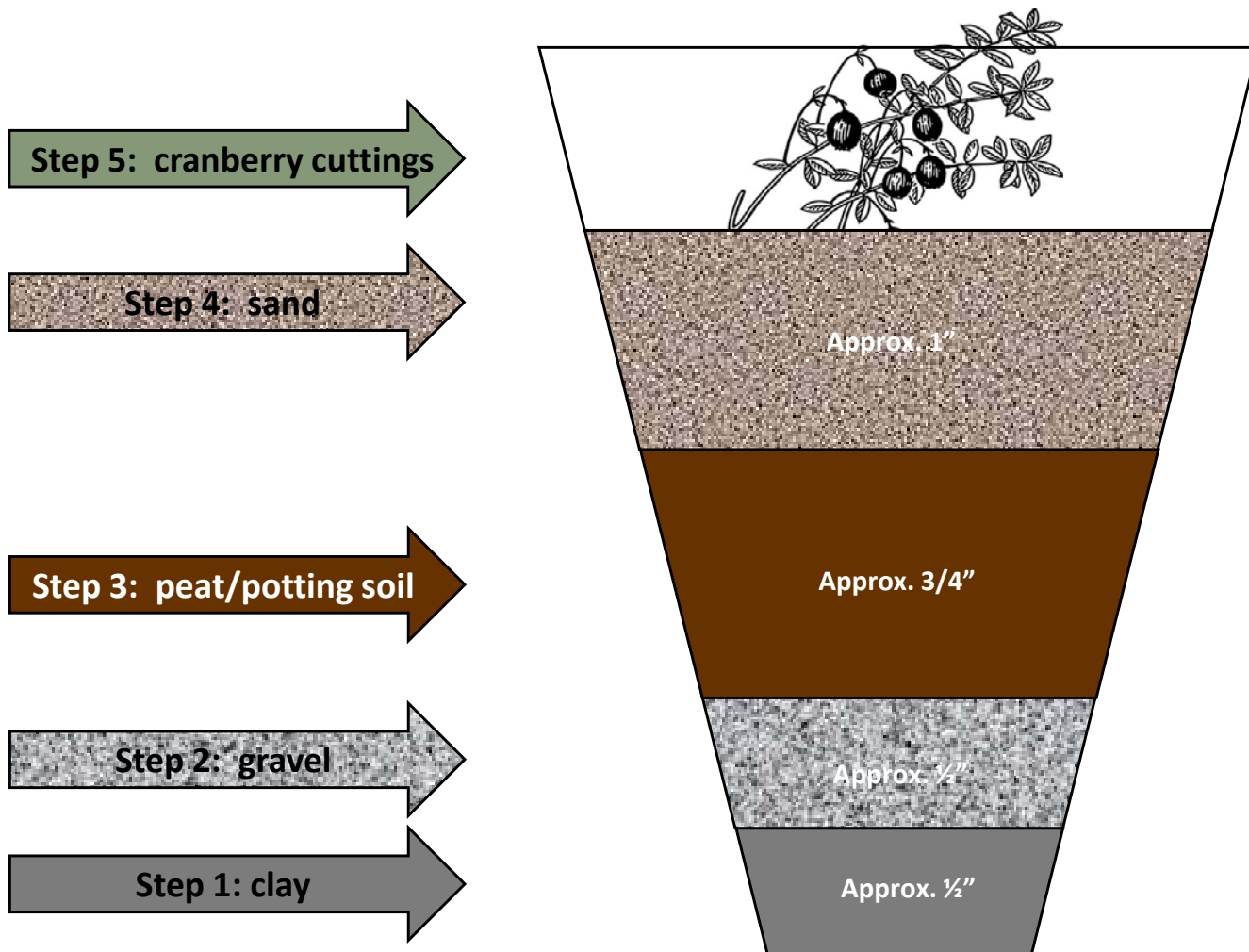


Make Your Own Bog in a Cup



Step 5: Cranberry cuttings

- poke finger into sand up to the second joint
- place cranberry vines into the hole just made in the sand
- cover the cranberry vine cuttings with sand by pushing sand up to the vines

Bog in a Cup

care sheet

Keep soil very moist. Water daily if necessary.

Keep in direct sunlight: near a window or warm corner of the house outside.

***If outside please water twice daily to prevent soil from drying out.*

Do not allow roots to freeze, you should bring cup in during winter.

April vacation is a good time to place cranberry cutting back outside.

Your goal is to create the growth of tiny hair roots. This could take 4-6 weeks.

If your plant has cranberries on the vines, the fruit will eventually fall off.

The cranberry cutting cannot support the growth of the fruit, since there aren't any hair roots yet.
