



### CHANGING ON THE FLY

The NFL season has started yet again, that can only mean that cranberry harvest is also about to begin. Yikes, it feels like the 2020 harvest just wrapped up. I must be getting old. Anyway, with harvest gearing up, so to is the bog tour season. Several growers offer ag tourism experiences to the public and CCCGA is in full swing with our tours as well. Demand has been strong and growing. We are offering both charter bus tours and also tours to the public where guests can signup for tours on our website. We have hired tour guides and are poised for a successful and busy season. Bonnie Soule is heading up our tour program and is doing a great job.

Elsewhere in this newsletter are pictures of CCCGA participating at two recent events in Plymouth, the Waterfront Festival and the Plymouth 400 Maritime Salute. The Waterfront Festival was well attended with a steady flow of people looking to have a sample bag of died cranberries and recipes cards, along with other cranberry brochures. The following weekend was the pandemic-delayed Plymouth 400 celebration, although much tamed down. Nevertheless, the Maritime Salute was also well attended and our Traveling Cranberry Bog was very well received. It generated a lot of interest at our booth and a chance for CCCGA and our grower volunteers to further educate the public about cranberry growing. We also were able to meet many of our legislative leaders and have some good conversations about cranberries. This included Senator Markey, Congressman Keating, State Representatives LaNatra and Muratore and the British Ambassador to the United States, Dame Karen Pierce. The ambassador is looking forward to cooking with the dried cranberries we provided to her. Hopefully, this interaction might help with our ongoing tariff dispute!

On other matters, the legislature is setting their hearing dates and we will be active attending those virtual sessions and advocating for MA cranberries. We are tracking legislation on ag worker pay/time off, trucking regulations, dualuse solar, bog restoration, pesticide regulations and more. We are also working to secure more grant programs that will benefit our growers, should funding opportunities become available. We are not sure if such programs will be made available, but we are poised to be in a good position should they materialize in the coming




weeks or months. By the time this is published, the most recent round of the Cranberry Bog Renovation Grant Program will be closed and I hope that many growers will have had the chance to apply.

With COVID numbers starting to creep up, remember to take all necessary precautions with your family, workers and harvest crews to eliminate as best possible any flareups that could slow down your harvest. Your handlers will have procedures for you to follow at the fruit receiving stations. CCCGA is in the midst of collecting those procedures from each handler that is willing to share and we'll post them all for easy reference. I wish you all a safe and bountiful harvest season!




Construction has started at the UMass Cranberry Station. During the first week of September, the main initial activity has been site preparation for the new building. J.J. Cardosi, Inc. (Riverside, Rhode Island) was awarded the contract to oversee and conduct the renovation of the existing Lab Building, re-roofing the current Admin Building and the construction of the new building. The renovation of the Lab Building will include upgrades to the ventilation and water systems, creation of new lab facilities and IT improvements. The new building will be approximately 5,000 square feet and house the administrative staff, faculty office and a new meeting room that overlooks the bog.

We will be open during construction but it will be a busy place. Please give way to all construction vehicles and stay alert if you cross into the construction zone to enter our buildings. Our usual parking areas are now absorbed into the construction zone. Please park near the greenhouses and/or the shop (to the left of the driveway). We appreciate your patience as we upgrade and build new facilities for current and future scientists who will generate research-based information for the cranberry industry into the 21<sup>st</sup> century and beyond.







### MASSACHUSETTS CRANBERRY HERITAGE AWARD







We are forever indebted to the contributions of Jack and Lyon.








### **Growers are Eligible for Additional USDA CFAP 2 Payments**

The USDA has announced that they are adjusting the payment calculations for the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program 2 (CFAP 2). This was part of the COVID relief package that was put in place last year that cranberry growers were eligible for direct financial assistance, based on your 2019 crop. USDA is now amending the payment calculation, to allow producers to substitute 2018 sales for 2019 sales. This is to provide additional flexibility to producers who had reduced sales in 2019. Previously, these payments were based only on 2019 sales, with 2019 used as an approximation of the amount the producer would have expected to market in 2020. If your 2018 sales were higher, you will receive a payment making up the difference.

If you received a CFAP2 payment last year and would like to revise your application using your 2018 sales data, please contact the USDA FSA field office at (508) 295-5151, ext. 2 or email Bailey Stokes at <a href="mailto:Bailey.Stokes@usda.gov">Bailey.Stokes@usda.gov</a>. The deadline to revise your application is **October 12**, **2021**.

### UPDATES FROM THE CMC

CMC's Executive Director Michelle Hogan has announced her retirement effective December 31, 2021. Michelle has spent more than three decades in the cranberry industry and her sense of fairness, honesty and dedication will leave a lasting positive impact. The CMC's Officers Committee has begun the search for its next executive director and will keep industry members informed on its progress.

CMC is conducting an RFP process to evaluate in-market representation firms in China, as well as conducting an RFP process to implement targeted market research in Russia, South America, and Southeast Asia.

At its annual summer meeting, CMC members voted to fund two research studies that were brought to the Committee by the Cranberry Institute and had been vetted by the Scientific Advisory Board, the Health Advisory Committee, as well as the CMC's Health Review Subcommittee. Nathalie Tufenkji's study, *Antibiotic Potentiation by Cranberry Bioactives Against Drug Resistant Uropathogenic E coli*, will assess the potentiating activity of a commercial cranberry product on eight clinically relevant antibiotics against a panel of 30 drug resistant and partially resistant UPEC isolates. The project will include pilot infection studies of the common fruit fly host model to demonstrate the in vivo efficacy of the cranberry product to alleviate antibiotic resistance This research will provide insights into health benefits of cranberry consumption that are readily communicable to end users and could lead to preclinical studies. Dr. Ana Rodriguez-Mateos's study, *Modulation of the gut brain axis by cranberries impact on university students' mental health The CRANMOOD study*, will investigate whether cranberry consumption can improve gut microbiome diversity and composition, leading to a decrease in stress levels, anxiety and depression symptoms, and improvement in cognitive function. Findings from this work will provide insight into the relationship between cranberry consumption and mood disorders.


