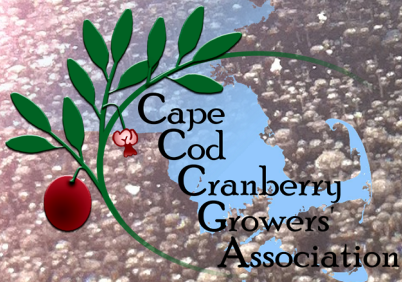

CHANGING ON THE FLY

While basking in yet another Lombardi Trophy for Tom Brady, here are a few things of note to make members aware of..... Legislation for the new State House legislative session are being filed this week. New bills are due on February 19th. Under the leadership of Senator Moran and Representative Straus, bills related to cranberries are being filed on our behalf. These are re-files of previous session bills that will attempt to assist growers with dual-use solar (Chapter 61A and zoning considerations) and conventional solar on ag lands, establishing a farm technology committee, extracting monetary value for relinquishing water management registrations/permits, and establishing a pilot wetland banking system. There will be more to say about these bills as they start their journey through the process. We thank Senator Moran and Representative Straus for their leadership and for the rest of the cranberry delegation as we look for co-sponsors on these bills. We are also actively monitoring other legislation that is being filed that may be of interest to growers, both favorable and not. We will engage on these issues in due time as well. Other than bill filing, the State House has been relatively quiet. Next up will be the assignment of committee leadership and assignments. John Fernandes will have more to report on all of this and more in the coming weeks.

By now, growers have learned the results of the state's Food Security Infrastructure Grant Program. The final two rounds of funding were combined and announced last week. I was hopeful that there would have been more cranberry projects, particularly related to drought mitigation but it appears that these projects did not score well with the funding authorities and instead the grant projects largely went towards food related projects. No one can complain about projects directed towards helping with food availability and distribution, areas where given the nature of the cranberry industry, most of our growers are not involved directly in that space. Unfortunately, with few drought projects

funded and an extremely competitive environment for Covid-related relief measures, we'll turn our attention to identifying other opportunities to assist growers in these areas wherever possible.

Although not officially announced yet, growers are learning of the results of the cranberry bog renovation grant program. We hope to have more information on this program shortly.

CCCGA is developing our work plan for 2021 that the board will approve at its March board meeting.

It's election season at the local level! Every town is different but soon, nomination papers will need to be returned for anyone interested in running for local office. It's critically important that growers get involved in your local community so that your voice can be heard. The time commitment is not arduous for most local boards but by giving up a few hours a month, it can make a big difference in your town or the industry. Most of our towns do not have any cranberry growers serving on the boards or committees that can directly impact your business, such as select board, planning board, board of health, zoning board (usually appointed) or conservation commission (appointed). Appointed positions follow after town elections and these are also opportunities to get involved. You don't need to have an advanced degree or any particular expertise to serve on a board or committee. It's more important to be open-minded, willing to learn and to make decisions based on the facts in front of you. These are basic traits that all cranberry growers share. By not having growers sit on local boards, the opportunity to bring the unique perspective of farming and a deeper understanding of the impacts of a particular ag project are lost when other members of the community make these decisions without all of the facts in front of them or

certainly a lack of agricultural literacy. At the local level, an erosion of basic agricultural rights can occur over time without growers being part of the process. Take a look at the openings in your town and consider becoming part of the solution. It's not as hard as you might think!

WATER MANAGEMENT ACT ANNUAL REPORTS DUE FROM MASSDEP

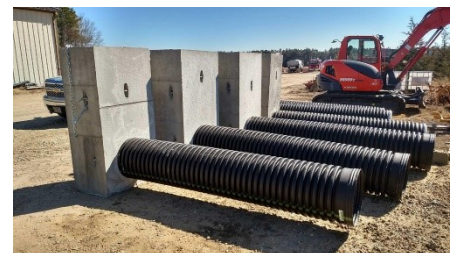
This is a reminder that Water Management Act (WMA) Annual Reports were sent and are due back to MassDEP by March 1, 2021. Of most importance, due to COVID-19 restrictions, all WMA annual reports should be returned to the MassDEP office in Lakeville. This should be a temporary change for this year only. However, the annual payments for the program still go to Boston. Please be sure to send the report and payment in separately to the separate addresses so one or the other don't get lost in the government abyss. You may wish to obtain some form of send receipt so you have documented proof of mailing them.

Remember, failure to return your annual report could result in the loss of your WMA registration or permit. The report is sent to you pre-populated by MassDEP to help save you time and effort in filling it out. If you haven't received your report or if you have any questions, contact MassDEP in Lakeville at 508-946-2700 and ask for assistance with the Cranberry Water Management Act Program..

- Bumblebees forage at temperatures as low as 40°F, honeybees forage when temperatures are 55°F and higher.
- Bumblebees do not adjust foraging times to avoid wind, a honeybees foraging is stopped when wind speeds reach 15 mph.
- Bumblebees can use “buzz pollination” or sonication to release pollen from flower anthers, honeybees do not sonicate to collect pollen.
- Bumblebees can deposit larger quantities of pollen to the stigma as compared to honeybees, requiring less visits for pollination.
- Bumblebees tend to have a more erratic flight pattern than honeybees which facilitates the movement of pollen across rows.
- Bumblebees will forage in lower light conditions than honeybees.

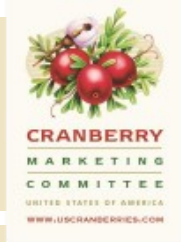

UPDATES FROM THE CMC

Crop Year 2020 Q1 Position Summary reports are now available at www.uscranberries.com under Industry → Data & Reports. Total U.S. production for CY2020 was approximately 7,727,038 barrels, a 1.6% increase from 2019. Massachusetts production decreased by 7.5% (150,595 barrels).

The CMC's annual winter meeting took place virtually via Zoom on February 10, 2021. The Committee went through its process of estimating 2021 U.S. production, which is expected to total 8,545,000 bbls, with a Massachusetts estimate of 2,034,000 bbls. The Committee voted to move forward with a strategic planning process that has a target completion date of August 2021. It also voted to move forward with domestic promotion of the *H. pylori* clinical study. A full meeting recap is included in the CMC's latest newsletter.

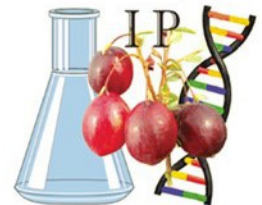

NPDES REPORTS ARE DUE!

Attention Growers

If you are a decision maker for 80 or more acres of cranberry bog, you should have an active pesticide discharge permit with the US EPA under what is referred to as NPDES, or National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. There is a process to establish a permit and then annual reports are due every February 15th for the pesticides applied that prior growing season. This is not necessarily for acreage you own but for any collective acreage that you manage and are the decision maker for pesticide use that totals 80 acres or more. CCCGA can assist growers with establishing a permit and annual reporting on a fee-based approach. If you are unsure if this applies to you, please contact Brian Wick or Dawn Allen at the CCCGA office for assistance.

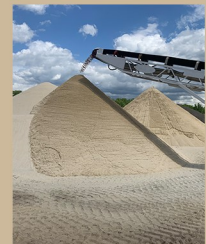
